This past year marked a defining moment for Big Dog Ranch Rescue and for the urgent animal welfare crisis gripping our nation. Across America, shelters are stretched far beyond capacity, burdened by an overwhelming influx of vulnerable dogs. Families struggle to provide care for their companions, facing spiraling veterinary costs, a dire shortage of affordable services, and insufficient education on responsible pet ownership.

Dogs are being surrendered or lost, not just due to financial strain, but also because of lack of shelter space, minimal spay and neuter resources, and the unchecked growth of backyard breeders and puppy mills. These challenges are compounded by legislative gaps that fail to hold irresponsible breeders accountable and do little to curb the cycle of unwanted litters.

In response, we launched America's Pet Crisis, a national campaign that catalyzed coordinated action and lasting change. With your support, this movement delivered real impact where it mattered most: for thousands of dogs at risk in their final moments.

This year alone, Big Dog Ranch Rescue saved more than 8,000 dogs. Thousands were rescued from high-kill shelters; others survived cruelty, abandonment, or years of neglect. Our team provided each dog, no matter how sick, injured, pregnant, or old with comprehensive medical care, rehabilitation, and an opportunity for a second chance at life.

We remain at the forefront of legislative reform. Governor Ron DeSantis's signing of Trooper's Law and Dexter's Law marked major victories in our fight to hold abusers accountable and strengthen animal protection. These milestones represent a public mandate for change and a critical step forward in ending neglect and abuse across our country. Our advocacy efforts continue as we push for regulation and oversight to stop bad actors in

backyard breeding and puppy mills. Every achievement reflects a united commitment to rewriting the future for vulnerable dogs. Together, we are making a difference one life, one law, and one rescue at a time.

At Big Dog Ranch Rescue, there are two things we will always stand behind, our dogs and our military heroes. To date, we placed more than 190 trained service dogs with veterans facing PTSD, trauma, and mobility challenges. Every pairing brought together a veteran and a rescue dog who have helped each other making a better life for both. In 2025, our commitment to the military community will grow with the opening of the Elaine & Ken Langone Patriot Pet Boarding Lodge, where deployed service members can board their dogs at no cost. By caring for the dogs of deployed military heroes, we honor those who serve this country and the loyal dogs who stand beside them. Everything we achieved this year was made possible by our donors, adopters, volunteers, our community, staff, and partners who show up, time and time again, to be part of this mission. When others said it was too much or too late, you helped us say yes. Together, we're not only saving lives, but we are also rewriting the future of rescue in this country.

And we are just getting started.

We will continue to push for affordable veterinary care, expand access to spay and neuter, and strengthen our outreach across state lines. The fight isn't over, but this year has proven that progress is not only possible, it's already happening.

Thank you for standing beside us and making this life-saving work possible. On behalf of every dog who found hope this year, you made the difference.

## 4 PILLARS

Our first pillar is **EDUCATION**, aiming to enlighten the public about the critical issues happening in our own communities. Many people remain unaware of the severe pet crisis unfolding across the nation—overcrowded shelters, rising owner surrenders, and a lack of affordable spay/neuter services have created a heartbreaking cycle of suffering. Families are forced to make impossible choices, often surrendering beloved pets due to economic hardship or housing challenges. By equipping shelter directors, volunteers, and community advocates with the knowledge to take action, we can empower them to fight for the well-being of these innocent animals, combat infectious diseases, and work toward ending unnecessary euthanasia.

Our third pillar is LEGISLATION, which is essential in addressing the root causes of the current pet crisis. Unregulated breeding, lack of spay/neuter access, and overcrowded shelters have led to millions of healthy, adoptable dogs being euthanized each year. This year has been a big year for animal welfare legislation, with new laws and policies strengthening protections for pets and holding negligent parties accountable. We are committed to advocating for laws and policies that prioritize animal welfare, regulate breeders, and support overwhelmed shelters. Strong legislation, combined with community action, ensures a future where no dog suffers needlessly, and compassion takes precedence over heartlessness. Our work is not done, and we will continue being the voice for the voiceless.

The second pillar of our strategy is STERILIZATION. By addressing the issue of unwanted litters and the subsequent homelessness of dogs, we can make a significant impact that will last for generations to come. We will venture into forgotten corners of rural and underserved communities, offering free sterilization services to those who cannot afford them and providing families with the tools to be part of the solution. Through reducing accidental breedings, we can stem the tide of suffering and death. To ensure this work reaches as many as possible, we will launch spay and neuter buses, traveling county by county across the nation and preventing countless dogs from ending up in shelters or on the streets.

