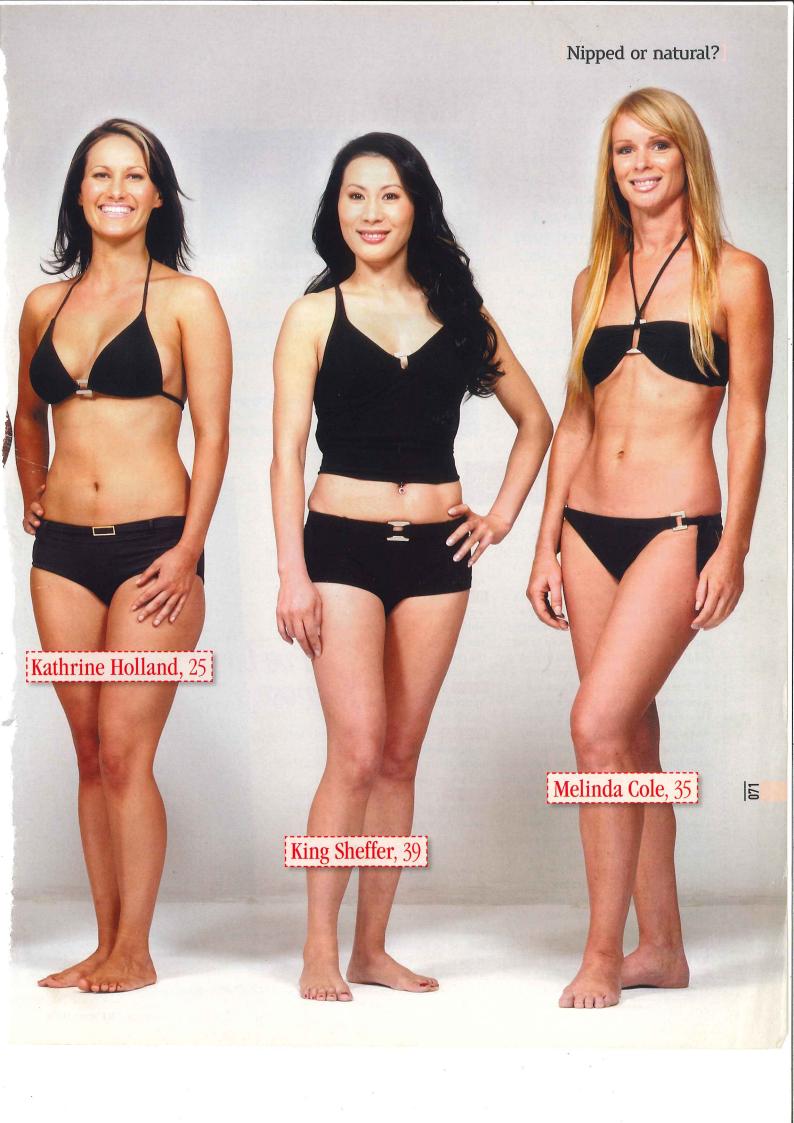

#### Kathrine says

'After being called "Gonzo" throughout school, at 16 I really wanted to have a nose job. But it wasn't until my twenties that I thought, "I hate this! I want to get rid of my nose". My fiancé was sick of hearing about it and said, "Just do it if it'll make you happy". So I took out a loan and did it. The op took a day: I went in at 8am and was out by 3pm. As far as pain goes, I was really lucky. I was given painkillers and pretty much sailed through it. The worst bit was only being able to breathe through my mouth for four days. It took about two months before the swelling went down and I could really see the shape and like it. I didn't realise it before but my nose was affecting my self-confidence. People began saying things like, "You've got nice cheekbones" or "nice eyes". I never thought I had nice eyes or cheekbones before; people must've just been looking at my nose the whole time.'

Jason: 'Boob job – she's got a great chest!

And a nose job – it doesn't suit her face.

Nic: She's really pretty. I think she's had a nose job as it looks angular and pointy.

## Natalie Humphries, 30

Natalie says

'My breasts were done four years ago; it was a spur-of-the-moment decision. I hated being flat-chested, but in my circle of friends boob jobs weren't common or talked about. Then a friend of mine had hers augmented; she looked more womanly. When you're flatchested you don't feel very feminine, so I thought, "If she can do it..." and bit the bullet. It wasn't painful, but I took painkillers every few hours. On the first day I was in tears because my boobs were so huge with all the swelling, but when they went down, I loved them! I'm more confident now and I feel better in a swimsuit. When I had a baby, I had problems breastfeeding. It was nothing to do with milk supply [implants should not affect your ability to breastfeed], but my baby found it hard to latch on. Strangely, my husband Jason prefers breasts small and natural (although clearly it hasn't put him off) and I've found a lot of men feel the same way.'

