In 2018 we launched a refreshed brand that will take us boldly into the future while keeping us focused on the world-class art, powerful education, and memorial role that are—and always will be—the pillars of our work.

## NewArt, NewArtists

OUR YEAR OF FIRSTS President John F. Kennedy urged our nation to explore the unexplored. That's why, as a living memorial to our 35th president, the Kennedy Center is committed to breaking new ground, sharing new voices, and creating new experiences for artists and audiences alike.

"New" can be as simple but thrilling as an artist debut or a world premiere. "New" can also be complex and bold, such as producing a major festival like *Artes de Cuba*. But in every context and across all we do, we are building on the Kennedy Center's 47-year legacy of making world-class art accessible to the broadest possible audience. In a year full of highlights, a few new artists and new art stood out.





The Italian conductor is eager to attract audiences from all walks of life by showing them that orchestral music has a place in their world. "I want each concert to inspire wonder and joy, and for audiences to be surprised and moved by what they hear," says Noseda.

In his first season, Noseda took the NSO out into the community, attracting capacity crowds for performances at D.C.'s hot new venue, The Anthem at The Wharf, as well as the bustling Union Station, where thousands of people flow in and out of the nation's capital.



He also introduced his orchestra to classical music aficionados worldwide through his partnership with the world's leading online classical music channel, medici.tv.

As the NSO and Noseda began their second season together, the Orchestra proudly announced an early extension of Noseda's contract; he will be with the Orchestra through 2025.


The 2017–2018 season also marked the first full year of **Hip Hop Culture** at the Kennedy Center. Announced to international headlines in 2016 and launched in 2017, the season included a dynamic mix of performances, film screenings, and interactive experiences. The program is the culmination of more than a decade of presenting Hip Hop artists within other Kennedy Center programs, including the NSO and Performing Arts for Everyone.

In his inaugural season, **Artistic Director Q-Tip**—along with a newly-formed Hip Hop Culture Council that includes pivotal figures such as Questlove, Common, and Mimi Valdés—curated a series of programs highlighting some of Hip Hop's "founding fathers and mothers" alongside established and emerging artists. The first year was met with critical and popular acclaim, and drew new audiences to the Center, with 46% visiting for the first time.

DIRECT CURRENT, a two-week celebration of contemporary culture, launched with a range of performances, partnerships, and free events across Washington, D.C. Exploring themes of identity, the environment, reinvention, and transformation, DIRECT CURRENT mixed classical and contemporary, blurring genre lines and stretching beyond the concert hall to bring some of the most electrifying contemporary creators to D.C.

Collaborators included the landmark 9:30 Club, experimental arts space Dupont Underground, the Phillips Collection, and Brooklyn-based artist incubator National Sawdust. Performances included Philip Glass in his Kennedy Center debut, Taylor Mac with his 24-Decade History of Popular Music (Abridged), Noseda and the NSO performing John Adams's The Gospel According to the Other Mary, Julia Wolfe's Pulitzer Prize-winning oratorio Anthracite Fields, Mason Bates's Mercury Soul, and many more.

Free post-show talks and hands-on workshops invited audiences to engage more deeply with the art, artists, and issues.

Theater at the Kennedy Center also took an important step forward in the form of *Broadway Center Stage*— a new, Center-produced series of short-run, semi-staged musical productions, featuring some of the hottest names in show business. The format offers well-known musicals featuring top talent, raising the Center's profile as an important player on the Broadway scene.

Among Washington National
Opera's most successful programs
is the American Opera Initiative
(AOI), a comprehensive commissioning
program created by WNO Artistic
Director Francesca Zambello.
AOI works to expand the American
operatic repertory and foster the
talents of rising American composers
and librettists.

The initiative also provides an important training ground for WNO's Domingo-Cafritz Young Artists, who have the opportunity to work through new material and be a vital part of the development process.

AOI 2018 featured three new pairings of opera composers and librettists—Nathan Fletcher and Megan Cohen, Gity Razaz and Sara Cooper, John Glover and Erin Bregman—who each offered new, WNO-commissioned one-act operas.

Zambello and WNO also commissioned two important new opera talents, composer **Missy Mazzoli** and librettist **Royce Vavrek**, to create **Proving Up**, the centerpiece of the AOI 2018. Centered around homesteading in the American West, the fully staged, one-hour opera challenges American myths and draws parallels with the social and economic struggles that persist in this country today.

Proving Up went on to open the season at the Miller Theater at Columbia University in fall 2018. As the year came to a close, the New York Times declared the work to be one of the best classical music performances of 2018, with critic Zachary Woolfe praising the story and score as "crushingly contemporary... a landscape of shimmering aridity."

A critical success and a vital professional development vehicle for WNO's **Domingo-Cafritz Young Artists** who worked on the production, *Proving Up* pointed to an exciting future for American opera.