Finally, COLLABORATION

will be our united front against the forces that seek to divide us. Every animal lover, rescue, and shelter will be brought together in a formidable alliance. Together, we will emerge victorious. United we stand, divided we fall - a mantra etched into the very fabric of our mission. With your support, we will rise above the challenges and navigate these treacherous waters with unwavering resolve. The Big Dog Ranch Rescue promises to give everything we've got, sparing no effort in the fight for our loyal companions. Our grand plan awaits, and we know that the strength of our collective effort will be nothing short of extraordinary. 

### **RESPONDING TO CRISIS**

When wildfires ravaged communities across **Los Angeles, California** in the beginning of this year, they left devastation in their wake — not only for people but for countless animals displaced, injured, or trapped. Local shelters quickly became overwhelmed, struggling to care for the surge of frightened dogs left homeless by the flames and smoke.

As first responders on the ground, we knew time was critical. Our dedicated bus driver and hero, Robert, did what few others could. Without hesitation, he jumped behind the wheel of our rescue bus and drove it all the way from Florida to California, determined to save as many dogs as possible. This wasn't his first mission—and it won't be his last. Robert is always ready to go, no matter the distance or difficulty. His willingness to hit the road at a moment's notice, often for days at a time, is nothing short of extraordinary.

Over several intense days, Robert and the rescue team coordinated with local shelters and animal control, taking in 48 dogs from the wildfire zones. These dogs faced not only the trauma of displacement but often injuries, burns, and fear that lingered long after the fires were extinguished. For many, this was their first chance at safety and kindness.



While heading back from California, we learned of dogs trapped in freezing conditions in **Cleveland Texas**, facing lifethreatening temperatures with no shelter or food. Knowing we couldn't leave them behind, we immediately diverted our route and rushed to their aid. We were able to rescue these pups just in time, bringing them to safety.







Every day, we confront the darkest sides of animal cruelty—dogs beaten, starved, burned, chained, discarded like trash. At Big Dog Ranch Rescue, we run toward these tragedies, not away from them. We respond to urgent cruelty cases, step in where abuse has stolen trust, and fight for the ones too broken to fight for themselves. We're not just rescuers—we're protectors, educators, and advocates. We work to heal wounds. both visible and invisible, and to prevent the next case of suffering through community education and outreach.

These dogs have survived the worst now, they deserve the best.

### **BIBI WAS ONE OF THOSE CASES.**

She was found barely clinging to life—too weak to lift her head, her tiny body emaciated and broken. A compassionate bystander saw her motionless and called for help. We responded and the moment we saw the extent of her injuries, we knew we had to act quickly.

Bibi had suffered unimaginable cruelty. Her ribs were fractured, her spine damaged, and her bruised skin told the story of prolonged, deliberate harm. A BB pellet was discovered beneath her skin—a chilling sign of what she had endured.

Our medical team worked tirelessly to stabilize her—administering fluids, slowly reintroducing food, and gently encouraging her to stand. With each passing day, Bibi fought harder. Her will to live shone through.

Today, Bibi is not just surviving—she is thriving. Safe in a loving home, she is learning to trust again and discovering all the simple joys she was once denied. Now at a much healthier weight and full of life, Bibi loves chasing tennis balls at the beach, splashing in the waves, and soaking up the sunshine. With her energy restored, every day is a new adventure - she's even started making new friends, including a few curious horses she met along the way!

Bibi's recovery is a powerful reminder of what love, compassion, and care can do. From a broken past to a bright future, Bibi is living proof that miracles happen when second chances are given.



PIRATA, NANO, AND CHISPA—two Chihuahuas and a Rat Terrier, were victims of one of the most heartbreaking abuse cases we encountered this year. These three tiny dogs had already suffered from longterm neglect when they were subjected to a horrifying act of cruelty: tied behind a pickup truck and dragged down the road.

A witness captured the horrific act on video, leading to the arrest of the man responsible. But the damage had already been done.

