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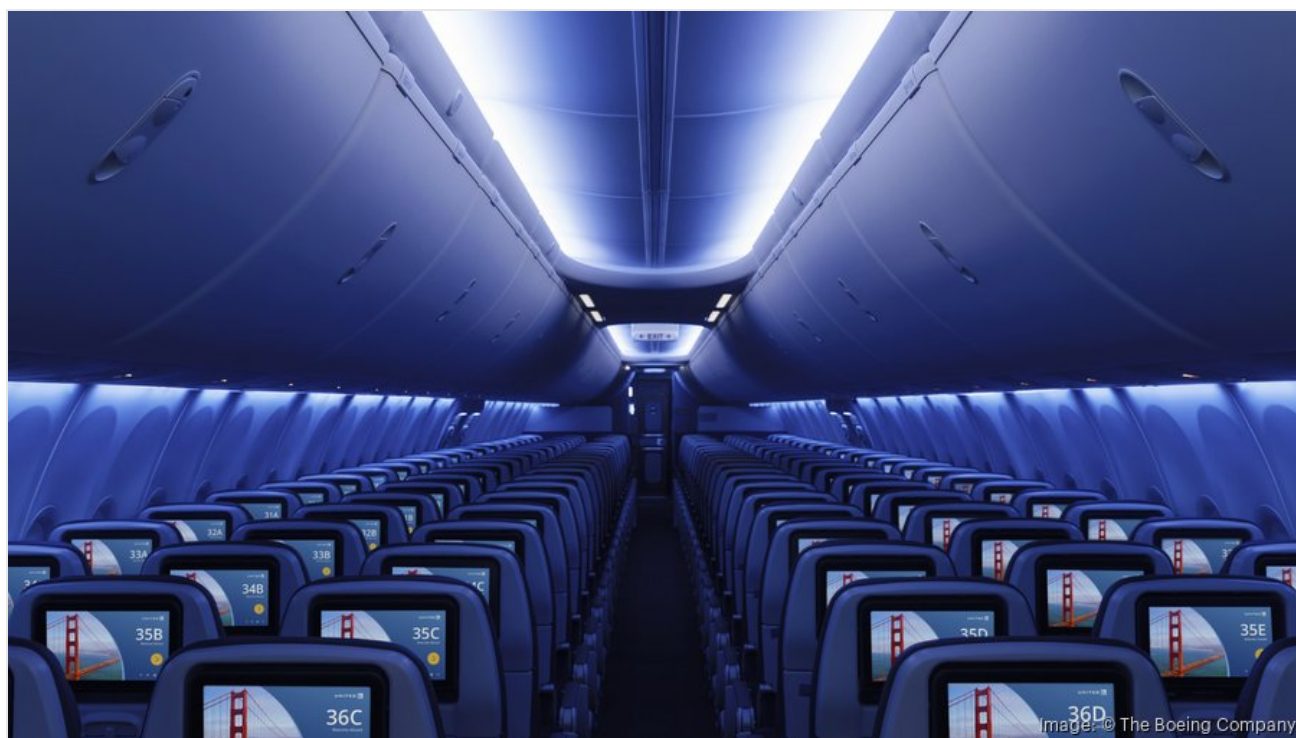

United Airlines launches seasonal route to Caribbean islands from Denver

- United Airlines will launch seasonal nonstop service to Turks and Caicos from Denver starting Dec. 19.
- The route will operate Saturdays through April 26, 2027, using a Boeing 737 Max 9 aircraft.
- International destinations make up 24 of United's 200-plus routes out of DIA.

[United Airlines](#) is expanding its international presence at Denver International Airport once again. The airline announced Friday a seasonal weekly route to Turks and Caicos beginning in late 2026.

The flight will begin Dec. 19, flying in and out of the islands on Saturdays through April 26, 2027. It marks the first time DIA will nonstop service to the islands, an airport spokesperson said.

The route will fly to Providenciales, the most populated of the archipelago's over 40 islands, and use a Boeing 737 Max 9 with 179 total seats. An eastbound flight will take approximately five hours.

"We were already getting approximately 13,000 to 14,000 travelers out of Denver already via connecting routes," Turks and Caicos Minister of Tourism Zhavargo Jolly told the DBJ. "So we're expecting to see those kinds of numbers within the first year."

Earlier this year, the airline [also announced seasonal routes](#) to Albany, New York; Chattanooga, Tenn.; and Bangor, Maine.

United now serves over 200 destinations throughout the year from DIA. International destinations make up 24 of those routes, when including the newly announced Turks and Caicos service.

This month, the city approved [\\$3.5 million in incentives over two years](#) for United's current international routes to Rome, Canada and the Dominican Republic.

United held just over half of DIA's market share in its latest passenger traffic report from April. It is followed by [Southwest Airlines](#), which held 28%.

A report from the Denver auditor released on June 18 found that [DIA overbilled United \\$5.94](#) million from January 2022 through last September. The report found that 89% of the overbilling came from airport staff improperly invoicing the airline for using gates it was already leasing.
