- Do you have a wallet? Yes
  - What do you look for when it come to buying a wallet? personally, I look at the price of the wallet first, and then see whether it's within my budget, and also its functionality. I always carry around a lot of coins, so it needs to have like a zip, To keep my coins in place and I need a cash and card slot as I carry around a lot of cards
  - What are some brands you lent towards when buying one and why? Material? Cost? Look? A good wallet brand would probably be Charles and Keith, which is cost friendly, it's pretty affordable, but it's also quite good quality. Aesthetics depends on what I need for the wallet.
  - How long do you usually keep your wallet before changing it? 3 years
  - Do you use it more for cash or cards? Card, cash is only there for places that don't allow cashless payment
  - Do you prefer e wallets or physical? I prefer e wallets.
  - What size of wallet do you prefer and why? I actually don't really care much about the size. As long as it, like, has everything that I need in it.



- Do you use a wallet? Yes, I do use a wallet. It's pretty small and old, but it's still functional.
- What do you usually look for when buying a wallet? Cheap enough and a good enough material to last a long time
- What are some brands you lent towards when buying one and why? Material? Cost? Look? I Like to look for good deals and discounts. So when I see a cheap wallet that I like I'll just get it I don't really take into consideration the material and the look of it
- How long do you usually keep your wallet before changing it? 5 plus years, but it depends on whether it's still functional after that point.
- Do you use it more for cash or cards? I only use cash because I do not have any credit or debit cards as of now.
- Do you prefer e wallets or physical? I still prefer physical wallets because I'm still inexperienced with cashless payment.
- What size of wallet do you prefer and why? I do go for like smaller wallets because my pants that I have at home the pockets are relatively smaller.





- Do you use a wallet? Yes, I use my physical wallet basically every time I go out, I will bring my wallet with me.
- What do you usually look for when buying a wallet? I will look for if they have a coin compartment. Because that's just more convenient for me to hold my coins inside and have a notes compartment. The most important is if it can hold my cards.
- What are some brands you lent towards when buying one and why? Material? Cost? Look? No, actually I don't really care much about the brand. I care more about like the design, if it's cute and if it has like the features that I want, so it's mostly don't really care about the brand. Design is quite important to me as well.
- How long do you usually keep your wallet before changing it? I think about a year, because usually, the fake leather starts to break off, and the metal starts rusting.
- Do you use it more for cash or cards? Card.
- Do you prefer e wallets or physical? I think that I would prefer my physical wallet.
- What size of wallet do you prefer and why? I wouldn't mind a medium sized wallet, but the large one, like those long, long rectangle one, I think those are too big for me.





- Do you use a wallet? Yes.
- What do you usually look for when buying a wallet? Aesthetic and the overall appearance first, I would see if the, the material is durable and if there is space for me to store my cards and maybe a coin pouch as well.
- What are some brands you lent towards when buying one and why? Material? Cost? Look? I would personally lean for slightly more niche and expensive brands. As it usually has better quality materials And it will last me longer. I would prefer leather or cow skin.
- How long do you usually keep your wallet before changing it? 3 to 4 years before I actually change to a new one.
- Do you use it more for cash or cards? I hold cards more as, I hardly carry around cash.
- Do you prefer e wallets or physical? I would still prefer a physical wallet as I feel more secure when the wallet is in my pocket.
- What size of wallet do you prefer and why? I prefer a small wallet as personally, I do not like super bulky wallet





- Do you use a wallet? Yes, I do use a wallet and it's a coin pouch. I don't use my wallet on a daily basis but I do bring my wallet out every day.
- What do you usually look for when buying a wallet? I usually look for like one big compartment because besides storing coins in my coin pouch, I will also store my cards and my notes and my lip balm.
- What are some brands you lent towards when buying one and why? Material? Cost? Look? I lean towards would be like Carhartt or Stussy because it's just personally a brand that I like. I would say it's the look, if you want to talk about the brand, because I buy it for the brand itself. The cost I would say about like 50. Durability is definitely important. A dark coloured wallet
- How long do you usually keep your wallet before changing it? One to two years
- Do you use it more for cash or cards? I use it to hold cash if you want to talk about coins but I also use it to store like two cards.
- Do you prefer e wallets or physical? I would prefer e wallet but it's essential to bring out a physical wallet too.
- What size of wallet do you prefer and why? I prefer wallet that is small enough to be placed into my pocket.

## Summary of findings

- · 4/5 of users preferred small to medium sized wallets.
- 3/5 of the users want a durable wallet, preferably out of leather.
  - 5/5 of the users use their wallets daily.
- 5/5 of the users want a coin pouch with their wallets.



## Analysis & Insight

Insight 1. 4/5 of my users said that their ideal wallet would be smaller and more compact (small enough to fit into their pockets and hands).

Insight 2. 4/5 of my users said that their ideal wallet has to have card holders as they prefer carrying cards to cash. (around 2-5 cards are the amount they carry on themselves).

Insight 3. 5/5 of my users want a coin pouch with a zip in their ideal wallet (some not necessarily for just holding coins but also personal things like lip balm).

Insight 4. 3/5 of my users want a durable wallet.


## Scenario 2










## Changes made

• Sketch 1. Changed the button coin pouch to zip to make it more secure

• Sketch 2. Replaced the coin pouch with a clear picture holder, this wallet caters more towards those who prefer to go cashless and like using cards

• Sketch 3. Reinforced the spin of the wallet to make it more durable. Reduced the number of card slots for a more sleek and appealing aesthetic

# Chosen prototype: Sketch 3



## Prototype

- The sketch that I'm choosing is sketch 3 as it has received the most praise from the feedback and fits into the aesthetic that I want, which is minimalism.
- The material I'm making it out of is going to be cardboard since it is the most accessible to me and very easy to work with.
- The dimensions of the wallet ideally are 10cm by 10 cm when close, 10cm by 17 cm when opened

## Measurements of wallet

• Length is 20 cm by 11cm when opened fully

- . Length is 9.5cm by 11cm when closed
- Width is 1.5cm

# Card slots





- I made my card slots out of paper, and taped the paper to my wallet
- I repeated this process till I had enough slots

## Cash compartment





- I made the cash compartment out of another cutout of cardboard and paper
- The "joints" were made of folded paper

## Coin pouch





- I made the coin pouch by folding a piece of cardboard and gluing it to the other pieces
- I got the zip from an old piece of clothing and taped it to the piece of cardboard

#### Summary of making wallet

- I used the cardboard as my main material, and throughout the process I had to make changes to my wallet that were not planned for.
- I realized I had to make my wallet size bigger to better suit the card size, as my original wallet size would hold the cards too tight and make the process of getting them hard
- Paper was not one of the materials I anticipated I would use, but it has been a great help to the making of this wallet
- I used paper as a binder for my cash holder and my card holder
- A problem I didn't think of was the zipper as I was under the impression that they would be provided
- Fortunately, I managed to solve to problem by taking a zipper from a different source and taping it to the wallet
- The main way of combining everything together was through the use of double-sided tape, I have now developed a new sense of appreciation to it.
- It was a very challenging experience making this wallet prototype as I have never done something like this before.

- Task 1: take out cash
- User goal 2: test the coin pouch
- Task 2: put in coins in the coin pouch
- User goal 3: test the size of the wallet
- Task 3: take the wallet out from pocket

#### Summary

- 4/5 of the users said the cash compartment was sturdy and spacious
- 3/5 of the users said the coin pouvh was too thin
- 3/5 of the users said the wallet fit comfortably in their pockets
- 2/5 of the users said the wallet was too bulky