We responded immediately to the call from Animal Care and Control and brought them to safety at the ranch, where they received urgent medical care and the gentle attention they'd never known before. When they arrived, they were in critical condition and in shock. Their skin was raw and inflamed, their bodies crawling with fleas. They all had torn paw pads and nails worn down to the skin—signs of unbearable trauma. They were trembling with fear and

Now, each of them is in a better place. Chispa, the Rat Terrier, has been adopted into a loving home where she's settling in

and finally getting the care she deserves. Pirata and Nano, the two bonded Chihuahuas, are thriving together in a foster home—safe, warm, and surrounded by love. For once in their tiny lives, they know what comfort feels like.

Their recovery is still ongoing, but they're finally safe, and that's what matters most.







Liberty, a 7-year-old Cane Corso Mastiff, arrived with visible signs of long-term neglect—burn scars, arthritis, hip dysplasia, and a torn ACL. Her body showed the wear of multiple litters and years of inadequate care. Walking was painful, and she needed time and support to begin healing.



Despite her condition, Liberty remained gentle and strong. With medical care and patience, she slowly started to improve.

Then came her turning point: a family saw her potential and gave her a second chance. Since her adoption, Liberty's life has transformed. She now enjoys outings to festivals and restaurants, and welcomes attention from neighborhood children. She's no longer just recovering—she's truly thriving.

When Liberty first came to the ranch, she was heartbroken. She would sit silently in her room, staring at the walls, and cry whenever someone walked past—an emotional, aching cry that spoke of years of neglect and a longing to be loved.

But Liberty never gave up hope. With time, she met her forever family who saw her not for her scars, but for her strength. Since her adoption, Liberty's world has opened up. She now spends her weekends going to music festivals and enjoying peaceful afternoons with horses.

She's not just surviving—she's finally living the life she's always deserved. We are endlessly grateful to her adopter for seeing the beauty in Liberty's soul and giving her the second chance she had been longing for.


Daisy came to us under heartbreaking circumstances. A brave bystander stepped in after witnessing three teenagers attempting to hang this sweet girl from a tree with a rope around her neck. We'll never truly know what Daisy endured before that moment, but when we got the call, we didn't hesitate.

For two long years, Daisy remained at the ranch. She was terrified of everyone, recoiled at human touch, and shut down when anyone tried to show her love. Her trauma ran deep, and we gave her the time and space she needed to begin healing.

A kind and patient family in Illinois opened their hearts and their home to Daisy. She spends her days chasing squirrels and showing off her strength and courage by leaping up to the top of her 5-foot fence.

Daisy is finally learning what it means to just be a dog, to feel safe, to play, and to love.







Velcro came to us with deep physical and emotional scars. Severe burns covered his face and nose, and the damage took the sight from one of his eyes. His injuries told a story of pain and trauma—but Velcro never let that define him. The moment someone reached out with a gentle touch, he leaned right in. It was like he'd been waiting for kindness all along. That's how he got his name—Velcro. Once he connects with you, he sticks close, offering quiet comfort and a steady presence that feels like home.

From the moment he received a gentle touch, his response was immediate: trust. He leaned into kindness and never looked back. That unshakable bond he forms with people is how he got his name—Velcro. Once he connects with someone, he stays close, offering quiet loyalty and comfort.

Velcro is still healing, and some of his scars will always be there. But they don't define him. What really makes him special is his quiet strength, his forgiving heart, and the way he still chooses love—every single time.





Buddy came to us with a chemical burn that left a deep scar down his back, likely the result of past abuse. Despite his pain, he remained gentle, calm, and open to trust.

Though Buddy waited over a year at Big Dog Ranch Rescue, his journey led

him to the family he was always meant to have. Today, he's cherished and safe at last.



Caterpillar came to us as a stray from Miami-Dade, underweight and struggling with sensitive skin and medical issues. He was later diagnosed with bladder cancer, which requires ongoing care.

Like his name suggests, Caterpillar has undergone a beautiful transformation. With care and compassion, he's shown that even the most fragile beginnings can lead to a life full of love, joy, and second chances.







### Between 2020 and 2024,

the euthanasia rate for dogs in Florida's shelters surged by a staggering 83% - a tragic statistic that translates to hundreds of dogs euthanized every single day. These aren't just numbers; each represents a life lost, a loving companion with a wagging tail and hopeful heart no different from the cherished pets in our homes. Despite their capacity for love and loyalty, the system continues to fail these innocent animals.



