Museum marks gun work

A MILITARY museum has marked the renovation of an anti-aircraft gun.
Heugh Battery Museum, in Hartlepool, refurbished the abandoned Bofors gun, which was used in the Second World War and is still in military use today, for permanent display.
Museum volunteer Wally Stewart, who served in the RAF for 22 years, was

influential in the refurbishment. He said:
"It is a desire I have had for a long time. I also wanted to do something that would help the memory of the RAF regiment, and I believe this is a fitting memorial."

The museum will offer free entry to the public on Remembrance Sunday, November 13.
