





Hand in Hand

The perfect ring and the perfect jeweler

Figuring out how and where to buy an engagement ring can feel overwhelming! It's probably the most important—and most expensive jewelry purchase you will ever make. Follow our tips to shop with confidence.

Set a Budget

Decide how much *you* feel comfortable spending. Ignore industry guidelines such as "three months' salary." A good jeweler can help you find a great ring within any budget. Beware of pressure to go above your budget or into debt. If you finance, look for interest-free offers.

Take Your Time

Buying a ring should not be like a timeshare presentation. Do not allow a jeweler to pressure you into making a lifetime decision in a matter of minutes or before you are ready.

Choose the Diamond, Then the Setting.

Many chain stores sell pre-mounted rings.

Shopping seems quick and convenient, but you can't see what the diamond looks on its own. It also limits your ring style selection and personalization options. Savvy shoppers buy the center gemstone first.

Beware of stores that sell rings by total diamond weight. A single, large diamond has a far greater value than smaller stones with the same combined carat weight. Ask for the weight of the largest diamond so you can make an apples-to-apples comparison.

Begin by learning about the Four C's: cut, color, clarity and carat weight, which determine a diamond's rarity and value.

Next, you'll need to settle on a diamond shape. More than half of all engagement rings sport a round brilliant diamond. Other popular shapes, called "fancy" in the jewelry industry, include cushion, princess, oval, pear, emerald, radiant, asscher and marquise.

Viewed alone, almost any diamond appears beautiful. Compare gems side by

side, under magnification and under different lighting, to find the one that's most appealing to your eye.

To ensure the diamond matches the store's description, ask for a diamond grading certificate from an independent gemological laboratory. GIA and AGS are the most strict and consistent.

Choosing a Setting

To find the perfect setting for your diamond, first consider your partner's jewelry wardrobe. If they wear white or silver tones, you'll want a white gold or platinum setting. For warmer hues, select yellow or rose gold.

Next, consider style preferences. Do they wear subtle, petite jewelry or larger, more flamboyant styles? (If this isn't obvious, stalk your partner's social media feeds or ask their BFFs for help.)

Finally, consider your partner's profession and hobbies. People who lead active lifestyles or work with their hands may need a more protective ring setting. A ring with a large diamond or one that sits up high can make it difficult to wear gloves.

Matching Ring Style to Personality Type

Elegant and Understated – A prong-set, solitaire setting showcases the center dia-

mond and allows the maximum return of light. For more bling, add diamonds to the shoulders of the band.

Bling Lovers – Halo settings surround the center gemstone with a circle of smaller diamonds. This creates a bigger, flashier look.

Fitness and Nature Buffs – Active lifestyles demand a protective diamond setting. Choose one that sits low on the finger. Bezel and gypsy settings, which surround the diamond with a metal band, are among the most protective.

Hopeless Romantic – Consider an antique or vintage style for a partner who loves romantic details.

Contemporary – Sculptural styles with nontraditional forms are perfect for the modern, fashion-forward partner.

Can't decide? Your jeweler should be happy to provide a temporary setting that allows you to pull off a surprise proposal. Then shop with your partner for the ring that fits them to a "T."

You Deserve a Personal Jeweler

Buying engagement and wedding rings involves more than a one-time transaction. Over time, your rings will require care and maintenance to keep them sparkling. Start right by choosing a personal jeweler who will get to know you and meet your needs over time.

SEVEN QUESTIONS TO ASK WHEN SHOPPING

How many engagement and wedding rings do you have for me to choose from? The larger the selection, the more likely you are to find the perfect rings for you. The jeweler also should carry a wide range of center diamonds and other gems.

What are your custom design capabilities and fees? A reputable jeweler will provide sketches and produce a CAD or wax rendering for your approval before you make a down payment on the ring.


3 Are there extra charges for setting my diamond or sizing my ring? There should be no extra charge if you purchase both the diamond and setting from the store. The jeweler also should not charge for an initial ring resizing.

How long do repairs typically take, and do you send them out of state or overseas? To save time, inconvenience and worry, find a jeweler with an in-house repair shop. Average turnaround time should be two weeks or less.

Are there extra charges for an insurance appraisal and warranty? The answer should be no. A GIA Certified Appraiser performs appraisals at Worthington Jewelers. We also offer a lifetime, transferrable warranty through Preferred Jewelers International at no extra charge. Ask us for details.

Do you offer free cleaning and inspection of my jewelry? The answer should be yes—and missing an inspection should not void your warranty.

Can I trade in my diamond in the future? The answer should be yes without extra conditions. You should receive credit for every penny you paid when you trade in your diamond, whether it's a month or 10 years from now.

For luck, don't forget to incorporate something old, something new, something borrowed and something blue into your wedding-day ensemble.












Brandi & Kyle Hojnowski








Jennifer & Henry Thomas



Jaimee & Ryan Wheeler




