Drake's 'logistically impossible' Memphis concert canceled

Fans hoping to see Drake hit the FedExForum this weekend are in for a disappointment, as the Grammy-winning rapper's Memphis stop has been canceled.

Drake was scheduled to perform on Sunday, Aug. 6, at the FedExForum as part of his "Drake: It's All A Blur Tour."

FedExForum said the following statement was provided by the tour team: "Due to the magnitude of the production of the Drake concert, it is logistically impossible to bring the show as designed to the FedExForum on August 6th. Unfortunately, the show is cancelled. Refunds will be issued at point of purchase."

Drake gets key to Shelby County

For those who've already purchased tickets, Ticketmaster stated on its <u>website</u> that no action needs to be taken to receive a refund: "It will be processed to the original method of payment used at time of purchase, once funds are received from the Event Organizer, which is usually completed within 30 days."

The "Spin Bout U" rapper teamed up with 21 Savage following their joint 2022 album "Her Loss" to tour North America, including stops in Atlanta, Los Angeles, New York and Montreal.

Drake's Memphis concert was <u>rescheduled</u> for Aug. 6 from its original date of Thursday, June 29, leaving some fans disgruntled.

Drake concert rescheduled

On Monday, June 26, the Toronto native was honored with a <u>key to Shelby County</u> by Shelby County Commissioner Mickell Lowery during a trip to the Bluff City.

"Drake, we always say Memphis music touches the world,"

Lowery, who represents District 8, said to Drake at the time. "And like I told you, you got a lot of Memphis blood in you, and you're definitely touching the world, "And so, we know you got Grammys, all these plaques, and all these awards, many more to come, probably Oscars, whatever. But not everybody has a key to the county, Shelby County."
