#### **H3: 1. "It's scorching!"**

This means it's extremely hot, almost like something is burning. You might hear, "The road is scorching in the sun!"

#### **H3: 2. "It's baking!"**

This is a great way to describe intense, dry heat, like you're in an oven. "The air conditioner in my apartment broke. It's baking in here!"

#### **H3: 3. "It's sweltering!"**

This word describes very humid heat that makes you sweat and feel uncomfortable. It emphasizes discomfort, like "It's sweltering inside this bus!"

### **H3. 4. "It's a heatwave!"**

When the hot weather lasts for several days, we call it a **heatwave**. You'll often hear this on the news: "We're expecting a heatwave next week."

**H3. 5. "I'm melting!"** This is a common, humorous way to express that you're so hot, you feel like you're literally melting away, like an ice cream!

## **H2: Bonus Idioms for Summer Conversations**

Here are a couple of *cool* idioms for you. (Get it? *Cool!*)

- **"Catch the sun:"** This doesn't mean literally grabbing the sun! This phrase means your skin gets darker from being in the sun. For example, "After being outside all day, you've really caught the sun!"
- **"Not a cloud in the sky":** This means the weather is very clear and sunny, with no clouds at all. For example, "Let's go to the beach; there's not a cloud in the sky!"
