In Hot Water...and Loving It

Waiting forever for your shower to heat up? Is it turning you into a hothead? Or have you (or a child) been surprised by scalding water from the tap? You'll be rewarded with evenly heated water, better energy efficiency and increased safety, plus a longer life for your water heater. Regular preventive maintenance is especially important for commercial plumbing systems, relied on by businesses, customers or tenants.

Some water heater issues can be fixed yourself; adjusting the thermostat or igniting the pilot light are two examples. GRINDING GARBAGE: Show your disposal a little love

You've just finished a lovely meal at home. You clear the dishes, scrape them in the sink, run the water, flip the garbage disposal switch, and...GRRR...RRRR...RRRR. It doesn't work.

That garbage disposal is a handy thing—when it's running well. Disposals clog a lot; they get misused; and cheaply made ones can't handle tough grinding jobs. Simple upkeep goes a long way toward peak performance, but disposals eventually wear out. (Normal life expectancy is eight to fifteen years.) Don't hesitate to call Cox Plumbing at (262) 542-6921. Follow these tips to help your garbage disposal last longer and run problem-free:

• **FOOD SCRAPS ONLY, a little bit at a time.** Common myths say keep eggshells, coffee grinds, or fruit and vegetable peels out of the garbage disposal, but all those are fine when fed through in small amounts. Slice up peels and crush eggshells into pieces before sending them down the drain. Run plenty of cold water to flush it all through the pipes. Beware of soft foods that swell with water, such as pasta, beans, potatoes or rice. Again, run them through in small amounts with plenty of water. (Better yet – don't waste food!)

Non-food items can damage the blades and motor of a garbage disposal, so don't let glass, metal, plastic or paper fall into it. Finally, never reach in with your hands! Grinding blades can severely hurt your fingers, leading to horror film fright scenes.

- **NO GREASE, OIL OR FAT, and run cold water.** NEVER put grease, oil or fat down the kitchen sink. While liquid when warm, these will cool, harden and collect on pipe walls, leading to blockages. Use cold water to flush food waste and run it for 15-30 seconds after using the disposal to clear any remaining debris.
- **KEEP IT CLEAN.** Use a little dish soap and cold water, or vinegar and baking soda to remove build-up and keep smelly odors away. Regularly run ice cubes through the disposal to clean it and sharpen the blades.

Proper use and care of your garbage disposal will extend its life and should keep it running. However, if it's not working and a simple push of the reset button doesn't do the trick, call the professionals at Cox Plumbing.
