I miss the buzz from the fans as I always get a brilliant reception when I'm here. London is such a beautiful city and I have some great memories, like winning Wimbledon in 2001. I also miss the variety of restaurants here, but definitely not the traffic.

I would ensure that all sports facilities were free of charge for everyone - especially the tennis courts.

What is your life philosophy?

Never give up - you can achieve anything if you put your mind to it.

How do you get around town?


In my Porsche, but my map-reading skills aren't great so I rely on cabs.
