### Lee Memorial Hospital

Lee Memorial Hospital opened on Oct. 3, 1916, at the corner of Victoria and Grand avenues in Fort Myers. A two-story building with screened porches along the front on both floors, it had four rooms for patients and an operating room.

With no elevator, patients were carried by hand from the second floor operating rooms downstairs to their rooms on the first floor.

### HealthPark Medical Center

HPMC opened in 1991 with 220 beds, 75 of which were the Children's Hospital of Southwest Florida. Staff delivered services of every kind, including new cardiac features. A beautiful atrium changed patients' ideas of what a hospital should look and feel like.

## Community EXPansion



#### Cape Coral Hospital

Cape Coral Hospital originally opened in 1977. But in 1996, Lee Memorial acquired the hospital for \$152 million to provide essential care for Cape Coral residents. Our system then officially rebranded as Lee Memorial Health System.

New or expanded services in the 90s included parkinson's care, diabetes care, heart and pulmonary units, obstetrics, angioplasty suite, and cardiac stent procedures.
