Elton John AIDS Foundation



The mission of the Elton John AIDS Foundation (EJAF) is to end the AIDS epidemic by ensuring everyone has the information and means to prevent infection and all people living with HIV have access to high-quality medical care and treatment. At EJAF, we believe AIDS can be beaten. We act on that belief by raising funds for evidence-based programs and policies, and also by speaking out with honesty and compassion about the realities of people's lives.

Sir Elton John created EJAF almost 25 years ago, first in the United States in 1992 and then in the United Kingdom in 1993. Through hard work and with the help of our network of generous friends and supporters, the two foundations together have raised more than \$350 million over the past quarter century to combat stigma, prevent infections, provide treatment and services, and motivate governments to end AIDS. The U.S. foundation focuses its efforts on programs in the United States, the Americas, and the Caribbean, while the U.K. foundation funds HIV-related work in Europe, Asia, and Africa.

The U.S. foundation was recently recognized by Funders for LGBTO Issues as the largest funder of LGBTO health programs in the nation. During 2015, the Foundation awarded nearly \$9.8 million in grants to 134 organizations across the U.S., as well as Canada, Mexico, and the Caribbean.

EJAF's grant making encompasses grassroots and community-based programs, regional partnerships, national strategies, and international cooperative efforts. The Foundation's grant making focuses on HIV prevention, harm reduction, community health and human rights empowerment campaigns, stigma eradication, and compassionate public policy development. EJAF also supports direct services for persons living with HIV/AIDS, including medical and mental health treatment, testing and counseling services, case management and social service coordination, legal aid, and professional training.

In addition, the Foundation is an international leader and champion on politically marginalized issues, backing up its grant

making with speeches, editorials, and other public communications calling for access to life-saving medicines for the poor, for LGBT health and rights, for accessible sexual health services for young people, for health and economic equality for Black Americans, and for fully funded post-prison community re-entry programs for HIV-positive ex-offenders.

EJAF's regional, national, and international leadership in this field is predicated upon (1) its vigilant attention to the constant challenges of this ever-evolving global epidemic, (2) its commitment to the development of strong partnerships with like-minded organizations in order to maximize resources and minimize duplication of effort, and (3) its strategic investment of donor dollars to have the greatest possible impact in reducing the incidence of HIV/AIDS. The U.S. organization targets key regions and populations poorly served by current prevention efforts and most at risk of infection: critically under-funded communities in the United States, the Americas, and the Caribbean; stigmatized and marginalized populations including gay and bisexual men, transgender people, injection drug users, and incarcerated individuals; and under-served populations including Black Americans, women and girls, and young people.

For ten consecutive years, EJAF has been recognized as a four-star charity – the very highest rating – by Charity Navigator, indicating that the Foundation consistently executes its mission in a fiscally responsible way and adheres to good governance and other best practices that promote and ensure ethical and transparent business dealings. EJAF's strong financial health and dynamic and flexible grant-making philosophy position the organization ideally to respond to sudden emergencies involving the life and health of people living with HIV/AIDS, to adjust its grant-making priorities to address the needs of the ever-shifting demographics of this global epidemic, and to advocate for policies that protect and strengthen the health and rights of people affected by HIV/AIDS.

HOW IT'S PLAYED

MATCH

Tonight's match will feature the WTT format – Team Elton will play against Team Billie Jean. The team with the most total games at the end of four sets plus Extended Play (if necessary) wins the match. Scoring is cumulative. A celebrity set of doubles will kick off the night followed by a set of men's singles, a set of men's and women's doubles and one set of mixed doubles. The celebrity set will not count towards the overall match score. Team Elton leads Team Billie Jean 12-11 in the series.

SCORING

- · Scoring is no-ad (the first team to win four points wins the game). Game scoring is 1. 2. 3. game.
- · At game point (3-3), the receiver chooses the side to receive the serve from (in mixed doubles, it is gender-to-gender).
- · If a set reaches 4-4, a 9-point tiebreaker is played.
- · Each game counts as one point in the team's cumulative match score.
- · Let serves are played.

WINNER OF THE MATCH

The match concludes when the team leading in overall game score wins the final set, or when the trailing team going into the final set wins it and captures the lead (overall cumulative score).

EXTENDED PLAY

Extended Play, if necessary, is played following the final set. If the final set is won by the trailing team and the trailing team is still behind in the cumulative score, the match goes into Extended Play and continues until the leading team wins one game or the trailing team ties the match score. If the score becomes tied, the match is decided by a Supertiebreaker.

