One of our goals is to engage the public through a variety of art experiences. Our community has a wide array of artistic interests, and our exhibitions are similarly diverse. As a non-profit, the Currier Museum relies on charitable support to bring special exhibitions like these to our galleries. **I am writing today to share our gratitude for your part in helping us accomplish this!**

Highlights

During July and August, 13,914 visitors came to the Currier Museum to see *The Raft* and *Guitar*. We created engaging activities in the interpretive space in the lobby and offered public programs and special events in conjunction with these special exhibitions, which allowed visitors to explore their connections with and interpretations of the exhibitions.

Our Creative Studio program, which provides an opportunity for our youngest guests to make art, is always a hit. It serves between 25 and 30 children each month. Another popular donor-supported program is our monthly free Saturdays for New Hampshire residents. Each free Saturday provides free admission to between 260 and 300 individuals.

Our after-hours *Bourbon and Blues* event brought more than 300 visitors into the galleries to experience a guided tour of the *Guitar* exhibition along with terrific live music and an interpretive dance performance. These types of multi-sensory programs would not be possible without the support of donors like you. Thank you!
