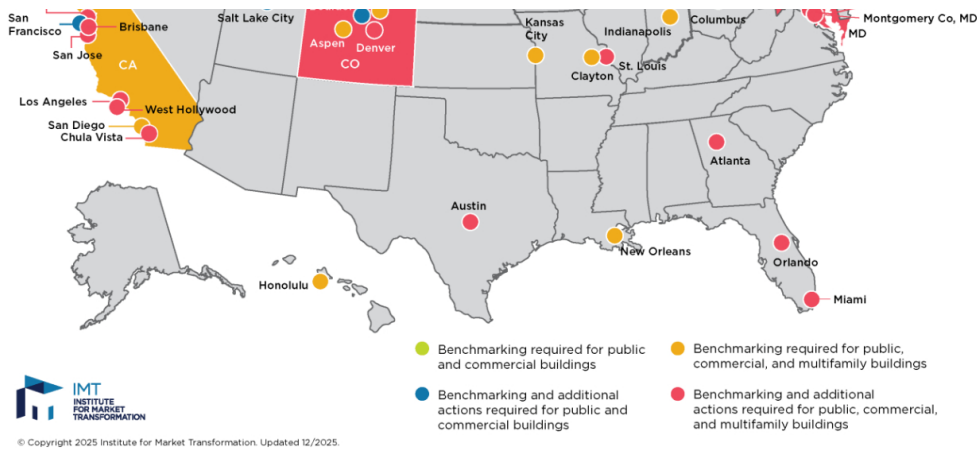

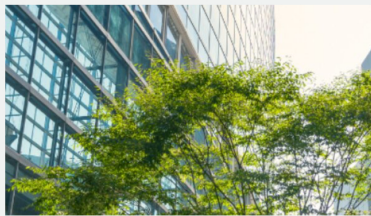

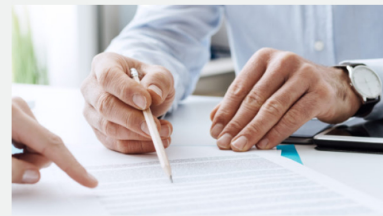
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Upcoming Energy Performance Requirements: CO, WA, and MD