SUPERTIEBREAKER

In the event the match score is tied after all sets, or if the trailing team ties the score in Extended Play, a 13-point Supertiebreaker is played to decide the outcome of the entire match. The server of the 12th point will serve the 13th point- gender to gender. Players change ends after the 6th point. The first team to reach 7 points is awarded a single game and the match.

For more than 40 years, Sir Elton John has been one of the most successful and acclaimed entertainers in the world. As one of the five best-selling solo-artists of all time, Elton has earned his place on the Billboard charts and in the record books again and again.

In addition to having 35 gold and 25 platinum albums to his name, Elton has also recorded 29 consecutive Top 40 hits, more than both The Beatles and Madonna and second only to Elvis Presley. Elton holds the record for the best-selling single of all time, "Candle in the Wind," which sold 37 million copies.

A Grammy, Tony, and Academy Award-winner, Elton received the Oscar for his original song, "Can You Feel the Love Tonight," featured in The Lion King. The Broadway show, Billy Elliot, which Elton scored, garnered universal acclaim and won 9 Tony Awards.

President George W. Bush presented Elton with the Kennedy Center Honors for his lifetime contribution to American culture in 2004. Rolling Stone magazine ranked Elton John as one of the most influential musicians of all time.

Nearly 30 years ago, Elton began a second career as a humanitarian and leading activist in the fight against HIV/ AIDS. Motivated by the loss of dozens of close friends to AIDS in the mid-1980s, Elton began channeling his grief into efforts to raise money for people in need of treatment and support. He also became an outspoken advocate for all people affected by HIV/AIDS and as a result became a close friend of Ryan White and his family. In 1992, shortly after Ryan's death, Elton established the Elton John AIDS Foundation (EJAF).

EJAF is one of the world's 10 largest grant-making organizations dedicated to fighting HIV/AIDS. Since Elton established EJAF in the United States in 1992 (and in the United Kingdom in 1993), the Foundation has raised more than \$350 million in community-based, front-line programs. Today, EJAF funds projects around the globe, providing innovative HIV-prevention education, leading efforts to combat stigma and discrimination, and undertaking care and support services for people living with the disease.

Over the years, Elton has been recognized as a global leader in the fight against AIDS. For his humanitarian efforts and artistic achievements, Elton was knighted by HM Oueen Elizabeth II. In 2012, Elton was the keynote speaker at the International AIDS Conference in Washington, DC, where he also addressed the global epidemic at a special briefing in the U.S. Senate. In 2013, the Rockefeller Foundation honored Elton with its prestigious Lifetime Achievement Award in recognition of humanitarian work, and he also received the Harvard School of Public Health AIDS Initiative Leadership Award.

Elton's national bestseller, Love Is the Cure (Little, Brown: 2012), chronicles the history and work of EJAF, and presents his vision of an AIDS-free world.

Elton's work in the fight against AIDS is rooted in the fight for equality, and that extends to giving students across the country equal opportunity for a successful future. Elton recently joined President Obama's Turnaround Arts initiative, bringing the power of music to students in underserved communities as a way to increase engagement and give every student an equal shot at a successful, healthy future.



New York, New York @BillieJeanKing

Billie Jean King is the founder of the Billie Jean King Leadership Initiative and the co-founder of World TeamTennis. As one of the 20th century's most respected and influential people, she has long been a champion for social justice and equality. She created new inroads for both genders in and out of sports during her legendary career.

On August 12, 2009, King was the first female athlete awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom, the nation's highest civilian honor. The first female athlete to be honored with the Medal of Freedom, King was presented the award by President Obama in ceremonies at The White House.

King was honored on August 28, 2006, when the National Tennis Center, home of the US Open, was renamed the USTA Billie Jean King National Tennis Center in honor of King's contributions to tennis, sports and society both on and off the court. She was also named one of the "100 Most Important Americans of the 20th Century" by Life Magazine in 1990.


King has long been recognized for her victory over Bobby Riggs at the Battle of the Sexes in 1973, an event that is remembered for its effect on society and its contribution to the women's movement. In 2008, King authored Pressure is a Privilege: Lessons I've Learned from Life and the Battle of the Sexes to commemorate the 35th anniversary of her

On the court, King won 39 Grand Slam singles, doubles and mixed doubles tennis titles, including a record 20 titles at Wimbledon. She was one of nine players who broke away from the tennis establishment in 1970 and accepted \$1 contracts from tennis promoter Gladys Heldman in Houston which led

to the birth of women's professional tennis. King then founded the Women's Tennis Association in 1973 and the Women's Sports Foundation in 1974.

