

Renovations Transform Yogi Berra Stadium at Montclair State

MONTCLAIR, N.J. — Montclair State University has completed major renovations to Yogi Berra Stadium, upgrading the facility with a new playing surface, renovated locker rooms, redesigned bullpens and the addition of "The Hill" spectator area.

Athletic Director Robert Chesney said the new turf field was the project's top priority.

"The playing surface itself was the number one priority," Chesney said. "Making it safe and desirable for our athletes to compete on at all times was critical."

Players have praised the improvements. Senior graduate student Reece Malek said the transformation exceeded expectations.

"It was incredible," Malek said. "The new walls, bullpen, locker rooms — everything we got was a game-changer."

University officials said the renovations are designed to benefit more than just hosting baseball games. The stadium now hosts campus events, including concerts and senior celebrations.

Senior men's basketball player Kieran Flanagan said the addition of The Hill has expanded the stadium's appeal.

"The new renovations, especially the hill, have drawn in more students, families and outside members," Flanagan said. "It's not just about watching baseball anymore. It's about the overall experience."

Chesney said the project is part of a multiyear plan to strengthen community engagement and create a more welcoming atmosphere at events.

With added amenities and improved facilities, Yogi Berra Stadium has become a central hub for athletics, entertainment and campus life, reflecting Montclair State's continued investment in the student experience.
