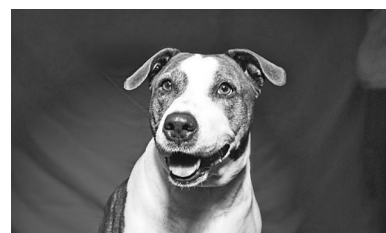

First-Time Dog Owner Finds Longtime Friend

Growing up, Susan Wiehn always wanted a dog.

So when she met Brinkley, a Havanese puppy, in 2013, it was love at first sight.

"I've wanted a dog my whole life, so I always said, 'When I retire, I'll get one.'" Wiehn said. "I loved Brinkley from the first moment I saw him."

Before taking the step to get her first dog, Wiehn did a lot of research about breeds, until she found a Havanese breeder in Florida.

The Havanese, a small breed known for its charm, often is said to be Cuba's national dog, according to the American Kennel Club, and is the only Cuban breed recognized by the AKC.

"A friend brought me to pick him up, and when we drove into the driveway of the house, I looked over and there's the breeder with Brinkley," Wiehn said.

She recalled seeing a white ball of fluff standing on the grass — Brinkley as a puppy, at only a few weeks old.

From a young age, Brinkley began showing signs of a charismatic personality that still is visible today. Before moving to The Villages, Brinkley charmed all of Wiehn's neighbors in Connecticut.

"He was the mayor of our

road in Connecticut. Everybody loved Brinkley," she said. "He was like a rock star. Girls would run down the street to see him and he ate it up."

While the charm may have run in the family, as both of Brinkley's parents were show dogs, that quality wasn't passed on to Brinkley.

"Brinkley isn't a show dog. He likes to play in the dirt, he wouldn't be good for that," Wiehn said. "But he's always been happy. He's been a happy dog since the day I met him."

Nevertheless, Brinkley has quite a few tricks up his paw, which he performs on Wiehn's command — most of the time and usually with an incentive.

As a first-time dog owner, Wiehn did extensive research on discipline and social skills that would benefit Brinkley.

"This was my first dog, so I did all the reading about getting dogs acclimated to all people and I kept a notebook with notes," she said. "I did more research than was necessary, but it was all worthwhile."

Brinkley's outgoing personality helped him stand out in his "puppy class," where the trainer knew to contact Wiehn if she had a shy dog who needed help coming out of its shell.

"Most of the time, within 15 minutes of meeting, Brinkley would have the dogs playing with him," she said. "He has never met anyone he didn't like."

His social skills make him a popular dog in Wiehn's Village of Osceola Hills neighborhood, where Brinkley is friends with most of the dogs. He even enjoys visits to his vet and his groomer, Wiehn said.

"He's just wagging his tail when his groomer pulls up and he jumps into her van," she said. "She says he's one of two dogs who are actually happy to see her."

Brinkley is a perceptive dog who is good at reading emotions, which made him a good candidate to become a therapy dog — a program he and Wiehn completed in November 2016.

His perceptiveness adds to his happy personality, because

he knows when to be a source of comfort for people who are going through a tough time, Wiehn said.

"I have seen him with my friends when they're having a bad day, and he just looks

in their eyes and makes them feel like they're the only thing in the world," she said. "He's joyous and joyful. He spreads joy throughout the land."

Lucky Pooch: Shelter Dog to Be Adopted After Ill-Timed Bite

JACKSONVILLE

A shelter dog in Florida is getting a second chance after biting a man who stepped on him during a presentation to promote pet adoption.

Jacksonville spokeswoman Tia Ford told the Florida Times-Union the 2-year-old pit bull mix named Elvis had been quarantined for 10 days and now someone has applied to adopt him.

Elvis had been at the

June 13 city council meeting as part of a plan to promote pet adoption. A Jacksonville Sheriff's Office report says an audience member told officers a 63-year-old man was barreling down a crowded aisle when he became tangled in the dog's leash and stepped on Elvis. The man was taken to a nearby hospital for stitches.

Officials still aren't sure whether shelter animals will return to council meetings.
