Save The Redwoods League Mission & History

Our mission is to protect and restore California redwoods and connect people to the peace and beauty of redwood forests.

We were founded in 1917, after John C. Merriam, Madison Grant, and Farirfield Osborn took a road trip up California's Redwood Highway and saw the accelrating rate of destruction of Redwood forests

The three conservationists were committed to protecting the coastal redwood and giant sequoia forests and purchased multiple ancient groves and helped to establish state and national parks to protect them. And thus in 1918 the Save the Redwoods League was established

The League was a leader in establishing the California State Parks Committee in 1925

Since the League's creation, multiple redwood preserves have been established through the decades, including Redwood National Park

The League has saved more than 200,000 acres of redwood forest and helped to establish more than 66 redwood parks and preserves, protecting most of the old-growth redwoods that remain on Earth, and hopes to continue doing so.
