DENICE JOSTEN, WILL YOU PLEASE COME FORWARD?

DENICE IS A PROFESSOR OF READING WHO JOINED THE CAMPUS IN AUGUST 2000 AS AN ASSISTANT PROFESSOR.

SHE SERVED AS READING DEPARTMENT CHAIR FOR A COUPLE OF SEMESTERS, AND WAS ALSO ADJUNCT COORDINATOR FOR TWO YEARS.

DENISE IS ONE OF OUR CAMPUS SAGES WHEN IT COMES TO DEVELOPMENTAL EDUCATION, AND WE'RE GOING TO SERIOUSLY MISS HER WISDOM AND EXPERTISE IN THIS AREA.

SHE WAS PART OF A SPECIAL TEAM THAT ATTENDED APPALACHIAN STATE UNIVERSITY IN 2001 FOR THE KELLOGG INSTITUTE CERTIFICATION IN DEVELOPMENTAL EDUCATION.

WITH THREE OTHER FACULTY, SHE PLANNED AND PILOTED A LEARNING COMMUNITY, WHICH DEVELOPED INTO VARIOUS COMBINATIONS OF DEVELOPMENTAL COURSES OVER THE NEXT FEW YEARS.

IN 2001-02, SHE REPRESENTED FOREST PARK AND THE DISTRICT READING FACULTY ON THE DEVELOPMENTAL EDUCATION TASK FORCE, WHICH EVENTUALLY FULFILLED ITS FIRST GOAL—AND THAT WAS TO ENCOURAGE THE ACADEMIC GOVERNANCE COUNCILS TO PASS THE RDG:030 READING REQUIREMENT.

AFTER BEING HERE FOR TWO YEARS, I CAN APPRECIATE WHAT A VICTORY THAT WAS!

FROM 2006-09 SHE SERVED ON DEVELOPMENTAL EDUCATION ASSESSMENT COMMITTEES, CO-CHAIRING ONE, AND GAVE SEVERAL PRESENTATIONS ON THEIR FINDINGS.

FOR HER SABBATICAL, SHE WROTE TWO FORMS OF A READING TEST TO GIVE TO STUDENTS IN RDG:030 AND STUDENTS IN 100 LEVEL COURSES. USING THOSE TESTS, SHE CONDUCTED STUDIES FOR THE HUMANITIES DIVISION'S ASSESSMENTS FOR TWO YEARS.

THOSE RESULTS WERE GOOD NEWS: THAT STUDENTS **DO** DEVELOP READING SKILLS IN DEVELOPMENTAL EDUCATION READING COURSES THAT EVENTUALLY MATCH THOSE STUDENTS WHO HAVE NEVER TAKEN DEVELOPMENTAL EDUCATION!

YOU CAN TELL THAT DEVELOPMENTAL EDUCATION HAS BEEN
DENICE'S PASSION!

SHE IS LEAVING US WITH A VERY POSITIVE ATTITUDE ABOUT THE
EFFECTIVENESS AND SUCCESS OF THE READING DEPARTMENT'S

RICHARD SPRANDEL, WILL YOU PLEASE COME FORWARD?

RICH WAS A STATIONARY ENGINEER IN HVAC—HEATING AND COOLING—FOR MORE THAN 30 YEARS AT FOREST PARK BEFORE HE RETIRED ON LEAP DAY, FEB. 29.

RICH SAID HE REMEMBERS WORKING ON FOUR TO FIVE DIFFERENT CONTROL SYSTEMS FOR HEATING AND COOLING THROUGH THE YEARS, AND COLLECTING MORE THAN 2,000 PAGES OF TECHNICAL INFORMATION, WHICH HE STILL FINDS FASCINATING READING.

HE REMEMBERS WORKING THE DAY OF THE FLOOD OF 1997, WALKING OUT OF THE CONTROL ROOM ON “M LEVEL” AND WONDERING WHY WATER WAS SEEPING OUT OF THE WALL.

FOR THOSE OF YOU WHO WEREN'T HERE AT THE TIME, THE FLOOD WAS CAUSED BY A WATER MAIN BREAK UNDER OAKLAND AVENUE, WHICH CAUSED THE WATER TO ERUPT THROUGH THE FLOOR OF THE DUPLICATING CENTER AND RUN THROUGH M AND O LEVELS FOR FIVE HOURS.

