

Underground Coloring Club Brings Art and Relaxation Together

“When was the last time you actually just got to sit and color as an adult?” said Coco Jenkins the event organizer and creator of NTDLV (Nothing to Do Las Vegas)

Beneath string lights and the cool November evening breeze, guests gathered around picnic-style tables scattered across a cozy backyard, filled with mellow music, the sound of pencils scratching paper replacing the usual chatter of a typical night out. On Nov. 4, 2025, local artist Perry Paints hosted the Underground Coloring Club, an intimate event blending creativity, mindfulness, and community.

Held at a private location revealed only to RSVPed guests, the three-hour session from 7 to 10 p.m. offered attendees a space to unwind and reconnect with their inner artist. Tables were scattered with adult coloring books, markers, and pencils, while enjoying some snacks and drinks. Guests could enjoy the calming atmosphere, listen to music, and color freely without pressure or expectation.

“Like, people who just like real people, you know, creativity and, like, having conversations and you know, not coming home, like, feeling empty,” said Jenkins with an emphasis on mindfulness, connection, and expression.

Tables were stocked with adult coloring books, pencils, and markers, and guests could freely move around, admire the art on display, or join in light conversation. Snacks and refreshments, followed with the night's open flow of mellow music and live personal performance of Perry Paints added to the evening's sense of community and comfort.



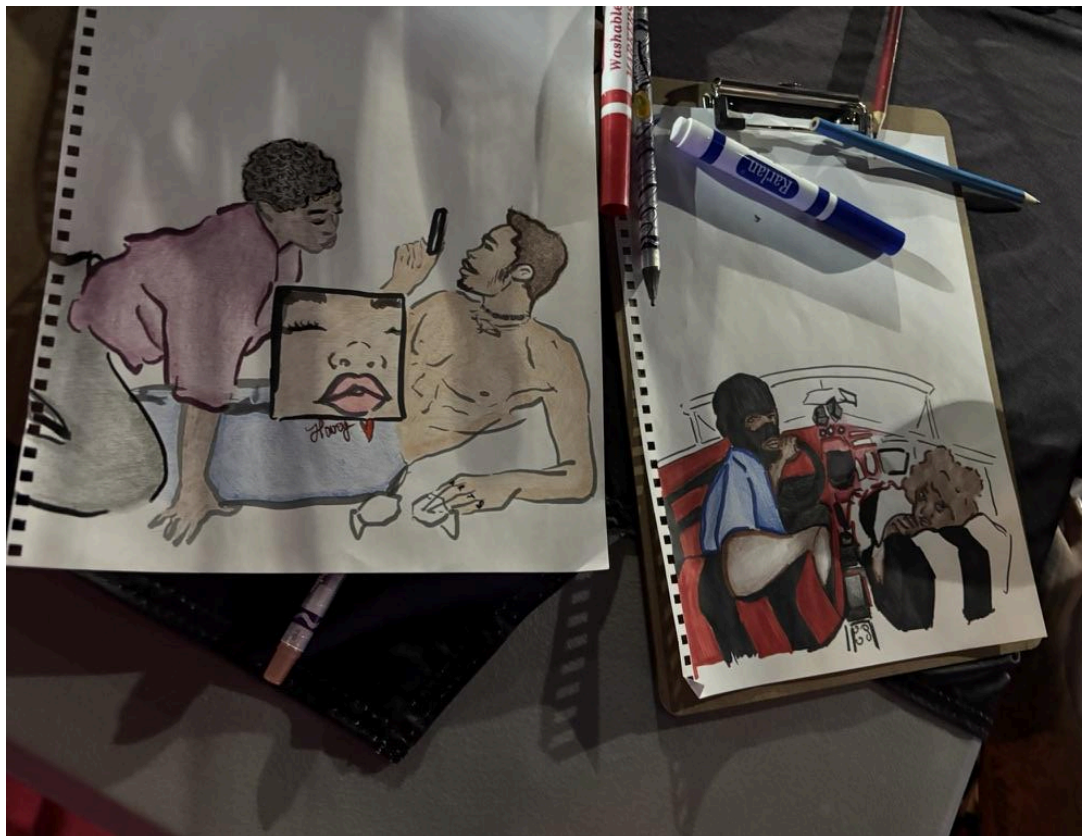
