Design concept & inspirations

We wanted to make a cat bed that aetheically pleasing and easy for seniors to move around in their homes without assistance. We realised that seniors with cats may have a hard time cleaning /moving their cat beds as they may be part of heavy cat towers. So making an easy to move cat bed, that doubles as a table, would help ease the burden of cleaning for seniors who lived alone.


We took inspirations from children's toys, specifically those that could be pulled from the front using string, which helped us think of a way to move the beds practically. The entire thing works as a table too, allowing the elderly to have more space to place their things, or a memorable place to keep their things. The cat house was inspired by the architecture of japanese cafes like the style of the roof.

Functionality & Relevance

The bed can be moved by either pushing it or pulling by the string in front, which allows for easy movement of it. The bed part of it is located at the most bottom part of the table, with enough space between the table and bed for the drawer, which adds more storage space. The design is multipurpose as it acts as a storage space and pet bed, saving up space in homes.

Our primary target audience are elderly who live alone with their pets, primarily cats. However, it can be for anyone with pets on the smaller side like people who wish to give homes to their community cats. It taps into the value of resilience in our \$G60 theme, as this allows our seniors to keep giving their pets a good quality of life despite their old age. It helps build a stronger community of pet lovers in Singapore as seniors will be able to care for their pets longer without compromising their health and safety.