Building on our 20-year reputation for large-scale, high-impact international arts festivals, the Kennedy Center produced its first festival dedicated to Cuba. From the rhythms of Afro-Cuban jazz to late-night pop-up parties, *Artes de Cuba: From the Island to the World* celebrated this small island nation with an outsized artistic influence.

This unprecedented celebration of Cuban culture took over the Center for two weeks in May with 50 free and paid performances and events, and more than a dozen large-scale sculptures and murals commissioned especially for the festival. All told, *Artes de Cuba* was the largest contingent of Cuban and Cuban American artists ever assembled outside of the island—450 artists in total, many in their U.S. debuts.

Highlights included installations by visual artists Manuel Mendive, Roberto Fabelo, and Roberto Diago; performances by legends including Arturo O'Farrill, Los Van Van, and Omara Portuondo; and show-stopping concerts by the next generation of Cuban musicians, including Yosvany Terry, Aymée Nuviola, and the Havana Lyceum Orchestra.

The festival closed with a poignant nod to history, as the Ballet Nacional de Cuba returned to Washington on the 40th anniversary of its landmark debut at the Kennedy Center. Beloved prima ballerina and company founder Alicia Alonso, now 97, traveled with the company and surprised audiences by coming onto the stage to take a bow.

Inspired by President Kennedy, who said "if art is to nourish the roots of our culture, society must set the artist free to follow his vision wherever it takes him," the REACH breaks down boundaries between audiences and art. It is a living theater, an immersive learning center, and an open stage that will provide artists and visitors with new opportunities to interact with the Center as the nation's premier nexus of arts, learning, and culture. Visitors will find a unified campus that is more welcoming, more open, and more responsive to the needs of our artists and our patrons than ever before.

**Architects**, the REACH is more than a physical expansion; it is a new way of imagining the intersection between audiences and art. Not only are the arts growing and changing, but the way audiences want to experience art is changing as well. We need the right spaces, as well as more space, to grow and change along with them. The REACH is a complement to the original Edward Durell Stone building, which features fixed proscenium stages and limited behind-the-scenes rehearsal and education space. The REACH will provide open, flexible spaces that can be used for performances, events, rehearsals, meetings, education workshops, hands-on learning, exhibits, and more. A key feature of the REACH is ample green space, which will welcome patrons to simply sit and relax and will also host outdoor performances and exhibits.

What will you find at the REACH on any given day? Visitors looking in as artists collaborate on an original composition. Families sitting on a picnic blanket watching a Video Wall broadcast and then lingering to take pictures of an outdoor art installation.

#### BUILDING THE FUTURE

As of December 2018, hundreds of philanthropists from across the country and around the world have contributed nearly \$190 million toward our \$250 million Building the Future campaign. The ambitious capital campaign supports the construction of the REACH, outfitting and activating the space, and limited programming underwriting throughout the duration of the project. The completion of this campaign, and the opening of the REACH, will firmly establish the Kennedy Center as a 21st-century cultural institution that will endure another 50 years and beyond.

Art and artists are foundational to our work as the nation's cultural center, but our work doesn't end when the curtain goes down, nor does it stop at the walls of our building. The Kennedy Center provides millions of people of all ages, all across the country, with opportunities to experience world-class arts and powerful education programs without having to buy a ticket or even be in Washington, D.C.

From nationwide school improvement initiatives to free community events, the Kennedy Center creates meaningful, accessible arts experiences for audiences of all kinds, everywhere.



### **Learning Through the Arts**

Given the wealth of research that demonstrates the positive academic and life outcomes for students with access to the arts, quality arts education is not only "nice to have," it is essential.



#### **Why Arts Education?**

- 93% of Americans believe arts are essential to a well-rounded education.
- Low socio-economic students who participate in the arts have a drop-out rate of 4%, compared to peers with low arts participation, who have a dropout rate of 22%.
- Low-income students who are highly engaged in the arts are more than twice as likely to graduate college.
- 72% of business leaders say creativity is the number one skill they look for when hiring.

This is the motivation behind some of our most powerful and comprehensive arts education programs, including **Ensuring the Arts for Any Given Child** and **Turnaround Arts**, which use the arts as a tool to create positive social impacts, as well as the Center's many professional development initiatives and support services for educators.

