**Re: Access to Information Request

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MacEwan University is responding to your Access to Information request opened for processing on August 27, 2025.

Please find enclosed 65 pages of records in response to your request. Some of the records you requested contain information that is withheld from disclosure under the *Access to Information Act* (ATIA). We have severed the excepted information so that we could disclose to you the remaining information in the records.

The severed information is withheld from disclosure under the following sections of the ATIA.

**Disclosure harmful to personal privacy**

**Section 20(1)**

*“The head of a public body must refuse to disclose personal information to an applicant if the disclosure would be an unreasonable invasion of a third party’s personal privacy.”*

**The above section was applied to names and other personally identifiable information of individuals for whom their name and information could constitute an unreasonable invasion of their privacy.**

**Disclosure harmful to individual or public safety**

**Section 21(1)**

*“The head of a public body may refuse to disclose to an applicant information, including personal information about the applicant, if the disclosure could reasonably be expected to  
(a) threaten anyone else’s safety or mental or physical health”*

**The above section was applied to the names of individuals to whom disclosure may pose a threat to their personal safety.**

Some records have been excluded from the package (pages 48 and 49, 4 photos and 77 videos) which were withheld in their entirety under sections, 20(1) as cited above and 23(1)(1) and (n).

**Disclosure harmful to law enforcement**

**Section 23(1)**

*“The head of a public body may refuse to disclose information to an applicant if the disclosure could reasonably be expected to*

*(l) facilitate the commission of an unlawful act or hamper the control of crime.”*

**SUMMARY:** Security found a non-MacEwan female unresponsive laying on the floor of a bathroom stall in building 5 with a needed in her hand. Security administered first aid and concluded that the female was overdosing. 911 was activated. Security administered a NARCAN nasal spray, and the female began to recover. Emergency Medical Services (EMS) arrived on site and took over the incident. Female refused to depart with EMS and left MacEwan property on her own volition.

**NARRATIVE:**

1. On January 5, 2025, at approximately 1705hrs Security Agent (SA) **PIYA**, s. 21(1) radioed me (SA) **KOVACEVIC**, s. 21(1) asking for assistance with a female in building 5.
2. Upon arrival at approximately 1710hrs I met with **PIYA** and asked him what was going on. **PIYA** informed me that there was a female, later verbally identified as s. 20(1), that was nonresponsive inside bathroom (5-148) stall 16. I proceeded to the stall and noticed that the doors were opened a tinny bit. I announced myself as campus security and called out to the female asking her if she was alright. I received no reply.
3. As I was listening, I heard a wheezing sound coming from s. 20(1). The same sound I heard before from people who are overdosing. I called out to s. 20(1) to answer me, or I would have to open the doors to assure she was ok. After a few seconds of no reply, I opened the doors and found s. 20(1) laying on the ground, unconscious, holding a used needle in her left hand.
4. I informed **PIYA** to call 911 and to get me NARCAN nasal spray from building 6 office and inform the 911 dispatcher that s. 20(1) was overdosing. I removed the needle out of s. 20(1) hand and began first aid. s. 20(1) breathing was shallow and slow, her skin was pale and damp, and her pulse was very weak.
5. At approximately 1712hrs **PIYA** returned with the NARCAN and I administered the nasal spray in s. 20(1) right nostril. I monitored s. 20(1) breathing while Emergency Medical Services (EMS) were on route.
6. At approximately 1714hrs s. 20(1) began to regain consciousness and her breathing improved. I asked s. 20(1) if she knew where she was, and s. 20(1) sated "MacEwan University bathroom". I asked s. 20(1) what she took in which she replied "fentanyl".
7. At this time, 1719hrs EMS unit 2A76 arrived on scene and took over the incident. s. 20(1) was recovering due to the nasal spray and did not want to go with EMS to the hospital. 211 was offered but s. 20(1) refused that as well.
8. At approximately 1727hrs EMS cleared the site and left property. s. 20(1) packed her belongings and proceeded off property via the easy sliders under her on volition. This concluded the file.

## NARRATIVE

1. On Sunday, January 05, 2025, around 1650 hours, when I (Campus Security Agent **PIYA**, s. 21(1)) was conducting an interior patrol in building 5, main floor, I observed a washroom stall 16, in all gender washroom 5-148 engaged for an extended period.
2. I reported this to the Dispatcher **HARE**, s. 21(1)
3. I knocked on the door to conduct a wellness check. When I knocked on the door, I found the door unlocked and the subject was using the washroom.
4. I told the subject that she was supposed to lock the door. The subject (Later identified by Paramedics s. 20(1)) apologized for not locking the door.
5. I told s. 20(1) she needed to finish using the washroom quick to which she agreed saying, "Okay". I allowed s. 20(1) five minutes time and waited outside the washroom for her to exit the washroom.
6. After the given time s. 20(1) did not exit so, I returned to washroom and knocked on the door again reminding s. 20(1) of the time given but there was no response. I called multiple times saying, "Do you hear me, are you okay"? but she did not reply.
7. I then called the Security Agent **KOVACEVIC**, s. 21(1) for assistance. **KOVACEVIC** responded and arrived at the scene around 1710 hours.
8. **KOVACEVIC** and I then entered the washroom. **KOVACEVIC** opened the washroom door and found s. 20(1) lying unconscious on the floor with her face down as well as puke all over on the floor.
9. **KOVACEVIC** tried to wake her up, but she did not wake up. **KOVACEVIC** advised me to call 911. Around 1710 hours I called 911 for the Ambulance. When I was on call with 911, **KOVACEVIC** again told me to bring Narcan from building 6 Security Office.
10. I handed the phone to **KOVACEVIC**, and I ran to get the Narcan from building 6 Security Office around 1715 hours.
11. Around 1718 hours 1 dose of Narcan (Nasal Spray) was administered to s. 20(1) after which she started to regain consciousness.
12. Just then, around 1719 hours EMS truck no 3495 and unit 2A76 arrived at the scene and took control of the situation over s. 20(1). Shortly after around 1920 hours an Edmonton fire truck also arrived at the scene which left shortly after they found EMS had taken control of the situation. By that time s. 20(1) had already gained her full consciousness.

13. The Paramedics started assessing s. 20(1) and later, asked her if she wanted to go with them. s. 20(1) refused to go with Paramedics and said she would go on her own.
14. After s. 20(1) refused to go with EMS (Paramedics), EMS left the scene around 1737 hours.
15. Later, s. 20(1) cleaned the washroom herself and left the building around 1738 hours through the east Slider heading southbound towards 104 Avenue.
16. After s. 20(1) was off the property, **KOVACEVIC** and I cleared the scene.
17. This concludes the file for this incident.

## SUMMARY

A staff member reported to Security Services about a community member lying on the snow outside Tower Pub in building 6; Security Services quickly responded and found the subject passed out on the snow. Security Services woke him up and brought him inside the building through the East push door to warm up. EMS and the Hope Mission were contacted. EMS assessed the subject on the scene and handed him to the Hope Mission for food and Shelter.

