But despite its growing popularity, it's still a hallmark for Irish tradition: snug pubs with friendly faces, classic dishes serving local produce, and a budgeoning live music scene.

For our favourite destinations in Cork, we look to its restaurants, bars, cafés and pubs – celebrated across the country for its mixture of cosmopolitan and staple dishes.

# 5. Franciscan Well Brewery

Winner of six coveted World Beer Awards since 2013, Franciscan Well Brewery is one of Cork's most celebrated pubs. It takes craft beer to another level, and visitors can soak up the atmosphere in the pub's beer garden, while enjoying wood-fired pizza.

The pub has also teamed up with Jameson Whisky to create the International Beer Challenge gold medal winner Jameson-Aged Stout and Jameson-Aged Pale Ale – talk about a taste of Ireland!