## THE CRISIS IS ESCALATING RAPIDLY.

In just three years, Florida shelters took in 15,500 more dogs in 2023 than they did in 2020, with 2024 estimates showing 140,000 dogs entering shelters statewide. The burden on municipal shelters to house, care for, and rehome these animals has become overwhelming, costing Florida taxpayers tens of millions of dollars annually.

While Big Dog Ranch Rescue has always excelled at large-scale rescues from unethical breeders, we recognized the urgent need to address the problem at its source. That's why we took decisive action by drafting and introducing critical legislation during the 2024 Florida Legislative session. Our proposed bill would mandate licensing and inspection by the Florida Department of Agriculture for all commercial dog sellers, creating a framework for regulated puppy sales, enhanced consumer protections, and greater promotion of shelter adoption - ultimately helping to Make America's Dogs Safe Again.













Our efforts achieved a major milestone when Governor Ron DeSantis selected Big Dog Ranch Rescue as the venue to sign two groundbreaking anti-cruelty bills into law at the end

TROOPER'S LAW honors Trooper, a devoted dog who was abandoned and left chained to a post during a hurricane evacuation. Rescuers discovered him barely clinging to life after days without food, water, or shelter. His story became a rallying cry for change. Trooper's Law now makes it a felony to abandon dogs during declared emergencies, holding owners accountable and ensuring pets are never again left behind in life-threatening conditions.

DEXTER'S LAW is named after a dog who was found decapitated just days after being adopted. This horrific act shocked communities across Florida and exposed the urgent need for stronger protections. Dexter's Law establishes tougher penalties for aggravated animal cruelty and creates Florida's first statewide **animal abuser registry**, ensuring those convicted of such acts cannot hide their crimes and acquire more pets to harm. This law is a vital step toward justice for Dexter and protection for countless other dogs.

These victories demonstrate real progress, but our work is far from finished.

The underlying causes of this crisis - including irresponsible breeding practices, limited access to spay/neuter services, and economic challenges - require comprehensive, systemic solutions. That's why Big Dog Ranch Rescue remains committed to working with legislators and advocates to pass additional protective legislation, because every dog deserves safety, compassion, and a loving home.

## MEDICAL MIRACLES



Some of the dogs that come to us are in such critical condition that it's hard to imagine them surviving. But with the help of our dedicated veterinary team, we perform medical miracles every day. From repairing broken bones and healing deep wounds to treating life-threatening illnesses, our specialized care turns tragedy into triumph. We have saved dogs with conditions others deemed hopeless, and time after time, they have gone on to lead full and joyful lives. These medical miracles are a cornerstone of what we do, and they are only made possible through the support of our community.



At Big Dog Ranch Rescue, we believe every dog deserves the chance to heal, to be loved, and to live the life they were meant for. Sadly, too many arrive at our doors with devastating injuries or critical illnesses that would otherwise leave them with no hope. Without immediate medical intervention, their stories would end far too soon.

That's why we created our Miracle Fund- to give dogs in desperate need of life-saving care a second chance. From emergency surgeries to vital treatments, this fund ensures that no dog is left behind simply because of the cost of the care.

Despite the pain, Esmerelda's gentle spirit never faded. Her fight to live was strong and because of that fight, and the care she received, her story has a beautiful ending.

Today, Esmerelda is not only healed... she is happy, thriving, and loved in her forever home. Her journey from near death to a joyful new life is a shining example to the miracles your support makes possible.









euthanized—his life hanging by a thread at Palm Beach County Animal Care and Control—when Big Dog Ranch Rescue's founder, Lauree Simmons herself, made a life-changing rescue trip that changed everything. We stepped in to save this little guy and rushed him to safety. Paralyzed in his back legs and struggling to breathe, he was in critical condition. At Big Dog Ranch, we stabilized him and kept him on oxygen while coordinating with surgeons to determine the best course of action.

X-rays revealed the extent of his injuries: his stomach and intestines had shifted into his chest cavity, putting dangerous pressure on his lungs, and both his spine and pelvis were fractured. His first surgery at MedVet Jupiter addressed the internal trauma, followed by spinal surgery at Southeast Veterinary Neurology in Miami with Dr. Wong.


After five days of intensive care, Batty returned to Big Dog Ranch for continued rehabilitation, support, and love from our staff and volunteers. His case was one of the most complex and costly we've seen, totaling nearly \$21,000.

