Since returning home Cassy has been asking others what they took with them, because she's planning a special photography exhibit.

Someone packed a miserable looking reindeer their child had made them, another a cheap but lucky fishing lure and someone else threw in a new packet of ear buds.

But what really surprised Cassy were the coat hangers a man had saved.

"You do sort of get a little bit panicky when you finally decide to leave and that creates an added urgency," she says.

"But apparently they are really good coat hangers that he didn't think he'd ever find again."
