



SLEEVE IT TO ME!

We've got a trick up our sleeves like you wouldn't believe – it's Tricia Fairburn's hoodie hack



YOU WILL NEED

- King Cole Merino Blend 4ply (100% wool, 50g/180m)
4 balls of Rum (3294)
- A 3.5mm (US E/4) hook
- A 4mm (US G/6) hook
- A hoodie
- A basic sewing kit

TENSION

20 sts and 13 rows measure
10x10cm (4x4in) over sleeve pattern
using a 4mm hook, or size needed
to obtain correct tension

MEASUREMENTS

Can be adapted to fit any size
hoodie

ABBREVIATIONS

Hoodies and sweatshirts are your go-to in mild weather. 4ply yarn gives you a lovely drape, while Merino fibres keep you warm.

NOTES

Sleeves are worked in rounds from the armholes of a hoodie. Before you begin, you will need to prepare your hoodie to be embellished.

Pattern includes an optional Pocket Trim which can be worked along the edge of any style pocket.

HOODIE SLEEVES

PREPARE HOODIE

Remove the sleeves from your hoodie, just below the armhole seam. Using Rum, back stitch evenly around the armhole openings. Each backstitch should measure approx 1cm wide and you need to work a multiple of 3 sts around.

If there is a pocket edge, work a line of back stitch across the opening in the same way; you don't need to work in a multiple of 3 here.

SLEEVES (MAKE 2)

Using 3.5mm hook, join yarn in backstitch at underarm.

Round 1 (RS) Ch1 (counts as a dc throughout), dc in same st, 2dc in each st around, ss to top of beg ch-1, turn. [multiple of 3 sts]

Change to a 4mm hook.

Round 2 (WS) Ch3 (counts as a tr throughout), tr in each st around, ss to top of beg ch-3, turn.

Round 3 Ch3, (skip 2 sts, 3tr in next st) rep to last 2 sts, skip 2 sts, 2tr in base of beg ch-3, ss to top of beg ch-3, ss in sp between ch-3 and next tr, turn.

Round 4 Ch3, 2tr in same sp as beg ch-3, 3tr in sp between each 3-tr group to last 2 sps, skip next sp, 3tr in final sp, ss to top of beg ch-3, turn. [3 sts decreased]

Rounds 5-6 Rep Round 4. [6 sts decreased]

Rounds 7-10 Ch3, 2tr in same sp as beg ch-3, 3tr in sp between each 3-tr group around, ss to top of beg ch-3, turn.

Round 11 As Round 4. [3 sts decreased]
Rep Rounds 7-10 to desired circumference of Sleeve.

Rep Round 7 until Sleeve measures desired length, minus 3cm. Do not fasten off.

CUFF

Change to 3.5mm hook.

Round 1 (RS) Ch1, dc in each st around, ss to top of beg ch-1, turn.

Cuff continues in rows.

Row 2 Ch11, dc in bl of second ch from hook, dc in bl of next 9 ch, ss into next 2 sts from Round 1, turn. [10 sts]

Row 3 Skip 2 ss, dc in bl of each st to end, turn.

Row 4 Ch1, dc in bl of next 9 sts, ss into next 2



A treble-stitch pocket trim provides a stylish complement to your brand-new sleeves



The sleeves are worked in triplets of treble stitches for an airy fabric with lots of texture

sts from Round 1, turn.

Rep Rows 3-4 until all sts from Round 1 have been worked into.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail.

Sew the ends of the Cuff together.

POCKET TRIM

Using a 3.5mm hook, join yarn in first st.

Row 1 (RS) Ch1, dc in same st as beg ch-1, 2dc in each st to end, turn.

Change to 4mm hook.

Row 2 (WS) Ch3, tr in each st across.

Fasten off and weave in ends.

Rep on any other pocket edges.