This year, Any Given Child welcomed two new communities, bringing the total to 25 regions across the US that work with the Center to develop sustainable, district-wide arts education plans and practices. This award-winning collective impact program leverages the expertise of the Kennedy Center to connect a wide swath of community stakeholders, giving them tools to work together towards a common goal of providing arts education for their children. While Any Given Child works at the district-level to affect systemic change, Turnaround Arts works in individual schools to improve school culture. In 2017-2018, Turnaround Arts

provided professional development to teachers in 73 schools and services to more than 30,000 students. Because of these services, 30 schools introduced arts-based, digital learning tools into their classrooms, more than half put on a musical, and dozens of students from across the country traveled to Washington to perform in the Turnaround Arts Talent Show. Importantly, Turnaround Arts also pairs celebrities and artists with schools, raising the visibility of arts education and giving the students authentic, positive role models. Turnaround Arts sites-which are among the lowest-performing of all Title I schools—report improvements in school culture and academic performance.

Across the country, Kennedy Center programs such as Partners in Education and Changing Education Through the Arts offer hands-on workshops, artist residencies, and conferences to educators, growing the pool of practitioners who have the knowledge and resources to incorporate the arts into everyday lessons. These professional development programs show educators how they can use the arts as a means to enhance lessons across the curriculum—from language arts to math and science—helping students learn and infusing art into the classroom.

January 2018 marked the Center's first-ever civil rights residency, which challenged fourth and fifth grade students to explore the role artists can play in instigating change. Guided by a Kennedy Center teaching artist, students studied primary source materials from the civil rights era, including first-person accounts of the 1968 riots in D.C., and spoke with artist-activists from both that period as well as today. The residency concluded with a visit to the Kennedy Center and a special performance on Millennium Stage.

As an extension of the Kennedy Center's deep partnership with DCPS, for the third year, D.C. Public School students performed at the Center as part of **DCPS MusicFest**. School choruses, bands, orchestras, jazz ensembles, and other musical groups from 44 schools, representing 2,317 students, performed in front of a live audience of their peers and arts professionals who offered constructive feedback.

## **Developing Artists and Arts Leaders**

The Center provides training, internships, and recognition opportunities for emerging artists and arts professionals.

Creating a culture of inclusion is a common thread across all these programs. For example, VSA's Emerging Young Artist Program casts a powerful light on visual artists with disabilities through a juried competition followed by a year-long touring exhibition. The NSO's Summer Music Institute has long been a pipeline for musicians traditionally underrepresented in American orchestras. A subset of the Center's internship program includes experiential internships for young adults with intellectual disabilities, providing meaningful work-readiness experience.

Some of today's most recognized artists benefitted from Kennedy Center programs early in their careers. Today, alumni of Washington National Opera's Domingo-Cafritz Young Artist Program—a two-year residency for opera artists on the verge of international careers—have performed at every major opera house.

Betty Carter's Jazz Ahead, a summer residency for promising jazz artists, has fostered the careers of major talents, including our own Artistic Director for Jazz, Jason Moran. In 2016, as part of the American College Theater Festival, the Center awarded playwright Martyna Majok its Jean Kennedy Smith Award for her play Ropes in the Well; in 2018, she received the Pulitzer Prize for Drama for this same play, retitled Cost of Living.

By supporting the careers of talented young people, we multiply our impact and contribute to a vibrant, inclusive, and ever-evolving cultural presence today and well into the future.

Most Performances for Young Audiences commissions start on Kennedy Center stages, and some continue on for national tours, reaching children and their families at venues nationwide and bringing a piece of the Kennedy Center to every corner of our country.

In 2017, young audiences were introduced to renowned scientist Jane Goodall and her special toy chimpanzee through the world premiere of the musical *Me...Jane: The Dreams and Adventures of Young Jane Goodall*. Based on a picture book by author and illustrator Patrick McDonell, *Me...Jane* helped audiences ages 6 and up understand the importance of protecting all living species. During opening weekend, Jane Goodall herself attended a special *Creative Conversation* with the design team, cast, and book author.

Since its premiere, Zanes has brought Night Train 57 to other communities, with plans to tour North America extensively over the next few years.

Offered to both families and school groups, the National Symphony Orchestra's Young People Concerts introduce children to classical music through excerpts of both classical and popular repertoire, and hands-on, interactive fun. A highlight of the 2017-2018 season was Bernstein!: Inside the Music, as part of the celebration of the great Leonard Bernstein's 100th birthday. Inspired by Bernstein's famous young people's concerts, this performance demystified music by breaking down components of rhythm and melody, with excerpts from Candide, Peer Gynt, The Rite of Spring and, of course, West Side Story.

The Kennedy Center's commitment to young audiences continued across the building with Washington National Opera's student-only open rehearsals, as well as *Opera Look-In* performance, which takes students through the process of assembling an opera on stage and behind the scenes. Major touring ballet and dance companies—including the Mariinsky, American Ballet Theatre, and Alvin Ailey—offered open rehearsals for students.

