lthough they're known for being the ultimate city folk, Victoria and David Beckham escape to the countryside whenever their busy schedules give them a chance with sources close to the couple describing their stunning Cotswolds mansion as their "sanctuary".

The couple purchased the £6million Grade II listed farmhouse back in 2016, going on to spend huge sums on renovations that have since doubled its worth to around £12million. It was initially the family's holiday home, instead choosing to spend their weekdays at their £31million London townhouse, in the exclusive

Holland Park area. Now, Victoria, 50, and David, 49, are spending increasingly more time at their countryside escape - with some insiders saying the family are considering a permanent move.

Youngest daughter Harper, 13, spends her time at the farm with her parents, while brothers Brooklyn, 25, Romeo, 21, and Cruz, 19, use it as a home base.

The property now boasts a £50,000 safari-style tent for alfresco entertaining, a sauna, a pool table, a man-made lake, and multiple swimming pools. While Romeo used to have his own tennis court on the sprawling grounds, it's since been converted into a football pitch for dad David to enjoy. The property has also

been the location for some of the Beckham brood's biggest celebrations - previously spending New Year's Eve there, as well as hosting birthday parties and family photo shoots.

While their London abode is known for its sleek and monochrome aesthetic, their Cotswolds home has an ambiance that is warm and cosy - with photographs posted by Victoria revealing geometric hardwood flooring, exposed brick walls, and floor-to-ceiling windows. Touches of wood, mustard vellow velvet, and green tartan are sprinkled throughout for a more rustic feel.

During their popular Netflix documentary Beckham, David took fans inside the home - describing

it as his "escape." While there, the couple are able to indulge in a much slower pace of life. Victoria has often shared snaps of her picturesque kitchen, perfect for baking, while David is a keen gardener. His vegetable patch sits close to his beehives - a passion project. The former footballer has even gifted King Charles a jar of his homemade honey, named Sticky Stuff.

Opening up about their idyllic home, a local shared, "David and Victoria's home is pretty remote, and they've been able to enjoy the sweet silence of the countryside." Far from the hustle and bustle of London, their Cotswolds farmhouse provides a relaxing escape for the couple and their four children.