## NARRATIVE

1. On Tuesday, February 04, 2025, at around 0655 hours, when I (Campus Security Agent **PIYA**, s. 21(1)) was conducting an interior Patrol in building 6 of the main Campus, I was approached by a Maintenance staff member s. 21(1) **HALLIDAY** and reported that a community member was lying on the snow outside of the Tower Pub south side of building 6.
2. I quickly responded and headed to the scene. When I arrived at the scene at around 0656 hours, I observed a community member later know as s. 20(1) with DOB: March 02, 2004, lying on the snow (Passed out) facing upward.
3. I reported it to the Dispatcher s. 21(1) **McKinnon**, and I woke s. 20(1) up by shaking his body and saying loudly, "Security".
4. s. 20(1) opened his eyes and looked confused. I asked him if he was okay. He said He was fine, and he stood up. He was freezing and shivering.
5. I then brought s. 20(1) inside building 6 to warm up through the East push door and told him to sit on the Sofa. s. 20(1) sat on Sofa.
6. I asked s. 20(1) if he was okay and if he needed warming gears.
7. s. 20(1) said, "Yes, please".
8. I went to building 6 security office room and picked up a packet of handwarmer, a bottle of water, a pair of socks, a pair of gloves and a granola bar, which I handed to him.
9. After some times, s. 20(1) started feeling pain in his legs and feet numb.
10. I asked if he wanted an Ambulance, he said, "Yes, please".
11. I informed this to **McKinnon**, and I called EMS at around 0706 hours.
12. When I was on the call with EMS, Navigator **DILLON**, s. 21(1) arrived at the scene.
13. EMS (Unit – 3407) arrived at the site at around 0720 hours and **DILLON** escorted them to the scene.
14. Paramedics assessed s. 20(1) and said he was fine and not needed to take him to the Hospital.
15. Paramedics then asked s. 20(1) he wanted to go to Hope Mission for warm food and Shelter. s. 20(1) agreed to go with Hope Mission.
16. Paramedics then called to Hope Mission (211) at around 0724 hours.
17. When we were waiting for the Hope Mission Team, **DILLON** provided s. 20(1) a Jacket, a toque and a sweater.
18. The Crisis Diversion Team arrived on the scene at around 0749 hours.
19. The Crisis Diversion Team (Hope Mission) took s. 20(1) with them and left the site at around 0751 hours.
20. EMS also left the site at around 0754 hours.
21. After EMS and the Hope Mission left the site, I cleared the scene.
22. This concludes the file for this incident.

While on patrol, Security was waved down by a community member claiming their friend was overdosing. Two (2) doses of Narcan were administered. CPR was performed. EFRS and EMS responded and were able to revive the subject after more Narcan was administered. The subjects later walked off on their own after refusing transport. HSE report submitted: MHC-127127

**NARRATIVE**

1. On Saturday, February 22nd, 2025, at approximately 1545 hours, I (MacEwan Security Agent <sup>s. 21(1)</sup> **POLLARD**) and MacEwan Security Supervisor <sup>s. 21(1)</sup> **BAKKEN** were patrolling West Campus exterior, when we were flagged down by a community member in the West Annex. It was immediately reported that there was another subject overdosing. **BAKKEN** and I split up momentarily for me to get Narcan.
2. I grabbed two (2) cases of Narcan (Team 1 and Team 3) before rushing back to the West Annex. As I arrived at the West Annex, I put on medical gloves and administered the first dose of Narcan to the patient. I monitored the patient's pulse after. She had a faint pulse and was barely breathing.
3. One of the other community members was on the phone with Emergency Services (EMS) who was asking us questions. I did my best to answer, however it was a very noisy area. The patient stopped breathing and I could not feel a pulse. **BAKKEN** administered a second dose of Narcan at this time.
4. There was still no breathing and I asked for help to move the patient to the ground as I felt chest compressions would need to be started soon. We gently laid the patient on the ground, and moments later, and still no pulse, I began conducting chest compressions.
5. I completed one round of chest compressions, and put my ear close to the patient's mouth. Still no pulse, and no breathing. I began the second round of chest compressions, and while conducting them, Edmonton Fire and Rescue Services (Truck #489) arrived and relieved me.
6. I brought all Narcan pouches back to the office, and returned to stand by with **BAKKEN**. While I was away, EMS (Ambulance #3413) arrived on site. I continued standing by with **BAKKEN**. At approximately 1553 hours, EFRS and EMS revived the patient. EFRS cleared shortly after. EMS stayed by to speak with the patient.
7. Shortly after, at approximately 1600 hours, EMS cleared as well. After EMS cleared, **BAKKEN** and I cleared too. At approximately 1609 hours, Acting MacEwan Security Dispatcher <sup>s. 21(1)</sup> **DONAGHY** reported that the patient and her friends were leaving property. This concludes my involvement in this incident.

**Summary:**

**Narrative:**

1. On February 22, 2025, at approximately 1541 hrs, I (MacEwan Security Supervisor, **BAKKEN**, s. 21(1)) exited the security office through the back door leading to 110 street with MacEwan Security Agent, **POLLARD**, s. 21(1) to start an exterior patrol.
2. As we got to the corner of 110 street and 104 avenue, we saw two females in wheelchairs and 1 female standing and pacing on the phone at the West Annex. When she saw us, she started yelling for help.
3. As we got to their location, we saw a fourth female lying on her back on the first step of the West Annex. We were told she was overdosing. I called this into Acting Dispatcher, **DONAGHY**, s. 21(1)
4. **POLLARD** returned to the building 9 office and grabbed two doses of Narcan while I checked out the female. I noticed a glass pipe lying next to her body. I could not see her chest moving with breaths and one of her eyes was open. Her lips were blue and her skin was gray.
5. **POLLARD** returned and gave the first dose of Narcan. We checked for her vitals as well and her pulse was not found and I could not tell if she was breathing.
6. I then gave her a second dose of Narcan. This did not wake her up either and **POLLARD** felt a pulse for a short while then said it went away again.
7. **POLLARD** and I then lifted the female off of the step onto the ground and placed her flat on her back so that CPR could be started. **POLLARD** started CPR as Edmonton Fire Rescue Services (EFRS) arrived at approximately 1549 hrs and they took over duty of care.
8. EMS ambulance #3413 arrived at approximately 1551 hrs and took over. EMS delivered a third dose of Naloxone at approximately 1553 hrs. The community member then woke up.
9. EFRS left site at approximately 1556 hrs.
10. EMS left site at approximately 1601 hrs after the community member refused further care and transport to hospital.
11. I replaced the Naloxone.

**SUMMARY:**

Security conducted a wellness check on a female community member who had been in the building 05 main floor handicap washroom for a long period of time. Security found the subject unresponsive, purple, and possibly overdosing. Two doses of Narcan were given to the subject and EMS was contacted. The subject was assessed by EMS and was taken away to an unknown hospital. HSE: MHC-127341.

**NARRATIVE/INVESTIGATIONS:**

1. On Tuesday, February 25, 2025, at approximately 1006hrs, I, MacEwan Security Agent <sup>s. 21(1)</sup> [REDACTED] **TRAN**, proceeded to the keyhole between buildings 5 and 6 to assist in escorting Emergency Medical Services (EMS) to a medical incident occurring in building 5.
2. I arrived at the keyhole at approximately 1014hrs and escorted EMS into the building. They were directed to the all-gender neutral washroom, where they assumed medical care for the individual in question.
3. At approximately 1022hrs, EMS transported the female individual onto a stretcher and into their ambulance. They provided me with her identification details, subject's name <sup>s. 20(1)</sup> [REDACTED].
4. Shortly after EMS departed the property with <sup>s. 20(1)</sup> [REDACTED], I concluded my involvement in the incident at approximately 1025hrs.

**SUMMARY:**

Security conducted a wellness check on a female community member who had been in the building 05 main floor handicap washroom for a long period of time. Security found the subject unresponsive, purple, and possibly overdosing. Two doses of Narcan were given to the subject and EMS was contacted. The subject was assessed by EMS and was taken away to an unknown hospital.

**NARRATIVE:**

On 25 February 25<sup>th</sup> at approximately 0950 hours, I Security Agent (S/A) **DYETH**, s. 21(1) spoke with a community member later identified as s. 20(1) who came into the east side sliding doors from building 05 requesting to use the washroom. I told s. 20(1) that she can use the washroom for a few minutes but needed to leave afterwards. s. 20(1) agreed and then proceeded to the main floor washrooms. I informed Security Dispatcher **SHARMA**, s. 21(1) about the situation.

