QUICK HITTERS

- UC Riverside will look to get back on track on Saturday when Cal Poly comes to the SRC Arena for a 4:00 p.m. first serve on ESPN+. UCR was the fourth team of UC Santa Barbara's season to push the Gauchos to five sets on Thursday before ultimately falling 3-2. A win on Saturday will snap a 16-match losing streak to the Mustangs dating back to a 3-2 win in San Luis Obispo in 2013. UCR's last series win in Riverside came in 2012, also in five sets.
- UC Riverside made program history last weekend with its weekend road sweep of CSUN and Cal State Bakersfield. The Highlanders improved to above .500 through three matches for the first time in the program's 23-year Big West tenure. UCR's 3-1 win in Bakersfield also cemented the program's first three-match Big West winning streak in program history.
- Head coach Nicky Cannon returns for her second season at the helm of the program, as does Aerielle Edwards in an assistant coach capacity. Sheri Sanders joined the women's volleyball staff ahead of the 2023 season after a year at Washington State. Sanders is a two-time Long Beach State Hall of Fame inductee and was a First Team AVCA All-American for the Beach.
- UCR welcomes 10 newcomers to the program in 2023, including Division I transfers from UConn (Brooklyn Wiedenheft) and New Orleans (Sophia Ewalefo). UCR also welcomes Trinity Neal from Divison III UC Santa Cruz.

HEAD COACH NICKY CANNON



Nicky Cannon was named Head Women's Volleyball Coach on April 18, 2022 and enters her second season in 2023.

Cannon, who spent the previous three seasons as an assistant coach with Cal State Fullerton, becomes the program's fourth head coach since its inception in 1970 (originally at the Division II level before UCR Athletics transitioned to the Division I level just over 20 years ago).

Cannon turned over a new leaf with the program's energy and culture in her first season in 2023, bringing in experienced setter Taylor Hifo. Under Cannon's tutelage, Hifo recorded the Big West's first triple double since 2018 and her 500th career assist. Hifo also earned All-Big West Honorable Mention while Bella Scarlett picked up multiple All-Tournament awards and her 500th career kill.

Cannon's Highlanders pulled out a dramatic 3-2 victory of UC San Diego in her debut at the SRC Arena on September 29, 2022.

In three seasons with Cal State Fullerton, Cannon's presence made an impact. In her first year, the squad had a huge turnaround season, finishing the year with a 12-15 overall record. The 12 total wins were the most for the program since 2012 while the four conference victories were the most since 2013. The team doubled their win total from the previous year and Cannon (as lead in defensive development and systems) guided the team to a Top 25 national ranking with 17.44 digs per set. Cannon was also a part of staff to (then) Head Coach Ashley Preston's Big West Conference Co-Head Coach of The Year after the 2019 season.

Cannon helped guide Cal State Fullerton's Julia Crawford to a phenomenal 2019 rookie campaign, as she was awarded a spot on the All-Big West First Team and Freshman Team. Her 368 kills and 398.5 total points were the most by a Titan since the 2014 season en route to becoming just the ninth Fullerton player to earn a First Team selection and the first since Kayla Neto in 2012. Cannon also worked with Savahna Costello, a 2019 Big West Honorable Mention honoree. The 5'5" libero absolutely dominated the conference leaderboards averaging 5.31 digs per set; a number that ranked 13th in the entire NCAA. Her 531 total digs on the year is the sixth most in Titan single-season history as she posted double-digit digs in nearly every match that season. Costello ranks sixth all-time in the program in total digs for her career with 1,197.

Cannon joined Cal State Fullerton after spending three years as the Assistant Coach in both indoor and beach volleyball at Cypress Community College. In her three years as the Assistant Coach, she helped Nancy Welliver to one indoor and two beach conference championships as well as two state tournament appearances.

Prior to Cypress, Cannon was the Athletics Director and Head Volleyball Coach at Christ Academy High School in Wichita Falls, Texas from 2013-2015. While in Texas, Cannon also co-founded Zone-In Volleyball Academy (ZIVA), where she was the head coach for the 14's and 18's National Team and Club Director from 2012-2019.


Cannon was also awarded the American Volleyball Coaches Association 2020 Diversity Award and was a keynote speaker at the 2020 and 2021 AVCA Volleyball Convention.

Cannon graduated from Colgate University where she was a Patriot League All-Conference Pitcher. She has also completed her Master's Degree in Physical Education at Azuza Pacific and resides in La Palma with her husband Jerronand two daughters Rishae and Syriah.

ASSISTANT COACH AERIELLE EDWARDS

Aerielle Edwards enters her second season as an assistant coach with the UC Riverside volleyball program in 2023.

Edwards arrived in the Inland Empire in 2022 after two years of coaching high school volleyball at Texas Image Volleyball Club in Grand Prairie, Texas. In 2018, she served as an assistant coach under Ronda Shirley at



Edwards played her college volleyball at Division II Midwestern State in Wichita Falls, Texas. She was a two-time All-Lone Star Conference (LSC) honoree for the Mustangs, earning Postseason All-Tournament Team honors and a spot on the LSC Commissioner's Honor Roll in 2016.

