

Music4Medicine 2025: the upcoming concert fundraising for Doctors Without Borders

A concert in aid of international medical charity Doctors Without Borders, or Médecins Sans Frontières (MSF), will take place on Thursday night.

The fundraiser, Music4Medicine, will happen this year at Wollongong Town Hall with [local musicians performing](#) and all profits going towards the MSF charity. Doctors Without Borders is an international charity which delivers aid to places in crisis such as Gaza, Sudan, Myanmar, and Haiti.

Performers include pianist Simon Tedeschi, singers Molly Stewart and Olive Cullen, the Les Cinq Filles choir, and WollCon Guitar Ensemble.

An organiser of the event spoke about the connection between the healing power of music and extending that power to those in crisis who need help. Inspire Music Australia founder and Music4Medicine leader, Felicity Woodhill asserted the event's aim is to platform young musicians and build community, as well as support the essential work MSF carries out.

"What's happening to children in the world in these places of conflict is ghastly. So for this concert, it's a very positive night of music, but there's a undercurrent theme about what childhood should be about and celebrating childhood to reflect back on why it's important to help other people" she said.

An MSF representative also discussed the impact of local community efforts and how every dollar counts towards their mission. Senior Fundraising Manager, Teneale Cameron emphasised the

importance of individual and local support alongside MSF's provisions of essential medical aid to people affected by conflict, epidemics, disasters and exclusion from healthcare.

"This is why we are speaking out about the genocide we believe is happening in Gaza. MSF is constantly responding to emergencies around the world, Gaza being one of them. There's also Sudan at the moment that we're doing a lot of work in as well because there's a humanitarian crisis happening and we're providing those essential health cares from surgeries to vaccinations." she said.

"We're able to do that work thanks to the community donating, either individually or fundraisers like Music4Medicine... MSF's commitment is obviously to delivering sustainable health care for local partnerships and Music4Medicine is such a beautiful model and it's such a beautiful way to get involved and learn more, but also have a great night out as well"
