# 'The loss of my sister was not an unpredictable tragedy'

Emotional letter written by sibling of late Natalie McGuinness, who was killed in 2015, read out in Dáil discussion on mental health services



IN the Dáil on Tuesday, January 27, a motion was put forward by Sinn Féin's Deputy Sorca Clarke of the Longford-Westmeath
