What makes you a writer is your mind. If your mind no longer gives you ideas, leave the business of thinking and pursue another career.

## **CAN I USE AI AS A WRITER?**

Yes, you can. Not only is it free – to some extent, but also a great help when you're in for optimized information and greater efficiency.

### WHY SHOULD I USE AI?

In October, 2023, I attended a Tech conference in Olabisi Onabanjo University with guest speakers like Tunde Onakoya, Dannymaine, Dexter Moses, Timsux and many others. I had a conversation with Dexter Moses about his advice to young creators who are worried about authenticity when it comes to using AI. He responded that while he supports hard work, do not unnecessarily make your work hard because you wish to be conventional.

Use Al to improve your work and not to do your work for you. At the end of the day you're the Writer.

In a world where innovations are being made by the second and there's little opportunity out there to break into the industry, do not let your ego put you at a disadvantage. This is privilege – the first you've ever been offered for free. TAKE IT... USE IT... BUT BE WISE!
