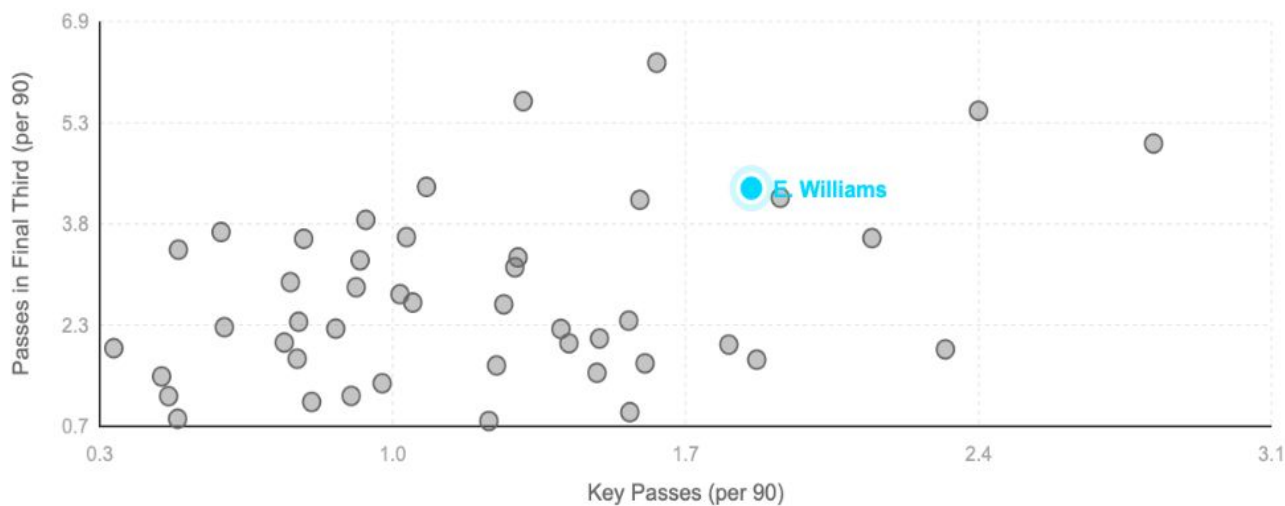

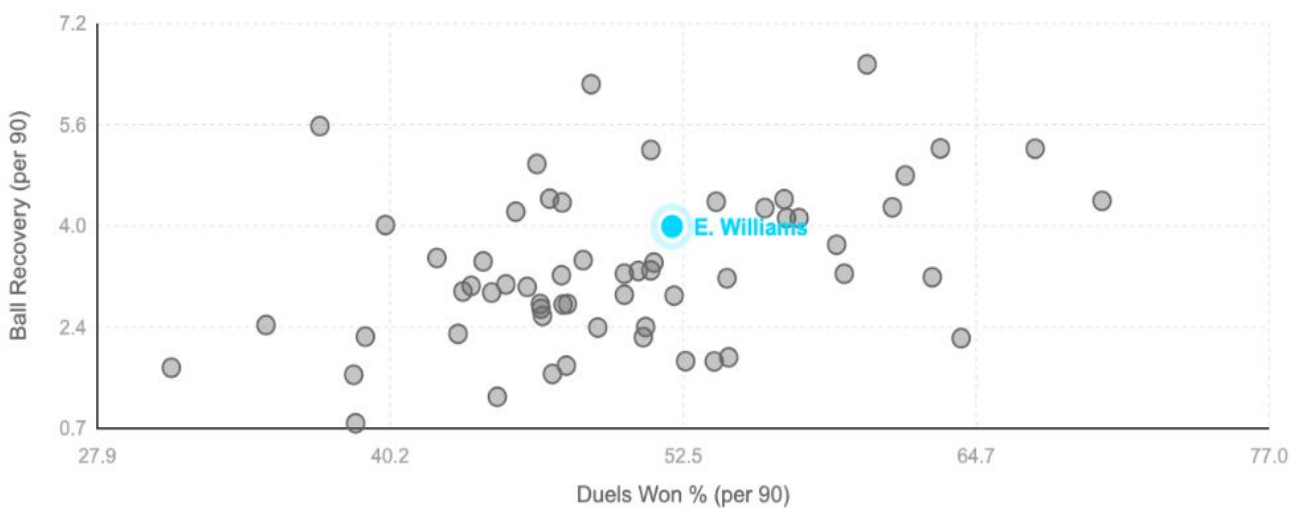

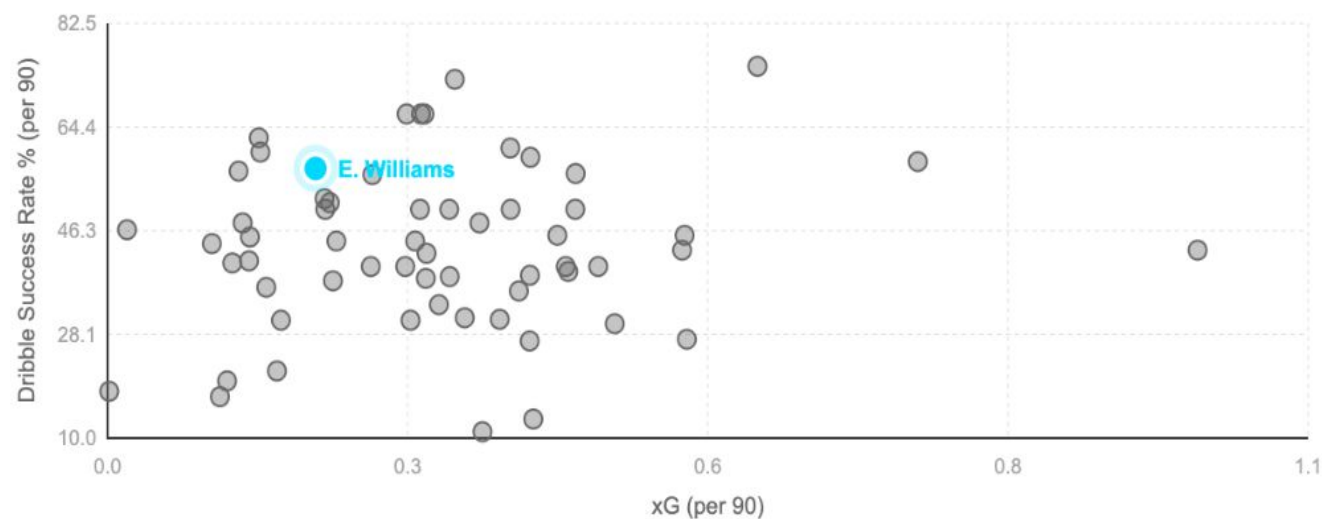
Key Passes vs Passes in Final Third



Duels Won % vs Ball Recovery



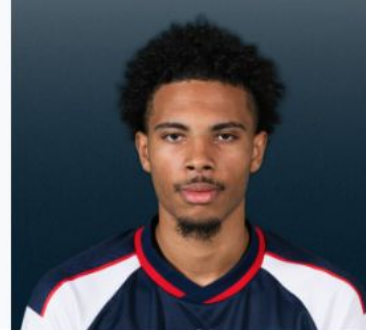
xG vs Dribble Success Rate %

Potential:

Ethan Williams' standout trait is his ball striking off both feet, which gives him genuine threat from a variety of angles and distances. That, combined with a natural eye for goal and composed finishing. His work rate in and out of possession also supports scalability, as he doesn't rely solely on attacking freedom to influence games and can function within more demanding tactical structures.

In the short term, his current level aligns well with League One or Scottish Premiership football, where he can refine his decision-making, physical robustness, and consistency against more experienced and stronger defenders. If his development continues positively, a step up into the Championship looks like it is on the cards for Williams, particularly for teams that value wide players who have a knack for finishing. At that level, his two-footed shooting and willingness to work defensively could make him a reliable squad player for a mid table Championship team.

A Premier League outcome feels a bit more conditional. He has a pretty high technical base and his mentality both in and out of possession is there, but reaching even a low-end Premier League level would depend on sharpening his off-ball movement, increasing consistency across seasons, and proving his output translates against higher-level opposition.

Overall, Williams projects as a player with a strong chance of becoming a high-end League One or solid Championship winger, with upside beyond that if development, opportunity, and context align.
