## **Technical**

Technically, Morris had a high level of ball retention and tempo, favouring quick one and two-touch actions that kept Middlesbrough's tempo consistent throughout the game. He showed good scanning habits before receiving, which allowed him to play forward early rather than dwell on the ball under pressure. Most of his work was based around short, sharp connections to recycle possession, but he also demonstrated the ability to vary his distribution by stepping in with progressive passes from deeper areas when Sheffield United's structure opened up. His ball carrying was a strong part of his game, he uses his strength and balance to move past opponents rather than using his agility or acceleration. He was comfortable receiving under contact in central areas and rarely looked rushed even when pressed aggressively. In the final third his technical impact was a little more limited, he had 2 shots/attacking actions that lacked a real threat, suggesting his technical value lies more in control and progression than end product.

## **Tactical**

Tactically, Morris operated as a bit of a box-to-box midfielder, balancing his defensive responsibility with involvement in build-up and progression. His understanding with Hayden Hackney was a key feature of the game, with the pair rotating intelligently — one holding deeper while the other advanced — which allowed Middlesbrough to dominate central areas. He showed good positional discipline, consistently offering angles in possession and supporting both centre-backs and fullbacks during build-up. Out of possession, he positioned himself well to cut passing lanes and step into duels, contributing to Boro's ability to control the midfield zone. He had a limited presence in advanced attacking areas with his focus clearly on maintaining structure and control rather than arriving late into the box.

## **Mental**

Mentally, Morris played with a sense authority and real composure by slowing the game down and showing a willingness to take responsibility in the midfield. He competed aggressively without losing control, engaging in duels with confidence and maintaining focus after physical contests. His decision-making reflected maturity, opting for the right moment to slow things down and keep things simple or the right moment to take a risk and attempt to break lines from deeper position. He showed resilience in contact-heavy situations and responded well to pressure, rarely allowing Sheffield United to disrupt his rhythm. The overall impression was of a midfielder comfortable in the demands of a high-intensity Championship fixture, displaying consistency, concentration, and a strong competitive edge.

## **Physical**

Physically, Morris brings a robust and durable profile well suited to Championship football. He uses his upper-body strength effectively to ride contact, protect the ball, and compete in midfield duels, often emerging with possession in crowded areas. While he lacks top-end speed and can struggle to cover large distances quickly, his short bursts of acceleration are sufficient for pressing and recovering position. His stamina and energy levels stood out over the course of the match, allowing him to cover ground box-to-box and remain involved in defensive actions late into phases of play. He absorbs contact well without losing balance, which allows him to stay engaged in second-ball situations and repeated duels over the course of the game. His physical resilience shows in how consistently he can impose himself in central areas without a drop-off in intensity. This physical consistency highlights his reliability and enables him remain involved across the full 90 minutes.

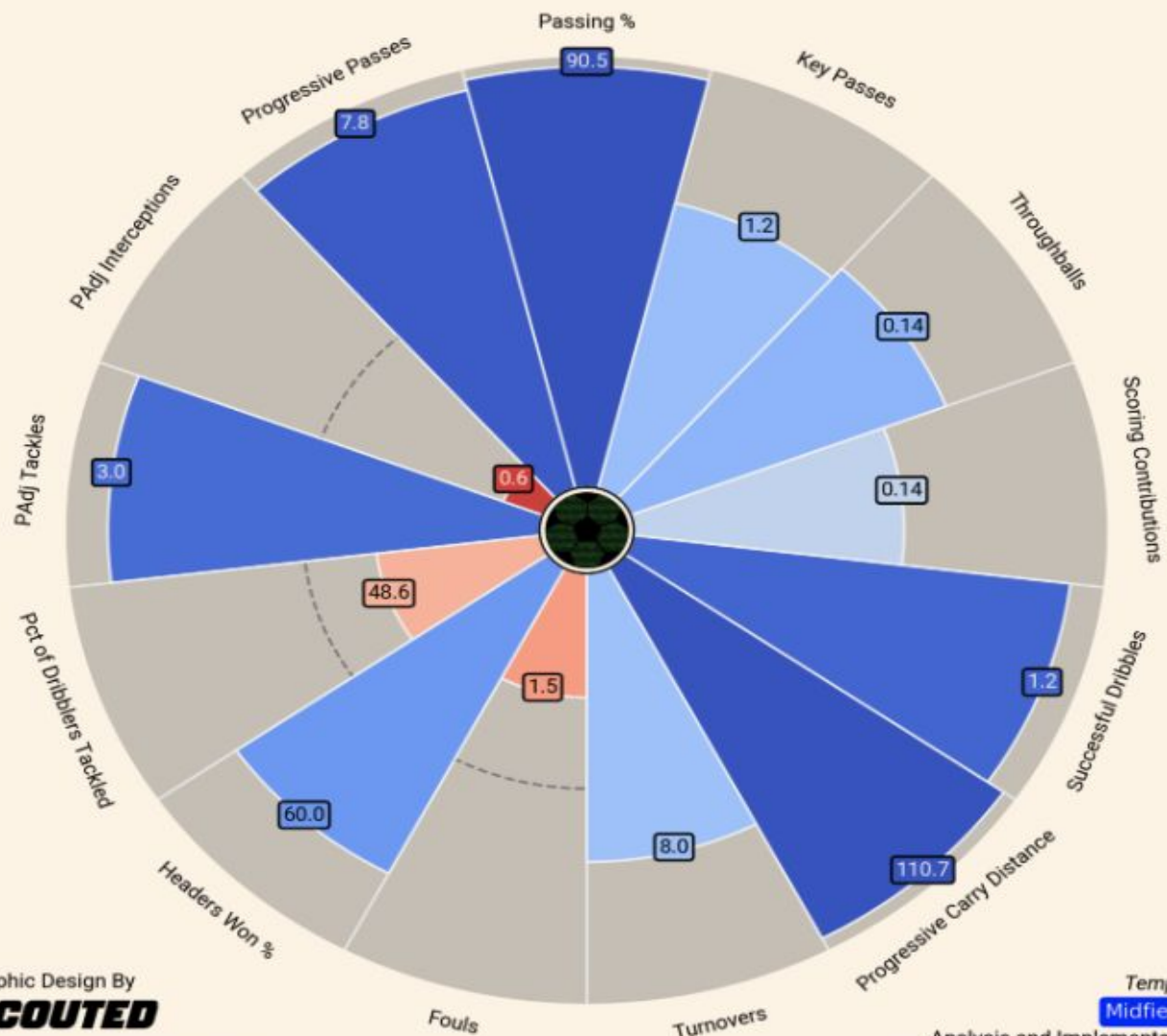
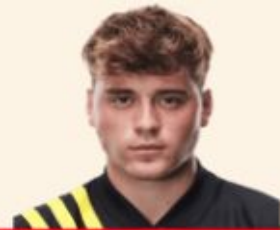
## **Conclusion**

Overall, Morris had a really strong and authoritative midfield performance, built around his physical robustness, tactical intelligence, and technical security when in possession. He played a key role in Middlesbrough's ability to dominate central areas, forming a really balanced partnership with Hayden Hackney that combined structure with fluidity. While his attacking output in the final third remains an area where further development could elevate his overall impact, his value in controlling tempo, winning duels, and sustaining intensity was clear. In this match, Morris looked like a top central midfielder capable of anchoring and driving a midfield unit at Championship level, particularly in games that demand physicality, discipline, and consistency.