She began her college career with an NJCAA All-Region 16 honor at Missouri State-West Plains before earning NJCAA Region XIV Newcomer of the Year with Tyler JC In 2014.

Edwards was born and raised in Fort Worth, Texas and resides in Riverside with her son, Jeremiah.



ASSISTANT COACH SHERI SANDERS

Sheri Sanders joined the UC Riverside volleyball staff in July 2023 as an assistant coach following one season at Washington State.

Sanders spent the past 30 plus years providing specialized skills training and has developed hundreds of top-ranking setters in the

SoCal region. Sanders is a former First-Team AVCA All-American and led Long Beach State to its first NCAA Division I national title in 1989.

Sanders was a four-year starter for the Beach, where she was later inducted into the LBSU Athletics Hall of Fame twice, once as an individual player in 2001 and again in 2011 as a member of the 1989 national championship team.

Sanders was named to the Big West All-Freshman Team in 1986, Second Team in 1988 and First Team in 1989. She still holds program and Division I records in categories of assists (6,031), digs (1,180) and service aces (151). In 2017, Sanders was recognized as fourth on the top 10 best female volleyball players in the history in Southern California.



MATCH NOTES

DIVISION I HISTORY

2023-24 will mark UC Riverside's 23rd year as a member of the Big West. In that time, UCR women's volleyball has produced 25 Big West All-Academic honorees, 19 All-Big West Honorees and 15 Big West Player of the Week honors.

LAST TIME OUT

UCR fell 3-2 to first-place UC Santa Barbara on Thursday after being just the fourth team this year to push the Gauchos to a full five sets. Mylei Vargas-Deason put up a season-high 18 kills and UC Riverside as a unit put up 53 kills as a team, the most for the Highlanders in Big West play this season.

HASHTAG HIGHLANDERS: WHAT'S TRENDING?

UC Riverside has been on the right side of history ever since Big West play started with a three-set defeat to UC Irvine on September 22.

- UCR got off to its best Big West start in program history at 3-1 following wins at CSUN and Cal State Bakersfield. In 22 previous years as a Big West member, UC Riverside had reached three wins in conference play just nine times. A win on Saturday will make it four Big West wins for just the sixth time in program history.
- Four of UCR's top five single-match dig totals this year have come in Big West play, all thanks to 3.90 digs per set from Jessica Dean that ranks seventh in conference play.
- UCR's two highest single-match block totals this season have come in conference play after recording 5.5 last Saturday in Bakersfield.
- UC Riverside was 0-11 entering last weekend when dropping set one, but twice fell behind
 1-0 before downing both CSUN and Cal State Bakersfield on the road.
- UCR has won three matches away from the SRC Arena for the first time since 2015.
- UC Riverside ranks in the top five in conference play in opponent hitting percentage (5th/.175), opponent kills (4th/11.25), service aces (5th/1.50) and digs (3rd/15.15).

UCR JOINS THE NIKE FAMILY

UC Riverside Athletics has entered into a new five-year agreement with Nike and BSN SPORTS. As part of the partnership agreement, BSN SPORTS will be UC Riverside Athletics' official provider of apparel, footwear and other equipment needs.

CONTINUED ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

UC Riverside women's volleyball landed 11 student-athletes on the 2022-23 Big West Commissioner's Honor Roll, including Highest Honors (3.51 to 4.0 GPA) recipients Delaney Tate, Madison Lounds and Hunter Thomas - all of whom return in 2023. Three Highlanders earned a spot on last fall's Big West All-Academic squad, making it nine honors in the past two seasons for UCR.

Per U.S. News & World Report, UCR is ranked No. 2 in the country for social mobility while jumping 13 spots in the overall rankings to No. 76 among the top 435 private and public universities.

THE OPPONENT

UC Riverside is meeting Cal Poly for the 44th time in program history and can snap a 16-match losing streak that dates back to 2013 with a win on Saturday.

PLAYER NOTES

- Delaney Tate enters Saturday ninth in the Big West overall with 3.11 kills per set and 11th overall with 3.34 points per set.
- Tylee Fuller and former Highlander setter Tayler Hifo are nearly one in the same: both come from Utah and both were in their first season with the program as transfers when leading the squad in total service aces per set. Fuller's 0.42 aces per set in Big West play rank seventh in the conference.
- Sophia Ewalefo has two double doubles to her credit this season, including last Friday's 13-kill, 14-dig performance at CSUN. Overall, Ewalefo ranks 13th in Big West play with 2.75 kills per set and 19th with 3.03 points per set.
- Mylei Vargas-Deason is closing in on 500 digs for her career, entering Saturday at 494. The Anaheim native is averaging 1.33 per set this season in conference play and has led UCR outright in kills in two of the last three matches.
- Sydnee Rowe set a season high last Friday with 10 kills. Rowe's .667 hitting percentage at Cal State Fullerton was the second-highest individual percentage in conference play this season, and Beatriz Silva's 32 assists were tied for the fourth-most in a three-set match.
- Jessica Dean's 25 digs at Cal State Bakersfield were the most in a four-set Big West match this season, and Tate's 17 kills were tied for the third most in a four-set match.
- Dean (7th/3.90) and Silva (15th/2.80) both rank in the top 15 in conference play in digs per set.