At approximately 1000 hours, I went to check on s. 20(1) to see if she was finished with the washroom. I knocked on the south handicap stall multiple times and identified myself as Security but did not get a reply. After many attempts of trying to get her attention, the door opened, and an unidentified indigenous male exited the washroom stating that s. 20(1) fell asleep. He then departed from the washroom. I attempted to get s. 20(1) attention by tapping on s. 20(1) shoulder but did not get a response. I then turned s. 20(1) over as she was laying down on the floor and noticed that her face was purple. At this time, I requested back up to come with Narcan.

At approximately 1004 hours, Campus Navigator **DILLON**, s. 21(1) arrived with nasal spray Narcan. He administered the first shot through s. 20(1) right nostril, but it was not effective. At this time, I asked Dispatcher **SHARMA** to call EMS (Emergency Medical Services). **DILLON** then departed from the area and made his way back to building 06 to obtain another Narcan spray.

At approximately 1008 hours, **DILLON** returned and administered another Narcan spray. s. 20(1) then started to breathe normally but was still unresponsive. At this time, Supervisor **WONGUS**, s. 21(1) arrived at the scene and assisted with blocking off the washroom area. Dispatcher **SHARMA** then informed us by radio transmission that EMS would be arriving shortly.

At approximately 1015 hours, EMS arrived alongside EFRS (Edmonton Fire Rescue Services) and provided medical attention to s. 20(1). At this time, s. 20(1) was awake and responsive and was asked if she wanted to go to the hospital. s. 20(1) agreed and was placed on a stretcher. Once s. 20(1) was under the care of EMS, EFRS departed. At approximately 1020 hours, s. 20(1) was taken away by EMS to an unknown hospital.

A bike belonging to s. 20(1) was left at building 05 east sliding door entrance. The bike was placed by the bike rack in building 06 as directed by Supervisor **WONGUS**.

At approximately 1025 hours, I cleared from this incident and returned to my regular duties.

**SUMMARY:**

MacEwan Security Services were notified by a student that called dispatch to report that a female was passed out on the 3rd floor of Robbins Health Centre woman washroom. Security personnel were dispatched to assist with the incident. EMS was contacted prior by the student that located the female.

**NARRATIVE/INVESTIGATIONS:**

1. On Thursday, March 27, 2025, at approximately 1550 hours, MacEwan Security Agent **s. 21(1) TRAN** was notified by some students that a female had been found unconscious in the women's washroom located on the 3rd floor of Robbins Health Centre.
2. **TRAN** notified MacEwan Security Dispatcher **s. 21(1) LOWE** about the situation and began heading to the 3rd floor of Robbins Health Centre.
3. **TRAN** arrived on the scene at approximately 1554 hours to find a group of people surrounding a female subject who was lying on the washroom floor.
4. **TRAN** assessed the situation and confirmed that the subject had a pulse. He then attempted to determine if the subject could respond to verbal cues or painful stimuli by performing a sternum rub. The subject did not respond, leading **TRAN** to conclude that she was unconscious.
5. **TRAN** checked the subject's pupils and found them to be pinpointed, while also observing that she had shallow breathing.
6. **TRAN** radioed for additional security personnel to bring a Narcan kit for the medical incident.
7. MacEwan Security Agent **s. 21(1) RUTTER** and Campus Navigator **s. 21(1) DILLON** arrived at approximately 1559 hours with a Narcan kit. **TRAN** asked **DILLON** to assist by administering one dose of Narcan intranasally to the subject.
8. **DILLON** provided one dose of Narcan at approximately 1600 hrs.
9. At approximately 1609 hours, Edmonton Fire and Rescue, along with EMS, arrived and took over the medical incident. The subject regained consciousness shortly after and declined further assistance from EMS and Edmonton Fire and Rescue.
10. They departed the property at approximately 1611 hrs. **TRAN** walked the subject off the property, as she was no longer welcome due to substance use.
11. **TRAN** did not issue a trespass notice, and the subject left the property, heading towards Tim Hortons on 104 Avenue and 110 Street at approximately 1615 hours without any issues.
12. **TRAN** concluded his involvement in this incident at approximately 1615 hours and returned to the security office in Building 9.

**SUMMARY:**

The Mustard Seed Navigator responded to a reported overdose on the third floor of Robbins Health Centre. The Navigator administered one dose of Narcan and then escorted EFD to the bathroom. Once the care of the patient had been transferred, the Navigator spoke to the woman who was accompanying the patient, offering her resources and giving basic supplies.

**INVESTIGATION:**

1. At 1554 hours Mustard Seed Navigator **DILLON**, s. 21(1) responded to a request for Narcan by Security Agent **TRAN**, s. 21(1) in the third floor women's bathroom in Robbins Health Centre. **DILLON** arrived on scene at approximately 1557 hours and spoke to **TRAN**, who gave his assessment on the unconscious woman.
2. **DILLON** attended to the woman, who remained unconscious and unresponsive as **DILLON** called out to her. **DILLON** also observed the woman's shallow breathing and blue tinged lips.
3. **DILLON** administered one dose of Narcan at 1558 hours.
4. **DILLON** let **TRAN** manage the scene, and left the bathroom to help escort Edmonton Fire Department (EFD). EFD arrived at approximately 1609 and was escorted to the bathroom. As the patient was being assessed by EMS and EFD, **DILLON** spoke to another woman outside of the bathroom who was accompanying the patient. **DILLON** asked if she was in need of anything, and she requested some water as well as snacks, which **DILLON** provided. 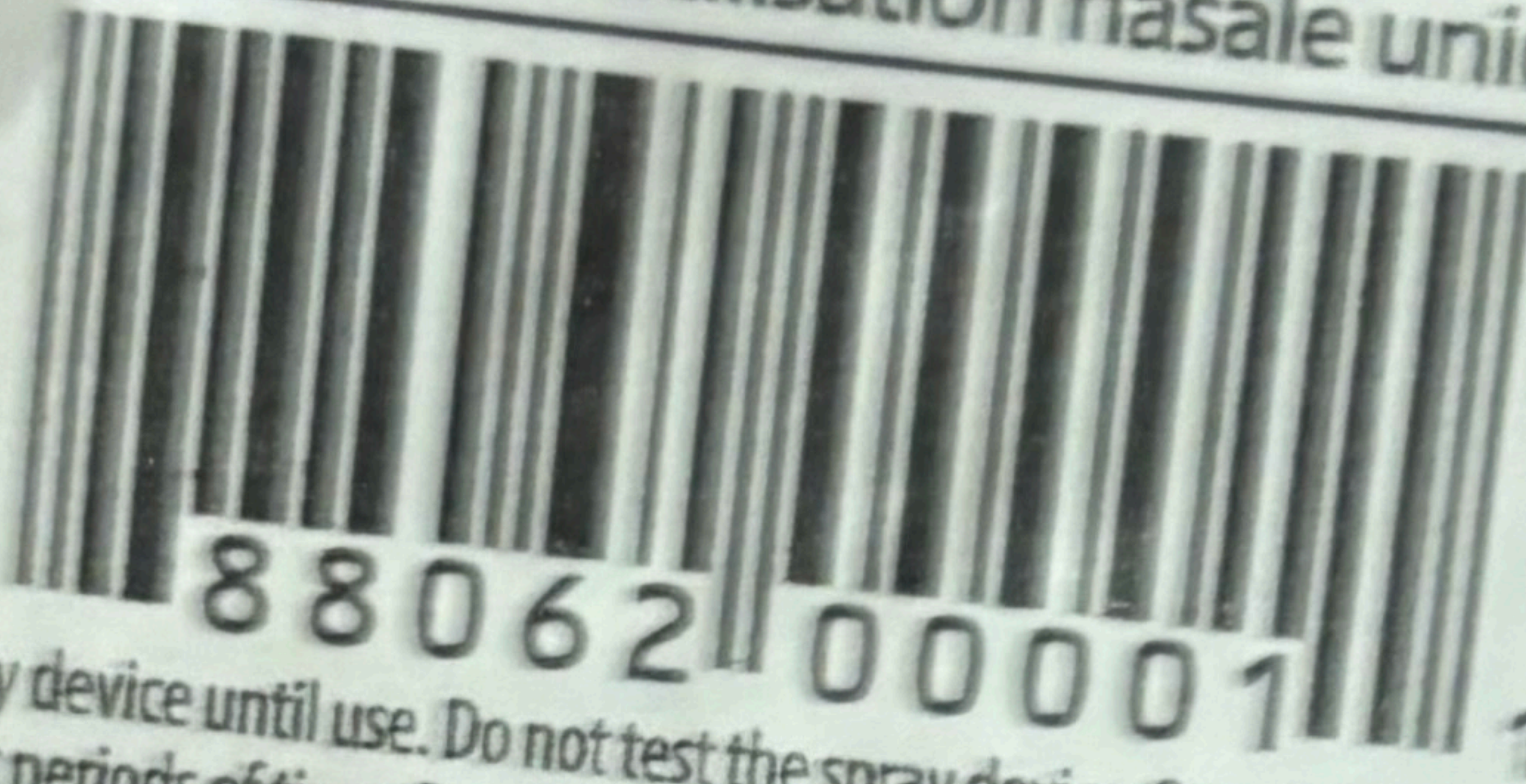

