WITNESS

The world is changing, and video is changing the world. For twenty years, from Rodney King to the Arab Spring, video has changed the course of history. And WITNESS has been there, to help activists expose human rights **abuse – s**afely, effectively, and ethically – and bring the perpetrators of abuse to justice. Peter Gabriel's vision of video technology as a tool for the advancement of human rights is now a reality. Today, with partners around the world, WITNESS is there. To see it. To film it. To change it. We live in a "cameras everywhere" world, with video at our fingertips. Facebook, YouTube and Twitter are defining the new public square. All of this creates new opportunities to promote social justice. But with new opportunities come new challenges: authentication, information overload, and the use of video technology as a weapon of persecution and oppression. WITNESS gives activists the tools and training to turn raw images into compelling stories. We help turn video evidence into social justice.

AFRICA

WITNESS is partnering with NGOs in the Central African Republic, Democratic Republic of Congo and Uganda to combat the use of rape as a tool of war, support rape survivors, and ensure that perpetrators are brought to justice.

WITNESS has co-produced a series of 10 short documentary films featuring the voices of young people across the country who have joined the TRUST campaign to call on the government to reverse the disastrous effects of climate change.

BRAZIL

As Brazil prepares for the 2014 World Cup and the 2016 Olympics, tens of thousands of poor families are being forcibly removed from their homes to make way for development projects tied to the major sporting events. WITNESS is training victims and activists to use video to document forced evictions.

MIDDLE EAST

As the Arab Spring continues to transform the politics of the Middle East and North Africa, WITNESS is convening leading video activists from across the region to share best practices relating to the use of video for social justice and human rights advocacy.





































WITNESS PROGRAMS

Mobile phones and portable video technology have created a new generation of video activists. But stories of human rights abuse remain untold and courageous human rights defenders remain unprotected. Through its many programs, WITNESS helps bridge the gap between raw video and real change.

CAMERAS EVERYWHERE

Cameras Everywhere is a WITNESS program designed to pressure technology companies to integrate new tools and services to protect freedom of expression and human rights defenders.

VIDEO ADVOCACY TEAMS

WITNESS provides video equipment, technology training, and on-site instruction in video advocacy for citizen activists around the world.

WITNESS LABS

Authoritarian governments often use video footage as evidence to target human rights activists. With new Secure Smart Cam apps like ObscuraCam, activists can better protect themselves and the identities and privacy of the people they film on their smartphones.