Jason: 'Perhaps Botox because her face looks like it's been pulled from the sides."

Nic: 'It looks like her face is quite pulled-back and lifted.'

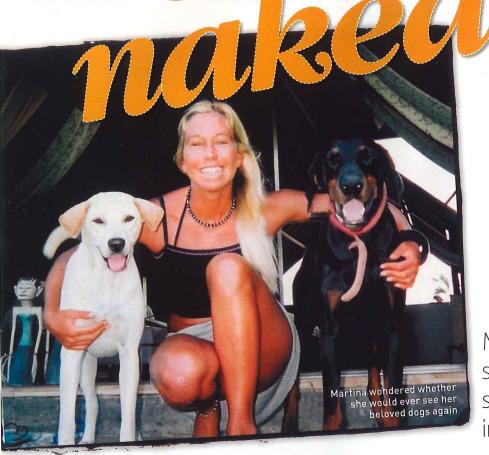
#### Rebecca's reaction

# TWAS LOST AT SEA...



"I was panicking in the water and couldn't stop thinking about sharks."

Martina Lorenti, 25, spent a terrifying night stranded alone in shark infested waters – naked!

love Bali – it's the perfect place to escape the winter, relax and surf. Last year I was there with my boyfriend, Bita, and three of our friends, Phillippe, Matias and Sebastian. We wanted to hire a boat and cruise around the Mentawai islands.

After searching all day, we finally secured a boat with four crew and set off. I could hardly contain my excitement – I was about to head off on my first journey into the open ocean! We cruised past all these tiny islands and I couldn't wait till we stopped for a swim.

But within two hours raindrops were pelting down and the sea turned really rough. I felt seasick and couldn't eat or drink anything.

We went to bed at 10pm, but just five minutes later I was sick everywhere. I staggered upstairs and hung over the rail of the boat. At midnight I crept back downstairs, took off my wet bikini, wrapped a sarong around my waist, put on Bita's T-shirt and lay next to him. By 2am I was close to finally falling asleep when we felt the boat lurch violently to one side – and stay there.

#### We started to sink

The crew were upstairs shouting hysterically at each other and then we heard screams for us to get out. As I scrambled up the stairs, water rushed into our cabin. We were told to stand on one side in an attempt to balance the boat.

But it was too late – we were sinking very fast. We quickly untied all the surfboards in their bags from the side of the boat so they fell into the ocean, then jumped on top of them. My sarong was ripped off in the effort,

leaving my bottom half naked, but at the time it was the last thing on my mind.

The crew huddled on top of the vessel's roof, which was just above the water, but we figured we'd be safer on our boards. I'd never been so scared in all my life. I was panicking in the water and couldn't stop thinking about sharks.

# We saw fins coming towards us

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Time passed slowly and we were too tired to speak, so we closed our eyes and floated in silence. It was so dark, quiet

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and scary. By 9am we were sick of it all – sick of no one coming to our rescue, sick of not knowing where we were, and sick from not eating or drinking for so long. We began to argue. Some of us wanted to paddle to a distant island, but Phillippe thought the rips surrounding it were too dangerous. The crew kept shouting from the roof that we would be rescued soon. But even as they said this, they were sinking further under.

Suddenly Phillippe turned
white, pointed and whimpered,
'Fins. I saw fins!' They'll eat us
alive, I thought. But luck was on
our side – they were dolphins!
But how long would it be before
sharks did come after us?

The crew started begging us to help them – they couldn't swim and were scared witless.

Phillippe wanted us to drag them behind us on our surf boards; I thought he was mad! Bita decided to help Phillippe and shouted for me to go ahead with Matias and Sebastian who were paddling towards the island. I started paddling to reach them, but in the ocean swell they were nowhere in sight. I looked back and Bita and Phillippe had disappeared, too. I couldn't believe it. I was on my own, in the middle of the ocean. I kept screaming, but no one could hear me. That's it, I thought. I'm dead.