- 1) On April 10, 2025, at approx. 1515 Hrs. I, **DONAGHY**, s. 21(1) MacEwan, Security Supervisor, responded to a call on the exterior of the West Annex. It was reported that a Community Member was on the ground and had overdosed.
- 2) When I arrived on the scene, **S/A COURT**, s. 21(1) was on site trying to communicate with the community member. **S/A ROCHETTE**, s. 21(1) was on the phone updating Dispatch on the incident while Dispatcher McKINNON, s. 21(1) was on the phone updating 9-1-1.
- 3) **S/A COURT** advised me that another Community Member had already given the Overdosed Community Member a dose of Narcan. (Injection)
- 3) While explaining this to me, Campus Navigator **DILLON**, s. 21(1) also arrived. Due to the unresponsiveness of the Community Member, 9-1-1 requested that another dose of Narcan be given to the Community Member.
- 4) At approx. 1518 Hrs **DILLON** administered another dose of Narcan as directed. (Nasal) There was little to no change in how the Community Member was responding.
- 5) At approx. 1520 Hrs. EMS Supervisor 31021 arrived on the scene and took over the duty of care for the Community Member. Edmonton Fire Rescue arrived on scene at approx. 152 Hrs. Checked in with EMS and departed.
- 6) At approx. 1523 Hrs. EMS gave the Community Member a third dose of Narcan (injection). EMS then treated an existing injury that the Community Member had on his right Shoulder.
- 7) At Approx. 1528 Hrs Security Personnel cleared from the call. The Community Member did not want further treatment from EMS or to go to the hospital.
- 8) At approx. 1532 Hrs EMS and the Community Member departed MacEwan Property.

1. On April 29, 2025, at approximately 1321 hrs MacEwan Dispatcher **McKINNON** s. 21(1) received a report from s. 20(1) regarding a community member screaming in bathroom 5-001D. **McKINNON** relayed this to the team. MacEwan Security Agent **BULL** s. 21(1) informed the team he was on route. I, MacEwan Security Agent **COURT** s. 21(1) then radioed that I too would respond and began making my way from building 107.
2. At approximately 1325 hrs MacEwan Navigator **DILLON** s. 21(1) and I arrived on scene. The bathroom was located in the northwest corner of the building 105 basement. **BULL** then knocked on the door and announced himself. The community member opened the door. He was compliant and friendly; however, slurred speech, drooping eyelids, and a staggered walk demonstrated to me at the time that he was likely under the influence of a substance. He communicated that he was leaving, and I directed him to the building 105 east staircase.
3. As we walked the community member **BULL** and I both suspected that he was a current trespasser as he looked familiar to the both of us, but due to his compliance I did not push the issue. The community member gave us the name s. 20(1). When referring to the trespass list later I found a subject by the name of "s. 20(1)" who looks identical to s. 20(1) I attached pictures from the trespass list and of the subject today. Potentially it is the same person. For the purpose of this file, I will call the subject s. 20(1)
4. At approximately 1327 s. 20(1) exited the west sliders of building 105 and headed south, stopping to grab a lime scooter which s. 20(1) claimed was "his ride." s. 20(1) then attempted to ride the scooter. The wheels locked and it beeped because sufficient payment was not provided. When **BULL** and I attempted to explain this to s. 20(1) he did not seem to understand and continued trying to ride the scooter. s. 20(1) stumbled and had a hard time

keeping himself upright. It seemed as though he was slowly losing control of his motor functions as time went on.

5. **DILLON** then asked s. 20(1) if he wanted Naloxone. s. 20(1) initially said no but quickly changed his mind and agreed. **DILLON** directed s. 20(1) to a nearby bench. I offered to take the scooter which s. 20(1) thanked. I brought the scooter to the sidewalk, so it was not on the road and assisted s. 20(1) in sitting. I stood behind s. 20(1) to ensure he didn't fall as he was slightly unstable.
6. At approximately 1336 hrs **DILLON** administered naloxone. s. 20(1) became unresponsive so **DILLON** and I transferred him to the ground. **BULL** communicated this to **McKINNON** and asked her to phone 911.
7. I could feel a strong fast pulse from his heart and see it beat in his neck. His breathing was weak, however. All of this was communicated to EMS. **BULL** communicated all actions to dispatch during the incident. s. 20(1) became blue a few times but would quickly fill back with color after a sharp intake of oxygen. s. 20(1) was also mostly unresponsive to sternum rubs and squeezing of the trap muscle but groaned or twitched in response a couple times.
8. At approximately 1339 hrs **DILLON** administered a second dose of Naloxone.
9. At approximately 1340 hrs MacEwan Security Agent **USHER** s. 21(1) communicated he was on route with an AED.
10. At approximately 1343 hrs **DILLON** administered a third dose of Naloxone.

The Mustard Seed Navigator and MacEwan Security responded to a call of a man yelling in the Building 5 basement washroom. Upon making contact with the individual, they attempted to make their way off property using a scooter. The individual exhibited signs of impairment and consented to receive Narcan after being asked by the Navigator. Narcan was administered and soon after the individual became unconscious. EMS was called and two other Narcan doses were administered at regular intervals. EMS attended the scene and transported the individual away in a stretcher.

**INVESTIGATION:**

1. At approximately 1320 Mustard Seed Navigator **DILLON**, s. 21(1) and MacEwan Security Agents **COURT**, s. 21(1) and **BULL**, s. 21(1) responded to a report of a male yelling inside the bathroom 5-001D. Upon arriving on scene the yelling was heard from the bathroom and contact was made with the individual later identified as s. 20(1). The individual opened the door following instructions from **BULL**, and was cooperative in exiting the building..
2. Throughout the conversation and while exiting the building s. 20(1) exhibited signs of impairment, including staggering, slurred speech, confusion and drooping eyelids. These symptoms appeared to deteriorate steadily, until s. 20(1) appeared to have difficulty staying upright even with the assistance of the scooter..
3. **DILLON** asked s. 20(1) if he needed a dose of Narcan, and stated that he was concerned with his safety at this moment. s. 20(1) initially declined, but soon asked for a dose of Narcan. **DILLON** and **COURT** manoeuvred s. 20(1) to a nearby bench and **DILLON** administered Narcan at approximately 1336. **BULL** coordinated with Dispatch to have EMS called to our location.
4. **DILLON** and **COURT** monitored s. 20(1) for any improvement. After four minutes, s. 20(1) condition had not improved and was exhibiting more signs of an opioid poisoning, as his lips and fingernails were tinted blue. An additional dose of narcan was given at approximately 1340. Upon receiving an additional dose, color returned slightly to his face and fingers. Monitoring of s. 20(1) continued and his symptoms worsened again, with his lips and fingernails turning blue again. After an additional four minutes, a third dose of Narcan was administered at approximately 1343.