With less than a 1% chance of regaining mobility, Batty began physical therapy and was fitted for a wheelchair to help him move and rebuild strength. For weeks, he rolled through our halls with determination—but then, something remarkable happened.

Batty took his first steps without his wheelchair.

Batty's recovery is a powerful reminder of what's possible with urgent rescue, expert care, and the support of a community that believes every dog deserves a second chance.





Brought to safety by Big Dog Ranch Rescue, Rocky arrived at our Florida campus with extensive injuries—severe fractures in both hind legs, trauma to his neck, and damage to his pelvis. He spent his first month in our on-site medical facility under round-the-clock care as our veterinary team worked to stabilize his condition and prepare him for the life-changing surgeries he urgently needed.

In January, Rocky underwent the first of two orthopedic surgeries to repair his left hind leg. Thanks to the skill of our medical staff and the support of our compassionate donors, the procedure was a success. Since then, Rocky has been on a steady path of healing—growing stronger by the day.

His journey isn't over yet. A second surgery on his right hind leg is planned, bringing him one step closer to the active, pain-free life every dog deserves. And while much of his time at the Ranch has been spent in recovery, Rocky hasn't let that stop him from embracing the simple joys of puppyhood. He's discovered a love for swimming, playing, and snuggling up with his favorite caregivers.

Megan's arrival at Big Dog Ranch Rescue was both unexpected and heartbreaking. She had been found lying on the side of the road in Broward County—struck by a car and clinging to life. With no owner to be found and no financial support available, an emergency veterinary clinic rushed her to us as her last hope.

Megan's injuries were devastating: her back foot was degloved, her legs torn, her abdomen severely damaged, and her body covered in road rash. She was in shock, in pain, and unable to eat. As a stray, she faced not only overwhelming medical challenges but also the grim possibility of euthanasia due to the cost and complexity of her care.

But at Big Dog Ranch Rescue, we believe every life is worth fighting for. Without hesitation, we made the decision to save her—no matter what it took.

Shortly after intake, our medical team discovered another serious complication: a life-threatening intestinal blockage.

Megan underwent
emergency gastrotomy
surgery to remove the
obstruction, and against the
odds, she pulled through. Her next battle was
to try and save her badly damaged foot.

Due to the severity of her wounds and the lack of remaining skin, Megan was referred to a specialty clinic for a series of hyperbaric oxygen treatments to promote healing. This was followed by numerous orthopedic evaluations and surgical attempts to salvage the limb. Despite every effort—and Megan's unwavering will to survive—the damage was simply too great. Ultimately, her leg had to be amputated.

Despite it all, Megan showed incredible resilience. She underwent multiple treatments and surgeries and began to heal, little by little. Today, Megan is still on the road to recovery, but she's made remarkable progress—a reminder of the strength found in even the most fragile lives.

## THE COST TO SAVE A DOG

At Big Dog Ranch Rescue, we take in the dogs that others won't—the ones with broken legs, heartworm disease, or Parvo—those who are often overlooked due to the high cost of their care. Through our Safety Net Program, we also support families in need, providing lifesaving medical services, including emergency care, for dogs whose owners can't afford treatment. Because every life is worth saving, and every dog deserves a second chance.







## NOLA'S PROSTHETIC JOURNEY WITH ORTHOPAWS

## orthopaws STRENGTH IN EVERY STEP

Rescued from Clewiston, Florida, Nola endured a life of unimaginable cruelty and neglect. For years, she was chained in a dirtridden yard surrounded by rusted car parts and pools of oil. Emaciated, infected with mites, and missing a leg due to a botched amputation, she clung to life with nothing but her will to survive.

Deep scars circle her neck—painful reminders of the chain that imprisoned her. Her ears were raw and inflamed, her skin hung from her bones, and she bore the physical toll of birthing multiple litters. She had no teeth left, likely worn down from years of gnawing at her chains in desperate attempts to free herself.

Though her exact age is unknown, Nola is a senior dog. And what makes her story especially heartbreaking is that she never knew kindness, safety, or love until now.

A concerned neighbor—heartbroken by the horrific conditions she was living in—removed her from the property. Unable to provide the level of care she needed, he called Big Dog Ranch Rescue.