## Your Kennedy Center, Year Round

You don't need to buy a ticket to experience much of what the Kennedy Center has to offer. The Center's free, community-focused arts events contribute to our city's vibrant cultural scene and bring the Washington region together. #### **Celebrating Native Heritage**



# The Artist as Change-Maker

FOSTERING

The arts play an important role in helping society tackle tough issues, find common ground, and document our collective cultural histories. Many artists serve as catalysts in national dialogues around such issues as diversity, economic equity, and wellness, and also provide audiences with a path to engage in the conversation.

The Kennedy Center spotlights the power of the arts and empowers arts leaders who are working to reflect and transform our culture.



## **Uplifting Creative Communities**

Piloted in 2018, *Arts Across America* is the newest addition to the Kennedy Center's suite of social impact programming. The recognition campaign celebrates communities nationwide that are using the arts to strengthen their social fabric, and brings world-class arts experiences of the Kennedy Center to those who might not otherwise have access. *Arts Across America* is made possible through support from Kennedy Center chairman and patriotic philanthropist David M. Rubenstein.

Each of the first Arts Across America locations—Corona, CA; Fort
Lauderdale, FL; Braddock, PA; and
Youngstown and Warren, OH—were different, but they all shared a passion and resilience built around thriving arts communities. Artistic Advisor at Large Yo-Yo Ma and President
Deborah F. Rutter visited each of these sites to highlight outstanding local arts programs; engage arts, civic, and business leaders in conversations about the role of the arts in community life; explore arts-based community programs; and hold collaborative performances between Kennedy Center artists and local artists.



A full day of performances and activities in each community made vital connections and formed strong bonds between the Kennedy Center team and locals: In Corona, CA, a junior high school orchestra performed on stage with Yo-Yo Ma. In Fort Lauderdale, families affected by gun violence came together for healing through music. Residents and leaders of Braddocka former steel town—relished the opportunity to draw public attention to their burgeoning arts and culture district, which is a cornerstone of their economic and community revitalization. In Youngstown and Warren, 2,000 residents gathered for a free community concert starring local arts groups.

The response to *Arts Across America* has been tremendous, with communities reporting that the positive effects of the Kennedy Center's visit extended far beyond the day. Going forward, the Center plans to visit many more communities nationwide.

"We are the nation's cultural center, and that means we have a responsibility to celebrate and uplift important art happening in communities across the country," reflected Kennedy Center President Deborah F. Rutter. "Arts Across America is one way that the Kennedy Center can connect with some of those communities, energize people doing great work through the arts, and importantly, listen and learn from those communities."

### SHIFT: A Festival of American Orchestras

The Kennedy Center also spotlights arts leaders and organizations doing important work within their communities, on stage and off. In partnership with Washington Performing Arts, in April 2018, the Center co-presented the second annual SHIFT: A Festival of American Orchestras, celebrating the vitality, identity, and extraordinary artistry of American orchestras through an immersive weeklong residency in the nation's capital.

Chosen from a pool of applicants from across the country, the 2018 SHIFT orchestras were: Fort Worth Symphony Orchestra, Albany Symphony, Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra, and the National Symphony Orchestra. The festival provided a platform for these orchestras to share a sampling of their best work—to be creative, interesting, and provocative, and to present work that embodies each orchestra's identity, heritage, standards, and artistic vision-in concert at the Kennedy Center Concert Hall, and through community events at venues around Washington.

Fort Worth Symphony and its dynamic music director, Miguel Harth-Bedoya, shared their connections to Latin American music and culture through a variety of events, including a free, bilingual presentation of Prokofiev's Peter and the Wolf at THEARC in Southeast Washington. The Albany Symphony's Concert Hall explored the history of upstate New York through the theme of bodies of water that connect communities in a program entirely featuring works by living composers. The Indianapolis Symphony's residency focused on their renowned music education programs, including the one-of-a-kind "Second Chance Strings," through which adults with no musical background get to experience the rush of their first performance within an hour of picking up an instrument. Finally, the NSO's residency encompassed its In Your Neighborhood activities (read more on Page 22).



### **Elevating Ideals, Exploring Ideas**

The Kennedy Center embraces artists who are breaking new ground and exploring ideas both on stage and off.

We are particularly proud of our Citizen Artist Fellows, who embody both the ideals we attribute to John F. Kennedyfreedom, service, justice, courage, and gratitude—as well as the evolving role of the artist in American life. Citizen Artist Fellow De Nichols offers the following definition: "A citizen artist is simply someone who is using their talents to impact the world and, especially, civic life within the communities and spaces in which they live." Nichols organizes interactive creative experiences to help community members address critical social challenges. She was one of seven 2017-2018 Citizen Artist Fellowseach of whom uses their artistic practice to promote dialogue and affect change within communities.

