Walker aims to start a winning streak as they get ready to travel to Dominion Christian on Friday.

The Wolverines (1-1) are looking for revenge against the Knights (0-2) after a 29-14 loss to them last season.

Walker head coach TJ Anderson said the 21-14 win over Utopian Academy last Friday has boosted morale for the Wolverines this week.

“It is always great to get a win and the kids were excited to finally get in the win column,” he said. “We have had some energized practices, and we are looking to get better each week.”

Wide receivers Grant Addison and Teague Tatom were difference makers in the victory last Friday. They accounted for all three touchdowns for Walker's offense.

Anderson said he expects to see them utilized this week and as the season goes on.

“We always want to go out there and do our best, and have fun playing this game,” he said. “Playing with a little more discipline is what we have been preaching all week. We look to get better at that this week as we play a tough team in Dominion Christian.”

Anderson said the team came out of last week’s game relatively unscathed, and they are ready to go this week.

His overall message for the team this week has been to eliminate missed assignments, and to not beat themselves with penalties.