Our medical team immediately stepped in. Nola was battling severe heartworm, Lyme disease, a weakened heart, and extreme malnutrition. It took months of intensive care just to stabilize her enough for spay surgery. But slowly, she began to heal. And for the first time in her life, she was safe.

Nola is the embodiment of why we do what we do at Big Dog Ranch Rescue. Against all odds, she chose to fight—and because of that fight, she now has a future.

We were honored to partner with OrthoPaws, a team that specializes in prosthetics,





orthotics, and mobility aids for pets. Nola's case was especially challenging due to the way her limb had been amputated—but OrthoPaws had the expertise and heart to take it on.

After a couple of visits to the Ranch to measure, assess, and ensure the perfect fit, the moment we'd all been waiting for finally arrived: Nola's custom prosthetic leg was ready. The device—now officially named "THE NOLA"—was designed just for her and will help other dogs.

"THE NOLA" will now serve as a model to help other dogs with similar amputations regain their mobility and independence.

For the first time in a long time, Nola stood tall on all fours. She didn't just walk—she stepped forward into the life she was always meant to have.



## Thankfully, we were able to help just in time.

We brought her to safety just in time and gave her a quiet, comfortable space in our Puppy Cabins to rest and prepare for birth. Surrounded by warmth, compassion, and expert care, Moo Cow was finally able to let her guard down. Here, she didn't have to face motherhood alone.

In the early hours of May 8th, Mama Moo Cow underwent an emergency C-section. Our veterinary team acted quickly, and nine of her 13 puppies survived. Today, they're all thriving in their forever homes.

Mama Moo Cow's journey was a tough one but it reminds us why our mission matters. We are so grateful she was able to deliver her puppies safely and in peace.









## ALABAMA A Vision of Hope

3 years ago, Big Dog Ranch Rescue took a bold leap forward—in the fight against suffering and abandoned dogs in rural Alabama. Today, that vision is a reality. Our Alabama ranch is bursting with successful stories of hope where there was once none. Thousands of lives saved and an ever-growing and strengthening bond with the community we serve.

Our mission fuels a movement. From pulling dogs from overcrowded shelters, providing pet food to struggling community members and rescues to extending affordable veterinary services, every step we take is shaping a future where fewer dogs suffer, more families adopt, and the entire community thrives.

This past year, our Alabama campus has redefined what's possible in rescue operations. During a time that everyone has felt the pressures of economic uncertainties, we have been able to offer a lifeline of relief to struggling community members.

Affordable Veterinary Care: A Lifeline for Pets and Families In an area where veterinary care is scarce and costly, our low-cost clinic has been a game-changer. Local families now have access to affordable vaccines, spay/neuter procedures, and essential wellness checks—services that reduce dangerous disease outbreaks like parvovirus while preventing countless litters of homeless puppies. Each treatment not only saves lives but also empowers responsible pet ownership across our community.

## RESCUE, REHABILITATION, RELOCATION: A Second Chance at Life

Alabama faces some of the highest euthanasia rates in the nation. We refused to let statistics define these dogs' futures. Through our expanded intake and transport program, dogs from overcrowded municipal shelters are welcomed, medically treated, and behaviorally assessed. Many are then transported to regions with higher adoption demand, giving them a real chance at the life every dog deserves. What once were desperate final days in crowded kennels have now become fresh beginnings filled with hope.

### COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT: Building Bonds, Creating Change

The ranch has become more than a shelter—it's a thriving hub of compassion and collaboration. Volunteers are stepping up, lending their hands to comfort dogs, maintain facilities, and power adoption events. Local partnerships with Universities, businesses, and community groups are deepening awareness and resources for animal welfare.

Beyond saving lives, our growth has helped fuel economic opportunity in Shorter, creating jobs, supporting businesses, and strengthening community pride.

### **CHALLENGES THAT DRIVE US**

While our progress is extraordinary, the needs are still overwhelming. We face shortages in



PBSO also gave kids an exciting inside look at law enforcement technology, including a demonstration of the robotic dogs used in the field.


The day was a great hands-on, empowering lesson for the kids.





MUFFIN arrived from Miami-Dade with a shattered front leg and a silent story of suffering. His injury couldn't be repaired, and the only option was to remove the damaged leg. As if that weren't enough, he was also heartworm positive—facing two major battles before he could even begin to heal.

Recovery was slow and full of challenges. Muffin had to learn how to walk—and live—on three legs while also undergoing heartworm treatment. But through every hurdle, he remained gentle, patient, and hopeful.