In 1974 King co-founded World TeamTennis (WTT), the revolutionary professional tennis league. The league, which just completed its 41st season, showcases the best in professional team tennis competing for the King Trophy. She is currently the owner of one of the league's six franchises, the Philadelphia Freedoms. Elton John wrote the hit song "Philadelphia Freedom" in the 1970s in tribute to King and her WTT team.

King is a member of the President's Council on Fitness, Sports and Nutrition and serves on the boards of the Women's Sports Foundation, the Andy Roddick Foundation and the Elton John AIDS Foundation. She continues to be a leader in the fight for equality and recognition in the LGBT community, and has been honored by many of the leading LGBT organizations, including the Human Rights Campaign, GLAAD and Lambda Legal Foundation. She is also a 2016 recipient of the LOGO Trailblazer Award.

- Played 13 seasons of World TeamTennis, earning Female MVP honors in 2011 and claiming the 2003 championship with the Delaware Smash.

- Former world No. 1 in singles and doubles.
- Captured seven Grand Slam singles titles, including four at the US Open (1979-81, 1984) and three at Wimbledon (1981, 1983-84).
- Lifted nine Grand Slam doubles trophies: five Wimbledon (1979, 1981, 1983-84 and 1992) and four US Open (1979, 1981, 1983 and 1989). Also won the 1977 French Open mixed title.
- Won a combined 149 titles (77 singles, 72 doubles) overall.
- Member of five Davis Cup championship teams for the United States.
- One of tennis' most popular television commentators.
- The Johnny Mac Tennis Project is a charitable foundation established by John McEnroe and SPORTIME to raise money to advance youth tennis in the NY Metropolitan area.
- Opened John McEnroe Tennis Academy in 2010 at Randall's Island. Also has locations in Syosset and Lake Isle. (all locations in New York)
- Played 13 seasons of World TeamTennis.

12th year playing WTT Smash Hits

- Captured 59 Grand Slam titles 18 singles, 31 doubles, 10 mixed. Only Margaret Court, with 62, has won more. No man or woman has won more singles and doubles titles than Navratilova's 344 (167 singles, 177 doubles).
- Inducted into the International Tennis Hall of Fame in 2000.
- With 20 combined Wimbledon titles, tied with Billie Jean King for the most in the event's history.
- Finished as the year-end world No. 1 in singles seven times (1978-79, 1982-86). Also spent the most weeks atop the WTA doubles rankings in Tour history with 237.
- Only the third player in tennis history to own singles, doubles and mixed titles at all four Grand Slam events (Court and Doris Hart).
- In 1983, won 86 of her 87 matches, giving her the highest win percentage in a season (.988) of any player in the Open Era (lost only 6 matches from 1982-84).
- Ounderwent treatment for breast cancer in 2010 and has since been declared cancer-free.
- Played a record 20 World TeamTennis seasons and led her teams to five championships.

- Helped lead U.S. team to the Davis Cup title in 2007 the first for the U.S. since 1995.
- Won four doubles titles, including the 2009 Indian Wells trophy with Mardy Fish.
- November 2003, became the first male tennis player to host Saturday Night Live.
- The Andy Roddick Foundation has raised more than \$14 million for charity since 2001.
- Played nine seasons of World TeamTennis, most recently in 2016 with the New York Empire.
- In May 2013, joined the World TeamTennis Ownership Group along with Venus Williams.



- Former world No. 1 in singles.
- One of six WTA players in the Open Era to complete a Career Grand Slam, having won five major singles titles (2004 Wimbledon, 2006 US Open, 2008 Australian Open and 2012, 2014 French Open).
- Holds 35 singles titles and three doubles titles on the WTA Tour.
- Won the silver medal in singles at the 2012 Olympic Games in London. Has also represented Russia in Fed Cup.
- ♦ In 2004, finished the season by triumphing at the WTA Finals.
- Her business ventures include candy line Sugarpova (launched 2012) and a Nike apparel collection.
- Established the Maria Sharapova Foundation in 2007, which strives to help children around the world achieve their dreams.
- Played seven seasons of World TeamTennis, making her debut as a 15-year-old in 2002.

- Represented Team USA at the Rio Olympics in August. Also is a member of U.S. Fed Cup team (made debut in 2010).
- Owns career-high WTA rankings of No. 29 in singles and No. 19 doubles, both which were achieved this year.
- Best major singles result came at 2015 Wimbledon, where she reached the quarterfinals. Also a two-time doubles semifinalist at the US Open.
- Played seven seasons of World TeamTennis, including past two years with Philadelphia Freedoms.




