

Forest Park's Honors Program was designed for you:

- to stimulate creativity.

To participate, you'll need one of the following:

- a GPA of 3.5 or better on a 4.0 scale and 12 college credit hours.
- an ACT composite score of
- SAT scores of 1,100 based on combined mathematics or verbal.
- Permission from the Forest Park Honors Program coordinator.

HOW DO YOU EARN HONORS CREDIT?

Students earn honors credit by taking an honors section of a regular course. Or, they can negotiate an honors contract with an instructor by agreeing to complete a special project that is beyond the normal workload of the course. Honors work must be successfully completed with a final course grade of A or B.

GRADUATE WITH HONORS

Students who earn at least six hours of honors credit with a 3.5 GPA or better, will be

presented a certificate of achievement at our annual Student Awards Banquet in the spring.

Students who earn 15 or more honors credits with a 3.5 GPA or better will be designated as Honors Program Scholars and will receive a gold seal on their diplomas, as well as a certificate of achievement.

Phi Theta Kappans earn the honor of wearing a gold stole and tassel at graduation and have increased scholarship opportunities.