The third cohort of Fellows also included Hakim Bellamy, a nationally recognized slam poet who works to create cultural equity in his hometown of Albuquerque, where he was recently appointed by the mayor as its first Deputy Director of Cultural Services. Ekene Ijeoma works at the intersections of design, architecture, performance, and technology, creating multisensory artworks informed by social issues and data studies. Katie Wyatt is leading cultural organizations in developing a U.S. network for El Sistema, the social change movement started in Venezuela that uses music education to create opportunities for disadvantaged children. Muralist and teaching artist Michelle Angela Ortiz creates public art that reflects on the experiences of immigrant and undocumented communities.

Through their year-long fellowships, Citizen Artists receive personalized coaching and mentorship from Kennedy Center leaders, and a platform for their work. 2017–2018 Citizen Artist Fellows Vijay Gupta and Reena Esmail received strategic planning advice from Center staff for Street Symphony, the nonprofit that engages the homeless population in Los Angeles' Skid Row in music-making. In December 2017, the Kennedy Center livestreamed Street Symphony's performance of *Messiah* to national audiences via Millennium Stage.

Citizen Artist Fellows are vital voices in the annual Kennedy Center **Arts Summit**—a spring convening that brings together thought leaders from various sectors for conversations around how the arts and creativity can impact society. Arts Summit 2018 called on participants to imagine what might happen if President Kennedy's "Moonshot" speech—in which he called upon Americans to dream of landing on the moon—wasn't about space, but about the arts. Through performances and discussions, participants collectively envisioned how the arts and creativity could take us where we want to go as a culturesolving challenges in areas like education, public health, and sustainability.





Artists are also exploring the intersection of science and the arts, as Artistic Advisor at Large **Renée Fleming** is doing through the *Sound Health* initiative. This multiyear, multifaceted partnership between the Kennedy Center, the National Endowment for the Arts, and the National Institutes of Health (NIH) explores the connections between music, health and wellness, and science through performances, workshops, and research.

"With Sound Health, we're growing a body of scientific evidence that supports the value of arts education for our children."

Renée Fleming, Artistic Advisor at Large In September 2018, the partners presented Sound Health: Music and the Mind Shaping Our Children's Lives Through Music Engagement.

Across two days of activities, artists and scientists explored how music might impact childhood development. A concert, hosted by CNN's Dr. Sanjay Gupta, featured demonstrations and performances by Fleming, Artistic Director for Jazz Jason Moran, jazz piano prodigy Matthew Whitaker, and Grateful Dead percussionist Mickey Hart alongside leading neuroscientists from NIH. The same week, the NIH announced dedicated research funding to further explore the music-mind connections and the healing power of music.

Throughout 2017–2018, Sound Health activities also included the popular Saturday yoga sessions in the Grand Foyer, as well as the introduction of **Second Saturdays**, a series of free Saturday morning programming that introduces very young children and their families to music education.

# National Symphony Orchestra

The 2017–2018 season marked the start of a new era for the National Symphony Orchestra as Italian conductor Gianandrea Noseda began his tenure as the Orchestra's seventh music director. It was clear from the first rehearsal that this artistic partnership would bear fruit. In just one season, Noseda has inspired new energy and passion with these distinguished musicians, with the Washington Post noting early in the season there was "a certain flair going on at the National Symphony Orchestra."

Noseda brought NSO audiences an eclectic mix of repertoire in his first season, ranging from Bach and Beethoven to Berio and Bernstein, along with music by John Adams, Verdi, Stravinsky, Rachmaninoff, Gershwin, and many others. Programming highlights of Noseda's inaugural season included Verdi's *Requiem* and the NSO's first-ever performance of John Adams's *The Gospel According to the Other Mary*. Three programs were live-streamed worldwide at medici.tv, reaching an even larger audience.

Additional season highlights included a performance of Leonard Bernstein's Songfest, nearly 40 years to the day after its world premiere by the NSO, and a semi-staged production of West Side Story, led by NSO principal pops conductor Steven Reineke and directed by Washington National Opera Artistic Director Francesca Zambello as part of the Center's Leonard Bernstein at 100 centennial celebration; a residency with violinist Leila Josefowicz; and a recreation of the acclaimed gospel album Handel's Messiah: A Soulful Celebration on the occasion of its 25th anniversary.

