

**Uniform:**

- Team members wear different uniforms during different times of the year to appear like they belong in the movie.

**Holiday season offerings:**

- Halloween: Fireys, ballroom dancers, and fairies
- New year's: Fairies and ballroom dancers
- Christmas: Fairies and ballroom dancers

**Shows:**

- The Mystical Masquerade: Ballroom dancers demonstrate their talents while vocalists and violinists provide supporting background music.
- A comedy magic show where Jareth will engage in contact juggling, occasionally singing the hit songs from the film.
- A parade will showcase the characters and previews of the different shows.

**Characters:**

- Characters occasionally walk around the park remaining in their designated areas.
- The film's main characters will have an appointed meet and greet area.

**Rides:**

- A ride where guests travel with Sarah and her friends through the Labyrinth eventually arriving at the castle at the center. Guests explore the castle's many rooms until they find themselves in the MC Esher inspired room and witness as Sarah saves her baby brother Toby.
- Crystal ball ride for kids over the land

**Restaurants:**
