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Miller Canfield to participate in Women in Law Hackathon

Top law firms nationwide generating ideas to recruit, retain, advance women in law careers

Miller Canfield, a global law firm headquartered in Detroit, has announced that it is one of 54 top law firms nationwide, and the only Michigan-headquartered firm, to be selected to participate in **Women in Law Hackathon**, an innovative program to advance the careers of women in the legal profession. The announcement was made by Miller Canfield CEO Michael McGee.

The **Women in Law Hackathon** is a national "Shark Tank"-style pitch competition created by the Diversity Lab in collaboration with Stanford Law School and Bloomberg Law. The goal of the Hackathon is to generate innovative ideas and solutions that will lead to greater recruitment, retention and advancement of women in law firms.

Dawn M. Schluter, Chair of Women of Miller Canfield and Personal Services Group leader, has been selected to represent Miller Canfield, and will work with a group of other senior attorneys from major law firms around the country as a participant in this inaugural Women in Law Hackathon. Schluter is a member of one of nine teams, each comprised of six high-level partners, two expert advisors and one Stanford law student. Over a period of six months, each team will generate practical and actionable ideas to improve gender parity in law firms.

During the Hackathon, and continuing thereafter, Miller Canfield will create a Hackathon Support Committee. The HSC will be co-chaired by Schluter and Miller Canfield Principal **A. Michael Palizzi**, Miller Canfield Intellectual Property Group leader and Litigation Group co-leader.

The HSC will provide plans to firm leadership, and thereafter work to implement transformative plans based upon the lessons gleaned from the Hackathon.

"Our goal is to firmly establish Miller Canfield as a firm that attracts, supports, retains and advances the very best women attorneys," McGee said.

The nine Hackathon teams were formed and started their work in January. They will work through June of this year to devise their respective projects, plans or initiatives. The teams will then present their ideas in-person to a panel of expert judges at a pitch event at Stanford Law School on June 24, 2016. The top three winning teams will award grant prizes, donated by Bloomberg Law (\$10,000 for 1st place; \$7,500 for 2nd place; and \$5,000 for 3rd place), to their choice of a non-profit organization that advances women in the legal profession and beyond.

Ibro Muharemovic Joins Leaders in Autonomous Vehicles to Present on Challenges, Opportunities to Industry and Region

Ibro Muharemovic, the head of advanced engineering NAFTA systems and technology for Continental Automotive Systems, will be among a panel of experts in driverless automotive technology at a March 2, 2016 event at Automation Alley.

Miller Canfield, a Detroit-based global law firm, together with the Oakland County Bar Association, is co-sponsoring an informative presentation about one of the most dramatic developments in the automotive industry today: autonomous vehicles. Automation Alley will host the event at its headquarters in Troy.

Miller Canfield Teams with Chamber to Publish Definitive Employment and Labor Law Update

Miller Canfield's nationally ranked Employment and Labor Group has again teamed up with the Michigan Chamber of Commerce to publish the "2016 Employment Law Handbooks," an annual update of employment laws for employers of all sizes. The three-volume set of handbooks includes: Hiring & Firing, Compensation & Benefits and Employer & Employee Protections.

"In 2015, the U.S. Supreme Court was very active, releasing six decisions that had a major impact on employers," said Employment and Labor Group co-leader Christopher Trebilcock. "These handbooks help employers sort out if, and how theses opinions impact their workforces, and how to navigate issues such as discrimination, the Affordable Care Act, class action suits and retiree benefits."

Each year, Miller Canfield lawyers write and update the handbook, which the Chamber sells through its website in both print and electronic editions. This year's complete e-edition costs \$99 for Chamber members and \$149 for non-members. Shipping and handling charges are added for those that order the print edition only.

They include in-depth analysis of Michigan and federal employment laws, including recent hot-button topics such as:

- Pregnancy discrimination and accommodation changes
- Retiree health benefits disputes
- Handbook policies
- College athlete unions
- OSHA guidance on restroom access for transgender workers
- Wellness programs and new regulatory guidance
- The same-sex marriage case's impact on FMLA and other workplace issues
- Religious accommodations and protections in hiring
- Determining "joint employer" status
- Updates to medical marijuana, concealed weapons, and Fair Credit Reporting Act which will require employer attention
- How recent executive actions on immigration will impact employers

"The information in this reference guide goes beyond what the courts and the various regulatory bodies have done," Trebilcock said. "It also helps to explain what the impact will be, and how these issues could specifically impact employers."
