Central European U. Faces Dilemma as Its Benefactor Limits His Support

Now called an intellectual powerhouse, it struggles to augment the backing of George Soros

Sorin Antohi had hit upon what he thought was a good way to enhance the scholarly standing of the Central European University, of which he is the academic vice-rector.
