
Here are some of our favorite looks from around the golf world

Matthew Stone of South Africa demonstrates the versatility of a neck warmer during the pro-am at the Open de France.




Stone's countryman, Erik van Rooyen, looks like he is straight up on a modeling shoot for Callaway weather gear in this candid photo taken at Le Golf National.


Pornanong Phatlum of Thailand brought the party to the green at the Buick LPGA Shanghai with this explosive skirt.


