

How Much Does a Tokyo Family Trip Really Cost?

How much can you expect to spend in Tokyo as a family of four? Here's a quick mid-range budget breakdown.

Tokyo has amazing family-friendly restaurants, from ramen spots to conveyor-belt sushi.

Expect to spend around \$40 for lunch and about \$80 for dinner, bringing your total food budget to roughly \$120 a day.

Entertainment in Tokyo can be cheap or pricey depending on what you do. For example, if day one includes Legoland Discovery Centre, tickets range from \$15 to \$36 per person, so a family of four would spend roughly \$100 to \$145 total. Then in the afternoon, head to a free park like Ueno for a picnic lunch or some downtime.

Getting around is easy and affordable. A 24-hour subway pass costs about \$5 per adult and \$3 per child. That's just around \$16 to \$21 total for the day.

For accommodation, expect to pay between \$230 and \$330 per night for a mid-range family apartment hotel like MIMARU.

So, for a comfortable, activity-filled day in Tokyo, plan for around \$475 per day for a family of four. But if you visit in Autumn, prices are lower, the weather's great, and you'll skip the cherry blossom crowds.
