In addition to the lecture series, Alden Library will be hosting an exhibit on Wealth and Poverty in Rural America February 6 through March 10. The exhibit will display photos, maps, books and other symbols of the contributions and challenges of rural areas in the United States.

"Rural America Week will bring the Ohio University community together to discuss core issues in rural America and look for ways to strengthen it," said Dr. Yeong-Hyun Kim, an associate professor of geography at Ohio University. "The week aims to draw our students' attention to the stories of rural people, places and issues in the US and to highlight the importance of rural areas to Ohio University and to the country."