5. At 1344 Hours **BULL** escorted Edmonton Fire Rescue to the patient and two additional naloxone was deployed at approximately 1345 and 1347.

6. At approximately 1348 Edmonton Medical Services arrived on scene. Care was transferred to the paramedics who then transferred the patient onto a stretcher and took the patient inside the ambulance.

7. EMS left at 1409 hours with s. 20(1) and **DILLON**, EFD and the MacEwan Security personnel cleared the scene.

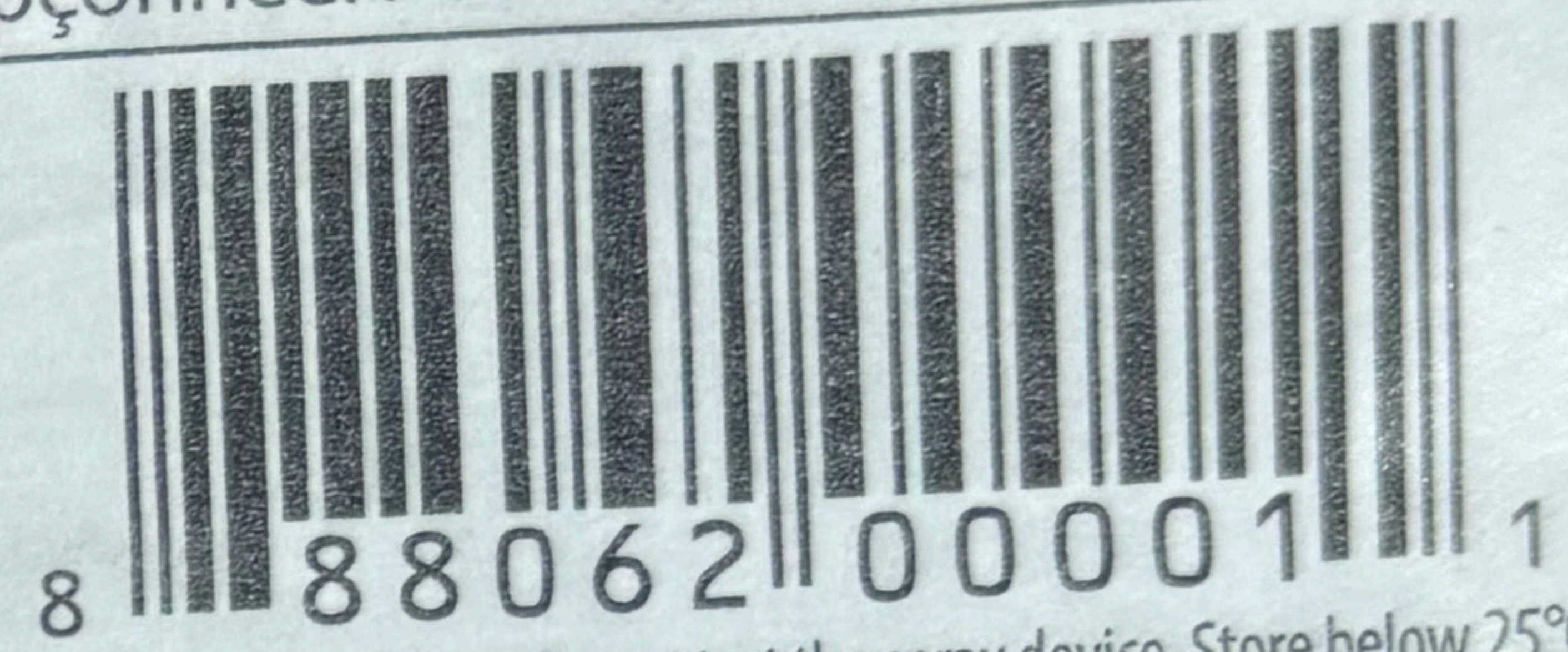

MacEwan Security Services were notified of a medical emergency outside the front doors of Robbins Health Centre. Security personnel were dispatched and attended a community member having an overdose medical incident. Narcan was provided and Edmonton Fire was notified and attended the scene.

**NARRATIVE/INVESTIGATIONS:**

1. On Tuesday, April 29, 2025, at approximately 1950hrs, MacEwan Security Agents <sup>s. 21(1)</sup> **TRAN** and <sup>s. 21(1)</sup> **FITZGERALD** were en route to City Centre Campus in response to a report involving a community member inside the building.
2. While en route, MacEwan Security Dispatcher <sup>s. 21(1)</sup> **SEMENIUK** notified the team of a medical emergency involving a subject outside the front doors of the Robbins Health Centre.
3. **TRAN** and **FITZGERALD** redirected to the Robbins Health Centre and arrived on scene at approximately 1955 hrs. Upon arrival, they observed two community members hovering over a Caucasian male lying flat on his back.
4. **TRAN** approached the male and assessed for signs of a possible overdose.
5. The subject presented with pinpoint pupils, snore-like respirations, and was unresponsive to both verbal and painful stimuli administered by **TRAN**.
6. MacEwan Security Agent <sup>s. 21(1)</sup> **RUTTER** arrived on scene with two doses of Narcan.
7. At approximately 2000hrs, **TRAN** administered one 4 mg dose of Narcan to the subject's right nostril.
8. **TRAN** continued to monitor the subject's condition while relaying identifying information to **SEMENIUK** for EMS online dispatch.
9. **TRAN** observed the two community members remaining nearby, one of whom was holding a small pocket knife. **TRAN** asked both individuals to leave the property if they were not directly involved in the incident. They complied and left at approximately 2001 hrs.
10. At approximately 2002hrs, **TRAN** administered a second 4 mg dose of Narcan to the subject's left nostril.
11. **TRAN** and **FITZGERALD** repositioned the subject into a seated position and continued to monitor his condition.
12. Edmonton Fire & Rescue Services arrived at approximately 2007hrs and assisted in reviving the subject.
13. The subject regained consciousness at approximately 2010hrs and gradually collected his belongings before leaving the property at approximately 2025 hrs.

2. I proceeded to the stated location from building 7 and upon arrival at approximately 1049hrs I noticed a glass pipe used for drug paraphernalia on the ground. I announced myself as campus security and knocked on the stall doors to gain a response. A male, letter identified as s. 20(1) answered with grunts and moans. I directed s. 20(1) to open the doors. s. 20(1) opened the stall doors and a black male, approximately 50 years old, wearing a green T-shirt, black jeans, and white running shoes, was sitting on the toilet.
3. I informed s. 20(1) that we received a call that someone was overdosing in this stall. I asked s. 20(1) if the glass pipe was his and if he took anything. At first s. 20(1) denied the glass pipe belonged to him but after I informed him that I did not care if he consumed drugs and that I was more concerned for his safety at this point he admitted that he did indeed smoke something.
4. I asked s. 20(1) if he was ok and if he needed medical assistance. s. 20(1) stated that he was fine and that he did not want any medical assistance. At this time (SA) **MacKENZIE**, s. 21(1) arrived on scene. I informed **MacKENZIE** that s. 20(1) was fine and refused medical treatment. I informed s. 20(1) to finish in the washroom and exit when he was done. I asked s. 20(1) for his name and s. 20(1) provided me with his first and last name. **MacKENZIE** left the stall and contacted **HARE** to look up if s. 20(1) was currently trespassed.
5. At approximately 1058hrs Security Services Supervisor (SSS) **BAKKEN**, s. 21(1) arrived on scene. As we waited for s. 20(1) to exit the stall **MacKENZIE** informed me that s. 20(1) was currently trespassed till October of 2025. s. 20(1) then opened the doors, and I informed s. 20(1) that he had a active trespass from all MacEwan properties. s. 20(1) stated that he thought that was only for building 9 and did not know he was not allowed to go into SAMU. I informed s. 20(1) of all MacEwan properties and that he was not allowed to be here for the duration of his trespass. 3. I approached the subject to conduct a wellness check and tried to wake him up announcing loudly as, "Security" multiple times but the subject did not respond though he was breathing and moving his hands.
4. When I shook his legs and body part using hands and legs, the subject partially responded for a short time (reflex action) and again went back to its previous condition (Unconscious).

