Lassiter, Creekview turn page on non-region

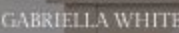

The Trojans (3-0) and the Grizzlies (0-3) are both having surprising seasons by recent standards. This is Lassiter's first 3-0 start since 2017, and it is Creekview's first 0-3 start since 2022.

The Trojans are looking avenge their loss to the Grizzlies 63-20 at Grizzly Stadium last year.

Lassiter is fresh off of a 41-14 victory against Northview where quarterback Mitch Seaman connected with wide receiver Collins Price for three touchdowns before halftime.

Trojans' coach Sean Thom said he attributes the team's start to the work they put in each day.

"We have really been preaching the difference between process-oriented as opposed to results-oriented," he said. "You look at that record, and it starts with us. There are a lot of people who are starting to talk about 3-0, but those are all results, not the process."

Creekview is coming off its third straight loss to open the season, in which it has scored a total of 10 points. But not all has been negative. The rushing attack led by Travis Vines has averaged 94.7 yards per game.



Grizzlies' coach Trevor Williams said the team needs to be consistent to overcome the slow start to the season.

"We have a lot of young guys playing valuable minutes and valuable reps," he said.

"When that is the case sometimes consistency can be fleeting. We have to find a way to be more consistent, sustain drives offensively and limit big plays on defense."

Thom and Williams both said every team in the region wipes their slate clean and starts 0-0 now.

Thom said he believes it is just another game, but the players understand the importance of the fresh slate.

"One thing we talked about today was we are 0-0," he said. "We tie it in with our process versus results mindset. No one cares what you did up until this point because now everybody is 0-0 in the region. What you do in these last seven games is going to decide your future."

Williams said his team is excited to move forward into region play.

"Everything is in front of you and all of the goals that you set are right there," he said.



Williams said Lassiter's duo of Seaman and Price are tough to defend, as all of the quarterback's passing touchdowns belong to Price.

"Their quarterback is a great player," he said. "He throws a good ball and does a nice job in the run game. They've got a couple of good receivers who do a nice job of finding space and getting open."

Thom said Creekview's run game will be the focus of the defense. Vines has 157 yards on 30 carries so far this season.

"When we are on defense I think about what they do in the run game," he said. "They utilize a lot of heavy sets. They have guys whether it is the run game or some guys on the perimeter who can make you pay if you are not sound in those fits."
