New Jersey Governor Declares 'Bon Jovi Day' for Rock Hall Inductees

April 14th is Bon Jovi Day in New Jersey.

Gov. Phil Murphy made the announcement during a private event at Cleveland's historic 925Building, hours before the platinum-selling New Jersey band was inducted into the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame.

"Five musicians from New Jersey communities believed in their dream and used their talents to form Bon Jovi, one of the most famous, enduring rock bands of all time", Murphy wrote in a formal declaration of the holiday.

"In recognition of one of our most iconic artists, we're proud to make April 14th Bon Jovi Day inNew Jersey", he said.

The move was a surprise to band members Jon Bon Jovi, David Bryan, Tico Torres, Hugh McDonald, Richie Sambora, and Alec John Such in attendance.

Led by Sayreville native Jon Bon Jovi, the band released its first album in 1984, but were regulars on the New Jersey bar circuit for years before that. They went on to record classic rock anthems including Livin' on a Prayer, Wanted Dead or Alive and It's My Life.