RICH SAID EVENTUALLY THE WATER REACHED CHEST HIGH ON "M LEVEL" AND RESULTED IN MORE THAN 10 MILLION DOLLARS IN DAMAGE TO THE CAMPUS—INCLUDING EXTENSIVE REPAIRS TO THE INSULATION ON THE BOILERS AND CHILLERS.

HIS BEST MEMORIES, HOWEVER, ARE OF THE PEOPLE AT FOREST PARK, PARTICULARLY SOME OF HIS COLLEAGUES IN THE CAMPUS POLICE, OF WHICH HE HAS MANY HUMOROUS MEMORIES, WHICH HE WON'T MENTION HERE TODAY.

RICH WAS A MARATHON RUNNER FOR ABOUT 15 YEARS AND A FREQUENT USER OF THE FITNESS CENTER.

IN RETIREMENT HE HAS CONTINUED HIS PASSION FOR PHOTOGRAPHY AND IS CONSIDERING TAKING SOME ONLINE

COURSES—LIKE MOST RETIREES, HE WONDERES HOW HE EVER HAD TIME TO WORK!

RICH AND HIS WIFE, NAN, WHO IS HERE TODAY, ARE THE PARENTS OF AMY, WHO IS A BELLY DANCER, AND ENJOY LIVING AND DINING OUT IN THE ECLECTIC AREA OF DOGTOWN.

RICH SAID HE NOW SPENDS HIS MORNINGS AT THE LOCAL COFFEE SHOP WITH BUDDIES—SOLVING THE PROBLEMS OF THE WORLD.

THANK YOU, RICH.

TIM TOLSON, WILL YOU PLEASE COME FORWARD?

TIM TOLSON IS SO CLOSELY IDENTIFIED WITH ATHLETICS AND PHYSICAL EDUCATION THAT I BET MOST OF YOU IN THIS ROOM DON'T KNOW THAT HE ACTUALLY STARTED OUT WORKING IN THE LIBRARY.

TIM JOINED FOREST PARK COMMUNITY COLLEGE WHEN THE BUILDINGS WERE LITERALLY BRAND NEW—IN AUGUST 1967 AS A LIBRARY ASSISTANT. HE INVENTORIED ALL OF THE NEW MEDIA EQUIPMENT FOR THE NEW CAMPUS AND MANAGED THE EVENING MEDIA SERVICES.

IN 1969 HE MOVED TO HIS TRUE CALLING—ATHLETICS AND PHYSICAL EDUCATION, WHERE HE CARVED OUT HIS OWN NICHE AS GYM SUPERVISOR UNTIL 2006, WHEN HE TOOK MEDICAL LEAVE.

LONG-TIMERS (I WAS GOING TO SAY OLD-TIMERS) WILL TELL YOU THAT THE FOREST PARK GYM AND TIM TOLSON ARE SYNONYMOUS.

IF YOU NEEDED ANYTHING CONCERNING THE GYM, YOU CALLED TIM TOLSON. SOFT-SPOKEN WITH A READY SMILE, TIM WAS A “GO-TO PERSON” WHO KNEW HOW TO GET THINGS DONE, ALONG WITH HIS COLLEAGUE, WALLY WEEKLY.

HE WORKED FOR SEVERAL ATHLETIC DIRECTORS, PROBABLY RUSS DIPPOLD THE LONGEST, AND MOST RECENTLY, MIKE MOORE. HE REMEMBERS WHEN BOB NELSON WAS A YOUNG BASKETBALL COACH, INSTEAD OF A FORMER TRUSTEE, AND WAS FISHING BUDDIES WITH 1970S CAMPUS PRESIDENT RALPH LEE.

TIM’S PARTIES AT MACJC, THE EARLY VERSION OF MCCA, WERE LEGENDARY, AND HE WAS A LONG-TIME AND ACTIVE MEMBER OF BOTH THE CLASSIFIED AND PROFESSIONAL STAFF ASSOCIATIONS.

HE SERVED AS A MENTOR AND MEMBER OF THE CHILD CARE CENTER BOARD, AND WAS PART OF THE INITIAL STAFF OF THE NATIONAL YOUTH SPORTS PROGRAM, WHICH OPERATED A SUMMER DAY CAMP FOR DISADVANTAGED YOUTH AT FOREST PARK FOR MORE THAN 30 YEARS.

IN 2004, TIM WAS HONORED WITH THE PRESIDENT'S *WOW AWARD*, FOR EXTRAORDINARY SERVICE TO THE COLLEGE.

