Amario Cozier-Duberry is an English winger currently contracted to Brighton & Hove Albion, where he joined after leaving Arsenal. A very highly regarded youth prospect from an early age, he made the decision to move clubs in search of a clearer senior pathway and exposure to first-team football. Since then, his development has followed a more transitional route, combining academy progression with senior loan experience.

Technical:

Technically, Cozier-Duberry is defined by his close control, quick feet, and comfort operating in tight spaces. He receives with positive intent, manipulates the ball with small touches, and uses body feints and changes of direction to destabilise defenders. Operating primarily off the right wing, he regularly looks to cut inside onto his left foot to create shooting opportunities from range, while also showing the ability to deliver clipped passes and crosses when space opens up. His right foot is functional and allows him to go outside when defenders overcommit, even though his natural inclination is to come inside.

Tactical:

Tactically, he plays as a direct wide attacker who is comfortable starting high and wide before drifting into central pockets when the game allows. His 1v1 ability draws additional defenders, which creates space for teammates and forces defensive adjustments on his side of the pitch. He shows an understanding of when to isolate his fullback and when to recycle possession, and he can operate on either flank, though his influence and goal threat are greater when attacking from the right. His defensive work rate is solid for a winger, and he shows willingness to recover and engage when possession is lost.

Mental:

Mentally, he plays with confidence and assertiveness, particularly in 1v1 situations where he backs his ability to beat his man. He shows a willingness to take responsibility in attacking phases, repeatedly demanding the ball and attempting to influence the game directly. There is still a learning curve in terms of decision selection and managing predictability, but the intent to be proactive and expressive is consistent. His response to a disrupted period earlier in his senior career suggests resilience and a desire to re-establish momentum through regular football.

Physical:

Physically, Cozier-Duberry has a compact build with a low centre of gravity that supports his dribbling style. While not tall, he carries good upper-body strength for his size, making him harder to dispossess than his frame might suggest. His acceleration over short distances is a key asset, allowing him to separate from defenders in tight areas, even though raw pace is not the main driver of his game. His agility and coordination underpin much of his effectiveness in duels and transitions.

Conclusion:

Cozier-Duberry profiles as a technically driven wide attacker whose game is built around ball mastery, agility, and confidence in his 1v1s. His ability to consistently attract multiple defenders speaks to the threat he poses in isolation, and his shooting ability when he cuts in onto his left is backed up by his end product. His move into regular senior football at League One level is an important as it allows him to build rhythm, physical robustness, and match influence unlike his previous season at the senior level.

Looking ahead, his development should be around continuing to be efficient in the final third and expanding his attacking variety so defenders cannot over-anticipate his preferred actions. Consistent minutes and continued confidence will determine how quickly he can re-enter the Championship conversation or compete for opportunities back at Brighton, where competition in wide areas is high. At this stage, Amario's talent is clear; the next step for him is to convert that talent into consistent senior-level impact over time.