12. At around 0231 hours the Fire truck departed the scene and at around 0240 hours, EMS left the scene with the subject transporting to the Hospital.

**SUMMARY:** Security Services while on exterior patrol of the main Campus observed a community member lying unconscious on the middle of the road at the intersection of 105 Avenue and 108 Street Northeast of the construction site. Security Services tried to wake the subject up but the subject was unresponsive. The subject was carried from the road and placed on the sidewalk by the Security Services. EMS was contacted and arrived at the scene along with the Edmonton Fire rescue Services team. EMS assessed the subject and transported him to the Hospital at the unknown location.

**NARRATIVE:**

1. On May 12, 2025 at approximately 0202hrs Security Agent (SA) **PIYA**, s. 21(1) stated via radio that there was male laying on the street in the intersection of 105 ave and 108 street and is not responding to **PIYA**.
2. I (SA) **KOVACEVIC**, s. 21(1) proceeded to the scene to assist **PIYA**. Upon arrival I noticed a black male approximately 20-year-old, laying on the ground in the middle of the intersection. **PIYA** informed me that he tried to wake him up but that he was not responding to anything **PIYA** tried.
3. I placed my gloves on and began a first aid assessment. I shook the male by his shoulder calling out to him to gain a response. The male grunted but remained unresponsive for most part. I checked the male's chest movement to check for breathing and the male was breathing normally. I visually examined the males head for any bruises and contusions for a potential head injury. No head injury was noted at this time.
4. To gain a reaction I applied pressure with the index of my thumb behind the males left earlobe to simulate pain and gain a response from the male. The male immediately responded by moving his head away and brining his hand up to the area where I applied the pressure. I gave the male verbal direction to sit up, but the male was not responding.
5. Due to the location the male was I informed **PIYA** that we will assist the male to get up and move him off the street and to the sidewalk for his safety. I grabbed the males right arm while **PIYA** grabbed his left. We stood the male up and at this point he was holding his own weight. We assisted the male with walking to the sidewalk and sat him down.
6. I then informed Dispatcher, **HARE**, s. 21(1) that I will be contacting Emergency Medical Services (EMS) because the male is not responding and seemed to be either heavily intoxicated or under the influence of drugs.
7. At approximately 0217hrs I contacted 911 and spoke to an EMS dispatcher. I informed them of the situation, and we awaited EMS arrival.
8. At approximately 0225hrs EMS unit 3309 arrived on scene and I informed them of the situation. Shortly after EMS placed the male on a stretcher and inside their vehicle. This concluded my involvement.

## Summary

Dispatch received from a student through library staff stating that there was a female in the women's washroom in medical distress. Security personnel responded and encountered EMS already on site. The female community member was located in the building 6 East women's washroom. The community member was awake and alert upon arrival and refused any assistance from both EMS and security personnel. The community member was escorted out of the building without further incident. No trespass was issued.

## Narrative

1. On June 24<sup>th</sup> 2025 at approximately 08:06 hrs, I, Peace officer applicant, s. 21(1) BROWN was dispatched to the library, where a student had reported someone in need of a defibrillator.
2. Myself and campus navigator, s. 21(1) DILLON responded immediately from the security office in building 6 with a first aid kit and AED.
3. While en-route to the library, I observed EMS personnel standing at the base of the spiral staircase in Building 7.
4. EMS accompanied us to the library, where the complainant s. 20(1) advised that the patient was in the East women's washroom in building 6.
5. All present proceeded to the location of the patient. Upon arrival, the female community member was awake and alert.
6. When EMS attempted to initiate contact with the community member, she immediately refused any form of treatment and pushed past them to exit the washroom.
7. Security agent s. 21(1) DYETH and I then escorted the female out the South door behind Starbucks.
8. The community member was not issued any trespass at this time.
9. The community member was not known to security personnel. She is described as a female, approximately 30 years old. Small in stature, approximately five feet tall and approximately 100 pounds. Longer brown straight hair. Wearing all dark clothing and possibly has a tattoo under her right eye. The tattoo may be temporary or very faded.
10. This is the end of my involvement

## SUMMARY

MacEwan Security Dispatch received a call about a community member asleep near the residence building. MacEwan Navigator spoke with the community member, shortly after speaking with them, the community member stated they were having medical issues and wanted EMS. EMS was called, treated them on scene, once released from EMS the community member stated they just wanted to sleep for a bit, which security obliged.

## NARRATIVE

1. On July 10th, 2025 at approximately 0904hrs MacEwan Security Dispatcher <sup>s. 21(1)</sup> **LOWE** received a call from a concerned student that there was a community member passed out “in front of Allard Hall”. The student did not specify a direction.
2. At the time of the call I, MacEwan Security Agent <sup>s. 21(1)</sup> **WESOLOWSKI** was on a patrol of the west side of campus with MacEwan Security Agent <sup>s. 21(1)</sup> **PEARCE** and MacEwan Navigator <sup>s. 21(1)</sup> **DILLON**. The three of us located the community member on the West side of Residence, who was just getting up from laying on the grass. **DILLON** approached the community member and spoke with him first. **DILLON** then escorted the community member into Allard Hall through the East doors so he could fill up his water bottle. **PEARCE** and I followed behind.
3. The community member filled up his water bottle inside, then sat for a few minutes speaking with **DILLON**. **DILLON** asked for his name, and the community member identified himself as <sup>s. 20(1)</sup> and later on provided the last name <sup>s. 20(1)</sup>. Upon exiting the building, <sup>s. 20(1)</sup> proceeded to the grass on the East side of Allard Hall and laid down there. **DILLON** spoke to <sup>s. 20(1)</sup> again, attempting to offer assistance. <sup>s. 20(1)</sup> told **DILLON** he just wanted to lay in the grass. **DILLON**, **PEARCE**, and I agreed we would allow him 10 minutes to lay down. **DILLON** informed <sup>s. 20(1)</sup> of this, however he was unwilling to leave in 10 minutes.
4. **PEARCE** and I then approached <sup>s. 20(1)</sup>. After speaking to him, he informed us he was having chest pains and his head hurt. He then requested EMS. At approximately 0934hrs I called 911 and requested an ambulance for <sup>s. 20(1)</sup>.
5. At approximately 0950hrs the ambulance arrived. The medics spoke to <sup>s. 20(1)</sup> who told them he wanted medication. The medics told him they could not give him any medication unless he came with them to the ambulance so they could assess him. He agreed to go into the ambulance. **DILLON**, **PEARCE**, and I waited nearby until the medics were finished and the determination of transporting or not was made.
6. At 1008hrs, one of the medics came out and spoke with me, **DILLON**, and **PEARCE**. She informed us that <sup>s. 20(1)</sup> refused transport and only wanted medication, which they could not provide. After exiting the ambulance, he proceeded around to the South side of Allard Hall, and then to the West side where he laid down in the grass, partially hidden by bushes.
7. MacEwan Security Dispatcher <sup>s. 21(1)</sup> **DESMARAIS** continued to monitor <sup>s. 20(1)</sup> on the cameras until he eventually left property at 1042hrs.

