

Tottenham injury complications ahead of Europa League semi-final

Tottenham Hotspur's season hinges on tonight's result in the Europa League semi-final against FK Bodø/Glimt, amid further injury complications.

Ange Postecoglou will surely deploy his strongest Spurs side for the second leg of the tie at the Aspmyra Stadion, in what will be the club's first meeting against the Norwegian side.

19-year-old Lucas Bergvall will be sidelined after he sustained an ankle injury at Anfield in Liverpool's title-winning contest. Tottenham will also be without captain Son Heung-min and James Maddison, who suffered a knee injury following the first leg against Bodø/Glimt.

Postecoglou said: "I'm disappointed for [Maddison] because he's been a real catalyst for us. He'll miss out, but that's been the story of our season."

This is the furthest Bodo/Glimt have come in any European competition in their history, as Kasper Høgh will be Tottenham's biggest threat. He is the joint top-scorer in the Europa League, with seven, and he will be keen to add to his tally tonight. Captain Patrick Berg will return for tonight's contest following his absence in the first leg.

Tottenham will seek to break a seventeen-year trophy drought, after ex-Spurs striker Harry Kane grabbed his first major trophy on Sunday, winning the Bundesliga title with Bayern Munich.