# I focused on the island

For four hours I paddled. I could see an island in the distance and was trying to focus on it but I couldn't seem to get any closer to it. My arms grazed against the board and started to bleed. I tried not to think about what was below me or if sharks could smell my blood. Then a sudden mist appeared over the island and I lost the plot because I could no longer see where I was going. I became hysterical. But I tried to pull myself together and started paddling furiously once more, and just when I felt I could hardly go on anymore I saw the island again - so close but yet so far!

Eventually I reached the island – exhausted but relieved. I ran up the beach and lay down. Some locals found me half-naked and crying. They were so friendly, offering me fresh fish while I kept apologising for being naked.

They must've thought I was mad.

I saw a fishing boat coming towards the island. It had rescued everyone else and was coming for me. I was finally reunited with my friends. I couldn't believe that we had all survived and no one was hurt.

The experience has changed my life. I still get seasick, and whenever there's a storm I'm terrified to the point of tears. I'd love to travel back to the Mentawais, but there's no way I'll do it on a boat. **NW**

I SURVIVED this PLANE CRASH...

#### Just a normal day...

It was 5.30am on a bitterly cold New Jersey morning and I shivered as I waited to start work on a short haul flight from Teterboro Airport, NJ, to Chicago. Thick snow covered the ground; I was freezing and couldn't wait to get going.

This was my fifth month working for Platinum Jet Management as a cabin aide, which is basically an uncertified flight attendant. The company provides private charters to celebs and businesses and although they don't have to have a qualified flight attendant on board by law, I do have safety training.

I loaded my bag on board and prepared the plane for the two-hour trip. Our eight passengers – all businessmen – boarded and while they chatted I put their coats away, served juice and coffee, and made sure their seatbelts were fastened. Closing the door, I did a final check. We were ready for takeoff. John, the pilot, introduced himself as the co-pilot, Carlos, and I strapped ourselves into our seats in the cockpit. We sped up the runway and I sat there waiting for the plane's nose to rise into the air.

But we didn't take off. The plane was roaring along the runway at a takeoff speed of nearly 300km/h, yet we weren't lifting. What was happening? I froze. Something was very wrong. Suddenly John started screaming, 'Hold on! Hold on!' Carlos was crying, 'Oh my God, we're going to die!' I thrust my arms out in front, bracing myself in case we stopped. Hoping we would stop. I had a full view of absolutely everything in front of us as we careened out of control along the runway. John slammed on the brakes so hard he injured

'An hour later and

his foot, but his efforts didn't stop us hurtling towards Route 46, one of New Jersey's busiest six-lane highways. I honestly thought I was going to die.

All I could hear were the passengers' screams of sheer terror behind me as we hit the fence that separated the runway from the highway. I closed my eyes and waited for that huge explosion that would kill me. I was waiting to die. But by some miracle it didn't happen. It was 7:20am but amazingly a red light had held up most of the traffic. Although I didn't know it at the time, we did hit two cars - I didn't hear or a feel a thing - but luckily no one was killed. How that happened I will never know.

I opened my eyes for a split second and all I saw was a building. There was no way we could miss it. I buried my face in my hands and screamed for the passengers to brace themselves.

I felt us smash right through the thick concrete walls of a women's clothing warehouse. The jet shook and shuddered as it came to a stop. Finally the lights flickered out, and it hit me — I was alive. My second thought was to get all the businessmen off the plane as soon as possible, so I unbuckled my seatbelt and went back into the plane to reach the passengers.

All I could smell was gasoline – I realised I was covered from head to toe in jet fuel. I couldn't see anything and didn't know if everyone else had died. But it was like I was a robot doing what I'd been trained to do. Smoke drifted towards me from the back of the plane, and through the haze I could hear the petrified men yelling, 'We're gonna blow up,

#### Leap of faith

I yanked on the lever to open the front door but it wouldn't budge. One of the passengers literally threw himself against it until it finally opened. The men were screaming and crying and pleading to me for help. Amazingly, I swallowed my rising panic and told them calmly to jump out of the plane. One by one I helped the passengers out and onto the ground below but when I went to get the pilots, they were stuck. The cockpit had collapsed around them and all I could hear was John

screaming, 'Just go! Save yourself, the plane's gonna blow up! Run for your life!' It was a split decision and leaving those two men was the hardest moment of my life.

Of course there were no stairs at the exit, so I had to hurl myself from the plane. As I landed in the snow below, I
