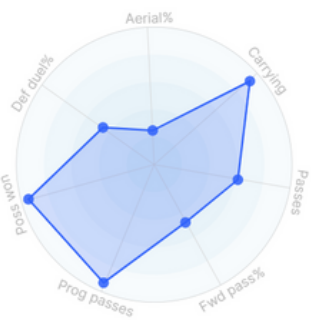

## Technical

- Comfortable using both feet
- Makes progressive passes in advanced areas and switches play with diagonal passes
- Marks well and gets in front to get 1<sup>st</sup> contact on the ball
- Scans regularly to ensure he has a sight of players at all times
- End product is good as delivers crosses from wide areas with good pace.
- Mistimed 2 tackles
- Is a threat from set play due to size, scored from a corner

## Tactical

- Is a CB who steps out from the back to compete for the ball using aggression and force, applying pressure fairly.
- Decision making is good as he does not commit to challenges, unless he has a realistic chance of winning the ball.
- A ball playing CB of a back 3 who moves into wide areas and likes to join the attack when necessary, showing good awareness and positional discipline.
- Anticipation is good as would drop deep when long balls were played covering space in behind

## Physical

- A tall CB who is strong both on and off the ball in terms of using his strength and aggression assertively.
- Recovery speed is good as returns into position well after going forward for set plays or attacks
- Has a good jump and competes well in the air

## Mental

- Is vocal throughout the game
- Is brave on the ball and going into challenges

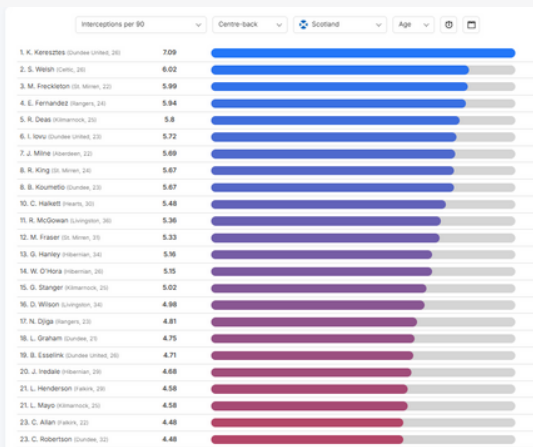

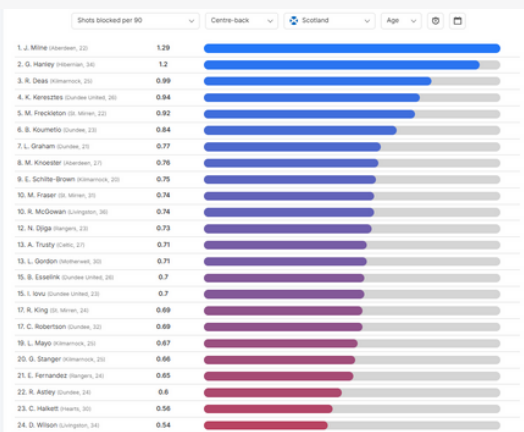