## SUMMARY

MacEwan Security Dispatch received a call about a community member asleep near the residence building. MacEwan Navigator spoke with the community member, shortly after speaking with them, the community member stated they were having medical issues and wanted EMS. EMS was called, treated them on scene, once released from EMS the community member stated they just wanted to sleep for a bit, which security obliged.

## NARRATIVE

1. On July 10<sup>th</sup> at approximately 0930hours, MacEwan dispatcher **LOWE**, s. 21(1) received a call from a concerned student about a community member passed out on the West side of the residence building. MacEwan Security Agent **WESOLOWSKI**, s. 21(1) and I, MacEwan Security Agent **PEARCE**, s. 21(1) and MacEwan Community Navigator **DILLON**, s. 21(1) responded. While approaching the community member (later identified as s. 20(1)), he stood up. **DILLON** approached s. 20(1), ensured s. 20(1) was ok, then started walking towards Allard Hall as s. 20(1) wanted to fill up his water bottle.
2. While walking out of Allard Hall, **DILLON** was speaking to s. 20(1) about places to stay and how to get ID. s. 20(1) then laid on the grass on the East side of Allard and asked to rest for a little bit on the grass, I agreed to give s. 20(1) 10 minutes. After 10 minutes I approached s. 20(1) and when I asked if he was ok, s. 20(1) stated he was having chest pains. I offered to call EMS, but s. 20(1) declined. A few minutes later s. 20(1) stated his head was also hurting, when I offered to call EMS again, s. 20(1) agreed. EMS was contacted by **WESOLOWSKI** at 0934hours.
3. **EMS** arrived at approximately 0950 (truck #3463) and took s. 20(1) onto the truck to speak to him and check his vitals. s. 20(1) declined going to the hospital and stated to security personnel and EMS that he just wanted to lay on the grass at MacEwan after getting medication from EMS. EMS informed s. 20(1) that they cannot give him medication then release him, however they will bring him onto the ambulance to check his vitals.
4. At approximately 1007hours s. 20(1) left EMS and went to the West side of Allard where I saw him go and lay down. MacEwan dispatcher **DESMARAIS**, s. 21(1) kept an eye on him, until approximately 1040 hours then s. 20(1) left with no further issues. This concludes my involvement with this issue.

Security Services received a call via the Emergency Blue Phone located on the South side of Allard Hall regarding a community member lying on the ground. Security personnel arrived on scene to find the community member breathing but unresponsive. The couple that activated the Emergency Blue phone had already activated 911 - Edmonton Medical Services (EMS) before Security personnel could arrive. EMS and Edmonton Fire Search & Rescue arrived and woke the community member. EMS staff were able to get the community member on their feet and loaded them into the ambulance and departed without further incident.

**NARRATIVE**

1. On Sunday, July 20th, 2025, at approximately 1530 hours, I (MacEwan Security Agent s. 21(1) **POLLARD**) and MacEwan Security Agent s. 21(1) **SABOURIN** attended the Tipi's to check on a community member. Upon arrival, the female agreed to leave. She then continued onward West, to the South of Allard Hall. MacEwan Security Dispatcher s. 21(1) **DESMARAIS** informed us shortly after that she was now sleeping on some dirt.
2. At approximately 1605 hours, **DESMARAIS** received a call on the blue phone from an unknown person, requesting medical help for the community member. **SABOURIN** and I returned and found the subject breathing, but she was face down in the dirt. I asked her if she remembered me. She nodded her head. One of the people had called an ambulance prior to our arrival.
3. We began waiting for EMS to respond. I was watching the patient's vitals, while **SABOURIN** watched for EMS. At approximately 1612 hours, EMS arrived. Edmonton Fire and Rescue Services arrived shortly after. **SABOURIN** stayed with EMS, however with where/how EMS parked, it caused some traffic issues, by only having one accessible lane open.
4. At approximately 1620 hours, I stayed on 104 Avenue and began directing traffic. I stopped around 1635 hours, as the roadway was deemed safe enough. I debriefed with **SABOURIN** (who stayed with the remaining paramedics) and then cleared from the incident. This concludes my involvement in this incident.

**INVESTIGATION:**

1. On 2025 July 20, at approximately 1605hrs, Security Dispatcher DESMARAIS, s. 21(1) advised Security Services personnel that the Emergency Blue phone located on the South side of Allard Hall had been activated. The caller stated that a female community member was lying in the dirt and was unresponsive. Security Agent POLLARD, s. 21(1) and SABOURIN, s. 21(1) responded.
2. Upon arrival at approximately 1607hrs, Security personnel found a male and female by the Emergency Blue phone. The female stated that they found the female community member lying in the dirt and checked on her but was unresponsive and that the male was on his phone calling 911 for an ambulance. S/A POLLARD then assessed the female community member and asked if there were anyone in the Building 9 Security Office that was available to bring out the Narcan. Meanwhile the sounds of an ambulance could be heard heading to our location.
3. EMS supervisor (31004) and EFSR arrived at approximately 1612hrs and upon assessing the female community member, they were able to wake her up enough to get the community member to sit up. EFSR departed at approximately 1614hrs while the EMS supervisor continued to assess the female. At approximately 1622hrs, a second EMS unit (3167) arrived and assisted with the female community member.
4. EMS was able to get the female community member onto her feet and walked her over the ambulance where they loaded her in. EMS supervisor then left at 1628hrs. The Ambulance departed at 1639hrs without incident, concluding this file.

Security personnel found a female community member on the floor of the main washrooms in B-105. Security personnel administered two Narcan Sprays with a difference of a few minutes to the victim. The female reacted positively, stood up, and began running without a fixed direction on the main floor of B-105. She exited B-105 towards the keyhole 5-6, initially heading south and finally heading north towards MacEwan Square.

**NARRATIVES:**

**1-On Wednesday, July 30, 2025, at about 1835 hrs.** the security agent s. 20(1), s. 21(1) (uniformed/on duty) was patrolling the main washrooms in B-105 when he observed a young person fallen on the floor of the washrooms, s. 20(1) approached the person and he observed a young skinny female in her early 20s, apparently of indigenous background who was lying down on the floor facing the ceiling, her eyes were half way opened and her breathing was barely noticeable. s. 20(1) first tried to wake her up but soon he realized that she was under the effect of a drugs overdose. s. 20(1) communicated this to s. 20(1), s. 21(1) and requested assistance; he requested s. 20(1) to call 911 while he began applying CPR on the victim.

**2- At about 1837 hrs.** s. 20(1) noticed a young male standing close who observed s. 20(1) procedures, the s. 20(1) asked if he could help in any possible way , s. 20(1) asked him if he was a s. 20(1) to which the young male replied yes and he added as well that he had s. 20(1) , s. 20(1) requested s. 20(1) to keep applying CPR while s. 20(1) headed to the security cabinet, took the Narcan Spray kit and returned to the victim where s. 20(1) named s. 20(1) kept working on the victim, in that moment the security agent s. 20(1), s. 21(1) (uniformed/on duty) arrived to the bathrooms and s. 20(1) directed him to head back to the keyhole and to wait for the ambulance to show up. s. 20(1) applied the first Narcan Kit to the victim but after a few minutes no visible reaction was noticed, s. 20(1) then grabbed the second Narcan Kit and brought it to s. 20(1) who immediately applied to the victim.