WE HAVE AN ***INNOVATION TEAM*** THIS YEAR:

- **CHIEF RICHARD BANAHAH OF CAMPUS POLICE**
- **STEPHEN SMITH OF FUNERAL SERVICES**
- **AND OFFICERS NIGEL (ni-gale) PARTEE AND KURT WAGNER**

WILL ALL OF YOU PLEASE COME FORWARD?

BACK WHEN I FIRST CAME TO THE COLLEGE, ALMOST TWO YEARS AGO, ONE OF THE FIRST THINGS I ASKED CHIEF BANAHAH WAS HOW OFTEN DO YOU PRACTICE YOUR CAMPUS LOCKDOWN DRILLS?

AT MY PREVIOUS COLLEGE IN NORTH CAROLINA, WE CONDUCTED ROUTINE LOCKDOWN DRILLS, AND EVEN REVIEWED EMERGENCY INFORMATION AT THE BEGINNING OF COLLEGE MEETINGS.

I'M NOT TAKING CREDIT HERE, BUT THAT QUESTION TO THE CHIEF WAS THE IMPETUS FOR THE RE-ACTIVATION OF THE CAMPUS EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT TEAM, WHICH PLANNED AND EXECUTED THE CAMPUS' FIRST TACTICAL ARMED INTRUDER DRILL ON OCT. 18, DURING PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT DAY.

NOT ONLY HAD IT NEVER BEEN DONE BEFORE AT ST. LOUIS COMMUNITY COLLEGE, BUT IT WAS THE FIRST TOTAL LOCKDOWN

OF ANY COLLEGE IN ST. LOUIS, ACCORDING TO ST. LOUIS POLICE SGT. BRYAN YOUNG.

THREE MONTHS LATER TO THE DAY, THOSE PRACTICES BECAME REALITY WHEN AN ACTIVE SHOOTER WAS IDENTIFIED A BLOCK FROM THE CAMPUS. BECAUSE OF OUR EARLIER TRAINING, WE WERE ABLE TO REACT QUICKLY AND CONFIDENTLY IN ENSURING THE SAFETY OF THE CAMPUS.

AS YOU KNOW, WE HAVE SINCE PRACTICED OUR FIRE DRILLS AND CONDUCTED A SECOND ARMED INTRUDER DRILL AND LOCKDOWN—THIS TIME WITH STUDENT ON CAMPUS.

IT'S IMPORTANT TO NOTE THAT ALL OF THESE DRILLS HAVE BEEN CONDUCTED IN PARTNERSHIP WITH THE ST. LOUIS POLICE DEPARTMENT AND THE ST. LOUIS FIRE DEPARTMENT, WITH WHOM WE MAINTAIN CLOSE TIES—THANKS TO THE RELATIONSHIPS THAT HAVE DEVELOPED OVER THE YEARS THROUGH CHIEF BANAHAN, HIS OFFICERS, AND OUR FIRE PROTECTION FACULTY, PARTICULARLY CHUCK ZOELLER.

I AM CONFIDENT THAT WE WILL CONTINUE TO HONE OUR SKILLS AND TRAIN OUR FACULTY AND STAFF TO BE VIGILANT AND PREPARED TO HANDLE EMERGENCY SITUATIONS ON CAMPUS.

SALLY POLTA, WILL YOU PLEASE COME FORWARD?

SALLY HAS BEEN A FACULTY MEMBER IN RADIOLOGIC
TECHNOLOGY SINCE 2005, AND BECAME AN ASSOCIATE
PROFESSOR IN 2009.

BUT HER HISTORY WITH FOREST PARK GOES BACK TO 1992, WHEN SHE GRADUATED FROM THE RADIOLOGIC TECHNOLOGY PROGRAM HERE.

AFTER GRADUATION, SHE WORKED AS A RADIOGRAPHER AT DE PAUL HOSPITAL, AT AN OUTPATIENT RADIOLOGY CLINIC, AND AT A LOCAL DOCTOR'S OFFICE—ALL WHILE EARNING HER BACHELOR'S DEGREE IN HEALTH MANAGEMENT AT NIGHT AT LINDENWOOD UNIVERSITY.

SALLY'S PEERS DESCRIBE HER AS SOMEONE WHO SMILES A LOT, HAS A GREAT SENSE OF HUMOR AND CAN BE A BIT OF A JOKESTER OR PRANKSTER.
