

“He’s a MFer” Wrestling Legend Scott Steiner Reveals Hatred for Hulk Hogan



“Big Poppa Pump” Scott Steiner explained his hatred for Pro Wrestling Icon Hulk Hogan in an interview with journalist Chris Van Villet, claiming that he booked him to lose a WCW match and attempted to have him arrested.

“When I said that I got beat my first match after turning heel, the call was made by Hulk Hogan to have me get beat” said Steiner.

Scott Steiner was one of the most decorated tag team wrestlers of all time along with his brother Rick but in 1998 at WCW SuperBrawl VIII Scott embarked on a singles run after turning on his brother and joining the NWO.

Whilst Steiner did in fact win his first match after his heel turn on an episode of Thunder against Mart Jannetty, Steiner may be referencing his first Pay Per View loss to Lex Luger at Uncensored 3 weeks after the turn.

“Wins and losses, you can overcome them. But for another wrestler to decide who wins is bullshit.” When asked why he thought Hogan did that Steiner added “He’s a mother****r. He’s a piece of sh*t.”

It is a well-known fact that Hogan infamously had a creative control clause in his WCW contract and many contribute Hogan as being one of the main reasons WCW lost the ratings war to the WWE and was eventually bought by Vince McMahon.

Steiner joins a long list of former wrestlers who despise Hogan which includes the likes of The Iron Shiek, “Macho Man” Randy Savage, The Undertaker, Shawn Michaels and Jesse “The Body” Ventura

Hulk Hogan’s reputation has taken a massive hit over the last decade and after fans had become aware of his blatant racism towards African Americans he was banished from the WWE for a few years.

The Mr McMahon documentary did Hogan no favours as fans were reminded that he ratted out Ventura after he was planning to coordinate a strike in order to form the first ever union in the Pro Wrestling industry.

The real life actions of Terry Bollea has negatively impacted the popularity of his wrestling persona as Hogan was booed vitriolically by the Los Angeles crowd on the Monday Night Raw Netflix debut earlier this year.

Steiner also claimed that Hogan lied to the San Jose Police Department by alleging that Steiner had assaulted his wife and threatened to kill him at San Jose Airport back in 2015. Steiner was cleared of any wrongdoing at the investigation stage.

When this was first reported by TMZ the outlet reached out to Steiner for a comment to which he hilariously added “typical Hogan, he’s just a punk.”

Despite his hatred for the wrestling legend, the pair worked together again after their time in WCW and WWE when Hogan joined TNA wrestling in 2009, however this was short lived as the Genetic Freak would leave the company in February of 2010.

Although Hogan may be more influential than Steiner for the industry of professional wrestling, Steiner is adored by fans who are now entertained on a weekly basis by his nephew and current WWE Intercontinental Champion Bron Breakker.