Nearly two years passed. Muffin watched as other dogs came and went, each one finding a forever family while he waited quietly in his kennel. Despite it all, he never gave up hope.

### Then one day, everything changed.

An incredible family saw beyond his past and gave Muffin the chance he had been waiting for. Today, he's living his very best life—wearing his sunglasses, going on adventures, and soaking up every moment of freedom and love. His new family says he's the perfect addition to their home.

**LUCIELLE** came to us after her owner passed away, left outside away from her puppies. A neighbor finally noticed her after some time, and she was brought to the shelter scared and overwhelmed. She had scars and open wounds from fights with other dogs, and on top of that, she was diagnosed with heartworms—a serious illness that needed treatment.

Her story could have ended there, but thankfully, a wonderful family up north saw her and gave her a new chance. Now, she's doing great. Sunbathing is her favorite activity and has found a love for playing with toys. Her scars are healing, both on the outside and inside.

She's a reminder that with a little love and care, even the roughest starts can lead to something good.

Last year, we shared Lychee's incredible journey. Surrendered to us after becoming paralyzed, she spent months at the ranch being overlooked simply because of her disabilities. Then one day, everything changed—Geri saw past Lychee's challenges during a tour and gave her the loving home she deserved.

But Lychee's story was only the beginning. A few months later, we received a heartbreaking call from our past adopters: Toby, their beloved dog, had suffered an accident that left him paralyzed, and his family could no longer provide the care he needed. When we saw how much Toby resembled Lychee and how similar their stories were, one thought came to mind—we knew exactly who to call.

Geri didn't hesitate. Just days later, Toby joined her family, and Lychee suddenly had a best friend who truly understood her world. Watching them side by side in their wheelchairs was nothing short of miraculous.

That same month, Batty, a little Chihuahua (whose full journey you can read on page 19), who had once relied on a wheelchair but had regained partial use of his legs through months of healing and water therapy, was finally ready for adoption. Once again, Geri opened her heart, completing a trio of little dogs who defy the limits of their disabilities.

Today, Lychee, Toby, and Batty live happily together, each one thriving because someone refused to see their disabilities as limitations. We are endlessly grateful to adopters like Geri, whose extraordinary commitment gives special-needs dogs a second chance at life.







### THE IMPACT AHEAD

As we move into the new year, we are intensifying our efforts to establish mandatory statewide inspections and licensing for all dog breeders during the 2026 legislative session. This critical initiative represents a major step forward in our fight against unethical breeding practices that fuel shelter overcrowding. We are currently collaborating with the Florida Department of Agriculture, Governor DeSantis' office, and our legislative partners to develop comprehensive legislation that will implement meaningful, enforceable standards across the breeding industry.

The proposed bill will create a framework for responsible breeding by defining clear minimum care requirements, instituting a formal licensing system with regular inspections, and ensuring proper oversight of commercial breeding operations. These measures will not only improve conditions for breeding dogs but also protect consumers and reduce the flood of unwanted dogs entering our shelter system.

Complementing our legislative work, our partnership with the University of Florida continues to provide vital datadriven insights into Florida's shelter crisis. Through detailed tracking and analysis of shelter intake and outcome statistics across the state, we are able to identify emerging trends, target the most at-risk communities, and measure the effectiveness of our interventions. This approach allows us to focus our resources where they can make the greatest difference and develop solutions to this complex problem.

Together, these parallel efforts – transforming breeding regulations through legislation while implementing data-informed shelter strategies – form a powerful, multi-pronged approach to creating lasting change in Florida. We are committed to addressing both the supply and demand sides of this crisis, working to prevent unnecessary breeding while improving outcomes for dogs already in the system.

The path forward requires persistence, collaboration, and sustained effort – but every step brings us closer to a state where no dog suffers due to irresponsible breeding or shelter overcrowding.

## FIGHTING FOR THE VOICELESS

As we look ahead, our mission expands beyond rescue and rehabilitation—we're targeting the root causes of suffering. The year to come will be defined by bold action, tireless advocacy, and systemic change. With every partnership we forge and every policy we pursue, we are standing up for the voiceless and working toward a future where irresponsible breeding no longer fuels shelter overcrowding. This isn't just about saving dogs today, it's about building a future where fewer dogs need saving at all.