#### An orchestra for everyone

- Over the course of the season, Noseda and the NSO presented a free concert for more than 3,000 fans at the newest D.C. music venue, The Anthem, and a free lunchtime concert for more than 1,000 people at Union Station.
- NSO Artistic Advisor Ben Folds took
  the DECLASSIFIED concerts in a
  new direction, bringing such
  renowned artists as Sara Bareilles,
  Jon Batiste, and Kishi Bashi to
  the NSO stage to shift common
  perceptions of orchestra concerts by
  presenting programs that combine
  original arrangements and innovative
  collaborations with core classics.
- The NSO Pops series included collaborations with Broadway stars Audra McDonald and Megan Hilty, NASA, and Black Violin, as well as film with live score presentations of Selma, Jurassic World, and more.
- The NSO's commitment to the greater Washington community was evident during its annual In Your Neighborhood, which reached more than 5,000 people over the course of a week. Read more on page 22.
- The NSO's Summer Music Institute celebrated its 25th anniversary as one of the leading development programs for 15- to 20-year-olds interested in a career in orchestral music. With NSO Principal Horn Abel Pereira leading the student orchestra, this year's four-week Institute welcomed students from 19 states and Puerto Rico, Bolivia, Costa Rica, Iceland, and Hong Kong. Indicative of the NSO's commitment to leading the orchestral community in rethinking diversity, 18% of this year's participants came from populations that are underrepresented in U.S. orchestras, including African American and Hispanic musicians.











# Washington National Opera

Washington National Opera presented bold productions of classic operas and contemporary perspectives while showcasing the best in American artistry during 2017–2018. WNO debuted two new productions along with two company premieres—ranging from Handel's *Alcina* to a wildly popular production of *Candide* by Artistic Director Francesca Zambello, marking WNO's contribution to the Kennedy Center's year-long celebration of *Leonard Bernstein at* 100.

WNO premiered its long-anticipated production of Verdi's *Don Carlo*, featuring a stellar cast of voices led by Russell Thomas, Eric Owens, Leah Crocetto, and Jamie Barton. On the lighter side, *The Barber of Seville* featured superstar Isabel Leonard in an irresistibly funny and gorgeously sung star turn as Rosina.

Long at the fore of programs that engage audiences and advance the art form, WNO saw unprecedented success this season with its BravO program, the premier audience development program for opera fans under 40. WNO saw audience growth among this group, thanks to thoughtful audience development strategies. BravO closed the season with BravO Bash!, a black-tie fundraiser in support of WNO.

Ushering in an ambitious vision, WNO welcomed new General Director Timothy O'Leary, who began working alongside Artistic Director Francesca Zambello. Together, these two leaders will continue to expand the artistic excellence and forward-thinking initiatives that are the hallmarks of every WNO season. Maestro Evan Rogister will join WNO as principal conductor in 2019.

Just prior to the year's fiscal year closing, WNO received an unexpected and exceptionally generous bequest: Clifford Thomson, a WNO chorister for 31 years, bequeathed WNO a staggering \$1.1 million, in honor of the joy he had performing hundreds of times as part of the WNO family. His name will be etched on the marble walls of the Kennedy Center, and his generosity will support the work of great artists on the Opera House stage for generations to come.

# Ballet and Contemporary Dance

Representing the best of the art form, the ballet season included D.C. premieres of Alexei Ratmansky's whimsical Whipped Cream and Tony Award® winner Justin Peck's neoclassical Pulcinella Variations, through longstanding relationships with national companies American Ballet Theatre and New York City Ballet, respectively. International powerhouses awed audiences, with the Mariinsky Ballet and the renowned Ballet Nacional de Cuba (see page 11 for more). The Center also celebrated the 16th and final season of The Suzanne Farrell Ballet, under the artistic direction of legendary ballerina Suzanne Farrell.

Highlights of the contemporary dance season included the world premiere of Camille A. Brown's ink, a Kennedy Center co-commission; Mark Morris's collaborative evening-length work and a Kennedy Center co-commission, Layla and Majnun, featuring the Silkroad Ensemble; Andersson Dance and Scottish Ensemble; Matthew Bourne's The Red Shoes, performed by his company New Adventures; and Nederlands Dans Theater performing with full orchestra in a dynamic repertory program, which included international choreographer Crystal Pite's powerful work, The Statement. Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater returned for its annual engagement, bringing a mixed rep program that included the late and celebrated choreographer Talley Beatty's The Stack Up.

Damian Woetzel's two DEMO programs, which bring together artists from across genres to explore a common theme, honored legendary choreographer Jerome Robbins in his centennial birthday year. Performances included Blueprint, a world premiere Kennedy Center commission by Pam Tanowitz with music by Caroline Shaw and some of today's most creative and ground-breaking voices in dance and music, including Brooklyn Rider, and Rashaun Mitchell + Silas Riener as part of the inaugural DIRECT CURRENT series.

#### **Theater**

The Kennedy Center reaffirmed its commitment to producing world-class theater with *Broadway Center Stage*, a new series of musicals in starry semistaged concert productions. Read more about the blockbuster inaugural season on page 7.

This was the year the musical *Hamilton* came to Washington, D.C., bringing our nation's history to life against the backdrop of the nation's capital. The 14-week run thrilled audiences and brought many first-time patrons to the Kennedy Center. Additionally, through the production's partnership with the Gilder Lehrman Institute of American History, more than 4,300 students and teachers from underserved communities in the D.C. metro area experienced the production and its innovative educational program.

