Rest and Confinement:
<ul> <li>Limit activity for 10-14 days: Short leash walks, avoid jumping, running, and playing.</li> </ul>
• Provide a quiet, comfortable place for your pet to rest, away from other animals and children.
Incision Care:
Keep the incision clean and dry.
<ul> <li>Do not bathe your pet for 10-14 days (or after suture removal).</li> </ul>
• Keep Elizabethan Collar on at <i>ALL TIMES</i> to prevent your pet from licking or chewing at their surgical site
Monitor for Complications:
*Please contact your veterinarian immediately if you notice any of the following:
• Signs of infection at incision site:
<ul> <li>Redness, swelling, discharge, missing sutures</li> </ul>
• GI upset:
<ul> <li>Vomiting more than 3 times in 12 hours</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Diarrhea for more than 12 hours</li> </ul>
Abnormal elimination:
<ul> <li>Difficulty/straining to urinate, blood in urine,</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Has not defecated for more that 48 hours</li> </ul>
Meals:
<ul> <li>Resume normal diet, starting with half the usual amount 1-2 hours after arriving home.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Pets can have decreased appetites for 1-2 days following an anesthetic procedure.</li> </ul>