**3- At about 1840 hrs.** the victim reacted positively to the Narcan Spray, she stood on her feet, but she was completely disoriented and began walking but stumbling all over the place, while she did that, she refused to give her name but kept asking for her friends and another bag that she claimed she brought with her. s. 20(1) explained to the victim that she was found lying on the floor with no one else around. At this moment the security agent s. 20(1), s. 21(1) (uniformed/on duty) joined s. 20(1) in the washrooms.

**4- 1845 hrs.** The victim exited the washrooms but kept walking back and forth asking all kinds of nonsense questions until she exited B-105 by the west push doors and headed south on the keyhole. But suddenly she changed her mind and headed north, crossing 105 Ave. and walking into the MacEwan Square area.

**5- At 1847 hrs.** s. 20(1) [REDACTED] disengaged from the incident and returned to B-105.

**SUMMARY:**

Security personnel found a female community member on the floor of the main washrooms in B-105. Security personnel administered two Narcan Sprays with a difference of a few minutes to the victim. The female reacted positively, stood up, and began running without a fixed direction on the main floor of B-105. She exited B-105 towards the keyhole 5-6, initially heading south and finally heading north towards MacEwan Square.

**NARRATIVE/INVESTIGATIONS:**

1. On Wednesday, July 30, 2025, at approximately 1835 hours, I, MacEwan Security Agent s. 20(1), s. 21(1), became aware of a medical incident occurring at Building 5. MacEwan Security Agent s. 20(1), s. 21(1) was identified as the initial responder on scene.
2. I proceeded to Building 5 to provide support. Upon arrival on the main floor, I observed Agent s. 20(1) attempting to engage with a female community member who appeared disoriented and was actively avoiding communication.
3. I approached the female community member and inquired if she required EMS or any form of medical assistance. She continued to stumble and verbally expressed a desire to leave the premises. She began walking toward the north hallway of Building 5, apparently attempting to access the nearby train station.
4. At this time, personnel from Edmonton Fire & Rescue and EMS arrived in the keyhole area between Buildings 5 and 6. I approached the emergency responders and relayed the information provided by Agent s. 20(1)—that he had administered First Aid and that the female community member had regained mobility but declined both EMS assistance and further intervention from security personnel. She proceeded to walk northbound.
5. The female community member eventually exited MacEwan property, continuing northbound along 105 Avenue. Agent s. 20(1) followed at a safe distance until she was confirmed to be off-site.
6. I then approached a bystander who had reportedly assisted Agent s. 20(1) in administering first aid. I documented the bystander's information for inclusion in Agent s. 20(1) report.
7. The bystander identified himself as s. 20(1), s. 20(1) stated that s. 20(1) and s. 20(1) stepped in to assist s. 20(1) during the incident.
8. I asked s. 20(1) to clarify his role in administering first aid. He explained that Agent s. 20(1) had handed him a Narcan kit, which he then used to administer Narcan to the female subject. I documented his statement accordingly. s. 20(1) left the property shortly after, as the incident had concluded.
9. This incident was closed after I had completed my support role alongside Agent s. 20(1) who was the primary responder.

INVESTIGATION:

1. On August 11,2025 at 1058Hrs. I (MacEwan Security <sup>s. 20(1)</sup> **SHARMA**, <sup>s. 21(1)</sup> was dispatched to conduct a welfare check on a female laying on the ground south exterior of SAMU corner of 109th street and 104avenue with S/A **SABOURIN**, <sup>s. 21(1)</sup>

2. Upon arrival I observed a female was unconscious and laying on the stairs. S/A **SABOURIN** and I tried multiple times to wake her up but there was no response from the female. At 1102hrs. I contacted Edmonton Medical services to attend the scene. We then put the female in a recovery position and started monitoring her until EMS arrived.

3. At approx. 1106hrs S/A **PIYA** arrived on scene with AED. At 1108hrs. S/A **TRAN** AND Navigator **DILLON**, <sup>s. 21(1)</sup> arrived on scene. Navigator Dillon provided S/A **SABOURIN** with a Narcan and he administers a Narcan dose at 1108hrs. EFRS arrived on scene at 1108hrs. Truck # 471. And at approx.1111Hrs. EMS on scene truck # 3472.

4.EMS then put the female on the stretcher at 1115hrs. The female then gained consciousness and was later verbally identified as <sup>s. 20(1)</sup> with no affiliation with Macewan university. EMS took over the care of the female at 1119hrs, and escorted her to the Ambulance.

5. EFRS offsite at 1120hrs. EMS offsite at 1131hrs. And security personnels cleared from the incident and resumed regular duties.

**SUMMARY:**

Security services received a call from member of public regarding a community member unconscious laying on the south exterior of SAMU. Security personnel responded to the called and after initial assessment EMS was contacted. EFRS and EMS responded to the scene. And loaded the female to the Ambulance and transported offsite for further treatment.

**INVESTIGATION:**

1. On 2025 August 11, at approximately 1100hrs, Security Services personnel were dispatched to an unconscious female laying on the ground, South of the SAMU Building along 104 Ave, East of 109 St. Security Agent **SHARMA**, s. 21(1) and I (**SABOURIN**, s. 21(1)) responded
2. Upon arrival at approximately 1101hrs, there were two unknown males near by stating that they called us (Security Service) due to the female being unresponsive when they attempted to check on the female. The two males left immediately afterward. I attempted to wake the female, initially verbally and then I gently shook her shoulder while verbally saying to telling her to wake up to no avail. I told **SHARMA**, s. 21(1) to call 911 because she was unresponsive. While S/A **SHARMA** was on the phone with 911, I placed the female into the recovery position and monitored her breathing and awaited Emergency Services to attend.
3. While waiting for Emergency Medical Services to arrive, S/A **PIYA**, s. 21(1) arrived with an AED from SAMU at approximately 1106hrs, meanwhile S/A **TRAN**, s. 21(1) and Navigator **DILLON**, s. 21(1) also attended the incident with a separate AED as well.
4. S/A **TRAN** asked me if the female's eyes were dilated. Utilizing my flashlight, I checked her eyes and they appeared to be unusually small and was unaffected by the light sources. Navigator **DILLON** provided me with a nasal Narcan dose to deliver to the female. I administered the Narcan at approximately 1108hrs which had no noticeable effect.
5. Edmonton Fire Department (Unit #471) arrived at approximately 1109hrs and began assessing the female. EMS arrived at approximately 1110hrs and took over the medical assessment on the female. EMS along with EFD picked the female up and placed her on the stretcher that was nearby.
6. While EMS was securing the female into the stretcher, the female regained conscious. S/A **SHARMA** was able to overhear EMS talking to the female and was able to obtain the females name as s. 20(1). EMS eventually loaded s. 20(1) into the ambulance at approximately 1119hrs. EFD departed at approximately 1121hrs. EMS then departed at approximately 1131hrs and Security Services personnel were able to resume regular duties.

2.) I, **KHINDA**, s. 21(1) MacEwan Security Agent and Security Agent **PEARCE**, s. 21(1) and Security Agent **WESOLOWSKI**, s. 21(1) responded from the building 109 office. **ARCHIBALD**, s. 21(1) proceeded to contact Emergency Medical Services (EMS).

3.) At approximately 0220hrs, EMS #3692 arrived on scene and began evaluating the subjects.

4.) At approximately 0221hrs, **WESOLOWSKI**, **PEARCE** and I arrived on scene.

5.) Upon arrival I noticed that there was one female subject and one male subject. EMS staff were actively administering Narcan to both subjects.

6.) At approximately 0223hrs, **WESOLOWSKI** and **PEARCE** cleared from the scene. I remained on scene until EMS was done.

7.) At approximately 0231hrs, the female subject was conscious and began departing property westbound on 105 avenue. At approximately 0242hrs, the male subject was conscious and began getting up. At approximately 0250hrs, the male subject departed property eastbound, and EMS cleared from property shortly after.
