

First Reading Hosea 11:1-11

A READING FROM THE BOOK OF HOSEA.

When Israel was a child, I loved him, and out of Egypt I called my son. The more I called them, the more they went from me; they kept sacrificing to the Baals, and offering incense to idols. Yet it was I who taught Ephraim to walk, I took them up in my arms; but they did not know that I healed them. I led them with cords of human kindness, with bands of love. I was to them like those who lift infants to their cheeks. I bent down to them and fed them. They shall return to the land of Egypt, and Assyria shall be their king, because they have refused to return to me. The sword rages in their cities, it consumes their oracle-priests, and devours because of their schemes. My people are bent on turning away from me. To the Most High they call, but he does not raise them up at all. How can I give you up, Ephraim? How can I hand you over, O Israel? How can I make you like Admah? How can I treat you like Zeboiim? My heart recoils within me; my compassion grows warm and tender. I will not execute my fierce anger; I will not again destroy Ephraim; for I am God and no mortal, the Holy One in your midst, and I will not come in wrath. They shall go after the Lord, who roars like a lion; when he roars, his children shall come trembling from the west. They shall come trembling like birds from Egypt, and like doves from the land of Assyria; and I will return them to their homes, says the Lord.

Holy Word, Holy Wisdom. All: Thanks be to God.

Give thanks to the Lord who is good, * and whose mercy endures for ever.

Let all those whom the Lord has redeemed proclaim * that God redeemed them from the hand of the foe.

Deuxième Lecture Colossiens 3:1-11

LECTURE DE LA LETTRE DE PAUL AUX COLOSSIENS.

Puisque vous avez été ramenés de la mort à la vie avec le Christ, recherchez alors les choses qui sont au ciel, là où le Christ siège à la droite de Dieu. Préoccupez-vous de ce qui est là-haut, et non de ce qui est sur la terre. Car vous êtes morts, et votre vie est cachée avec le Christ en Dieu. Votre véritable vie, c'est le Christ! Quand il paraîtra, alors vous paraîtrez aussi avec lui, en participant à sa gloire.

Faites donc mourir tout ce qui est terrestre en vous : la débauche, l'impureté, l'égoïsme, les mauvais désirs et l'avarice (car l'avarice, c'est de l'idolâtrie). Ce sont de telles fautes qui attirent la colère de Dieu sur les personnes qui s'opposent à lui. Voilà comment vous vous conduisiez autrefois, quand votre vie était dominée par ces péchés.

Mais maintenant, vous aussi, rejetez tout ceci : la colère, l'irritation et la méchanceté, l'insulte à Dieu. Qu'aucune parole grossière ne sorte de votre bouche. Ne vous mentez pas les uns aux autres, car vous avez abandonné l'être humain que vous étiez auparavant avec ses habitudes et vous avez revêtu l'être nouveau que Dieu, notre créateur, renouvelle continuellement à son image, pour que vous le connaissiez parfaitement. Il n'importe donc plus que l'on soit païen ou Juif, circoncis ou incirconcis, non civilisé, primitif, esclave ou libre ; ce qui compte, c'est le Christ, qui est tout et en tous.