Throughout the season, the Center joined the worldwide celebration of the work of legendary auteur director Ingmar Bergman. The Bergman 100 Celebration treated audiences to the National Theater of Norway's production of Private Confessions, directed by Bergman's muse, Liv Ullman, and a double bill of After the Rehearsal and Persona from Toneelgroep Amsterdam, helmed by acclaimed director Ivo van Hove.

# Comedy

Comedy at the Kennedy Center continued to celebrate the art of laughter, with comedic storytelling from modern-day philosophers including George Lopez, David Sedaris, and Tracy Morgan, plus Twain Prize recipients Whoopi Goldberg and Carol Burnett, also a 2003 Kennedy Center Honoree.

In its third year, the District of Comedy Festival expanded to present an eclectic slate of artists spanning stand-up, music, sketch, and podcasts. Nearly 12,000 fans visited the Kennedy Center for this laugh-out-loud comedy weekend, with 29 free and paid performances across seven theaters. Highlights included two performances by Patton Oswalt, and an all-star celebration of women in comedy featuring Bridget Everett, Phoebe Robinson, Amanda Seales, Melissa Villaseñor, and Sasheer Zamata. The festival also featured local artists and partnerships with local organizations, including BYT's Bentzen Ball.



In Spring 2018, the Center announced a newly formed, multi-year relationship with famed comedy outfit The Second City to develop and tour original works. The first output was The Generation Gap: How Many Millennials Does it Take to Teach a Baby Boomer How to Text Generation X?, which ran for seven weeks and delighted a multigenerational audience. Additionally, the Center piloted The Second City's improv, sketch, and stand-up workshops, offering new ways through which fans can learn and get their laughs in at the Kennedy Center.

# Marquee Awards Galas

The year 2017 marked a special milestone for two marquee events. We celebrated the 40th anniversary of the Kennedy Center Honors by recognizing a diverse mix of American legends, including dancer and choreographer Carmen de Lavallade, Cuban American singer-songwriter and actress Gloria Estefan, Hip Hop artist and entertainment icon LL COOL J, television writer and producer Norman Lear, and musician and record producer Lionel Richie. The gala performance, featuring tributes from a star-studded cast, was broadcast to a national audience on CBS and raised over \$6 million in support of the Kennedy Center's artistic and educational programs.

The Mark Twain Prize for
American Humor—the highest

# Fortas Chamber Music Concerts

Under the leadership of Joseph Kalichstein, the Fortas Chamber Music series featured its trademark mix of showcasing young talent, such as the Sphinx Virtuosi, which celebrated its 20th anniversary last year, and the Calidore Quartet, while also presenting internationally revered artists, including the Takács Quartet, violinist Leila Josefowicz in her Fortas series debut, soprano Isabel Leonard, and cellist Steven Isserlis.

The opening Fortas concert of the season in October 2017 was designed to showcase the acoustic qualities of the newly renovated Terrace Theater by gradually increasing the artistic forces on stage—from duo, to quartet, to sextet, to octet—and combining the talents of pianists Lisa Emenheiser and Joseph Kalichstein, the Emerson String Quartet, and the Dover Quartet.

Additional highlights included five-time Grammy Award®—winning soprano Dawn Upshaw and leading percussion quartet Sō Percussion in a new work commissioned for them by the Music Accord—of which the Kennedy Center is a member—from Pulitzer Prize—winning composer Caroline Shaw. As part of the *Leonard Bernstein at* 100 celebrations, the composer's son, Alexander, hosted a program of Bernstein's vocal and piano music enriched with personal reminiscences, commentary, and illustrative video and photographs.

## **Jazz**

Under the direction of Artistic Director for Jazz Jason Moran, who extended his contract to continue in his role through 2021, the jazz series fostered work that crossed genres and sparked artistic exchange. All-star centennial celebrations of two jazz legends, Thelonious Monk and Dizzy Gillespie, shared a season with contemporary artists like Joel Ross, ArcoIris Sandoval, and Eric Harland. Acclaimed photographer and multimedia artist Carrie Mae Weems and poet Elizabeth Alexander presented meditative and provocative works that explored the intersections of music, song, and spoken word.

Additional highlights include performances by several NEA Jazz Masters, including saxophonist Lee Konitz, bassist Ron Carter, pianist and composer Randy Weston, and bandleader Carla Bley. The 2018 NEA Jazz Masters illuminated the lifetime achievements and exceptional contributions of four artists—producer Todd Barkan, pianist Joanne Brackeen, guitarist Pat Metheny, and vocalist Dianne Reeves.

# **Hip Hop Culture**

The Kennedy Center's inaugural Hip Hop Culture season presented a dynamic mix of programs that demonstrated Hip Hop's impact on contemporary culture. The Bridge Concert Series, which included performances from giants Grandmaster Caz and Roxanne Shante, welcomed pioneers of the Culture. Projects like Ta-Nehisi Coates's Between the World and Me drew on major talents from today.

The Hip Hop Culture Council advisors and ambassadors who reflect the creative, social, and intellectual wealth of the community-formed a powerful brain trust committed to stewarding Hip Hop's role at the nation's cultural center. For example, Council member Xavier Jernigan brokered a collaboration with Netflix and Spotify, which led to a Kennedy Center-produced screener for Luke Cage Season 2, followed by a concert featuring legends KRS-One and Rakim. Council member J.PERIOD also presented his Live Mixtape [RISE UP Edition which re-imagined protest music for the modern era and featured a cast of Hip Hop greats. Read more on page 5.

# **Millennium Stage**

For the past 21 years, Millennium Stage has been emblematic of the Kennedy Center's goal to serve artists and audiences who, collectively, make up America's cultural fabric. With free performances open to the public 365 days a year and broadcast live online to the world, Millennium Stage celebrates cultural and artistic diversity, and cultivates an ever-growing community of Kennedy Center patrons.

Highlights from the past year include Step Afrika!, one of the top African American dance companies in the U.S.; the Gamer Symphony Orchestra, which drew a whole new crowd to hear popular music from the video game genre; and Mariachi Flor de Toloache, the first and only established all-female mariachi band, which packed the Grand Foyer with Latin music lovers during DIRECT CURRENT.

Broadly, Millennium Stage offers opportunities to extend and enhance other Kennedy Center performances and celebrations. For example, young artists and Citizen Artist Fellows from the Center's career development programs regularly perform on Millennium Stage. In the week leading up to the 40th anniversary of Kennedy Center Honors, Millennium Stage presented free performances dedicated to the first Kennedy Center Honorees. As an important connection to the greater Washington cultural community, Millennium Stage also enhances events and initiatives taking place across the region, with performances tied to the Smithsonian Folklife Festival, the National Cherry Blossom Festival, and others.

# **KC Jukebox**

Mason Bates's KC Jukebox spotlights forward-thinking musicians, while re-imagining the classical music experience. Highlights included Bates's California Mystics, featuring Bedouininspired tenting and pillows in the Center's Atrium for an immersive environment of music by Lou Harrison, Steve Reich, and Nathaniel Stookey. Bates's signature event, Mercury Soul, returned to Washington, blending live electronica, classical music, DJs, and visual art for a dance club atmosphere at the 9:30 Club. The final concert of the series celebrated music informed by the civil rights movement, ranging from a haunting string quartet by Carlos Simon—Elegy: A Cry From the Grave—to a rediscovered work for 10 cellos by the visionary composer Julius Eastman entitled The Holy Presence of Joan d'Arc.

# Renée Fleming VOICES

Renée Fleming continued her VOICES series of programs designed to showcase the extraordinary power and vitality of the human voice. The second season included Broadway sensation and Tony® winner Cynthia Erivo; opera stars Barbara Hannigan and Isabel Leonard; world music legend Angélique Kidjo; renowned cabaret chanteuse Ute Lemper; plus Renée Fleming herself performing alongside acclaimed jazz bassist Christian McBride.





Artistic Advisor at Large Renée Fleming Like most American cultural institutions, the Kennedy Center's work is funded by a combination of earned income and philanthropic contributions.





Ticket sales and other earned income account for approximately half of the Center's annual budget, which means we raise an additional \$80+ million each year to deliver our world-class artistic, educational, and community programs. Support from our generous donor community is vital to our mission and financial wellbeing.

The Kennedy Center receives an annual federal appropriation in recognition of the Center's role as the presidential memorial to John F. Kennedy. Public funds pay only for the operation and maintenance of the building and grounds, ensuring that the living memorial to our 35th president remains a vibrant homage to his legacy. The difference between fiscal year appropriations and expenses is due to timing of capital projects and maintenance over multiple years.

These annual figures do not reflect fundraising for the \$250 million *Building the Future* capital campaign in support of the design, construction, and activation of the REACH. To date, more than 300 generous individuals and institutions have pledged nearly \$190 million to the campaign. Design and construction of the expansion—the first in the Kennedy Center's history—is funded entirely through private philanthropy.



As always, volunteers stepped in to help wherever support was needed for other activities such as Artes de Cuba, Opera in the Outfield, the Kennedy Center Honors, Lunar New Year Family Day, Martin Luther King Jr. Celebration, New Year's Eve Party, and more.

During the 2017–2018 season these volunteers volunteered close to 78,000 hours, which saved the Kennedy Center almost \$2.4 million.
