



KYLE AND JENNIFER FINLEY'S MASTER BEDROOM WAS OPPRESSIVE, NOT REFRESHING, SO THE TWO PUT THEIR HEADS TOGETHER AND THEIR HANDS TO WORK ON A REMODEL OF THEIR 1960S RANCH HOME IN CARMICHAEL.

CALIFORNIA. Building-industry professionals, the two were comfortable taking an active approach. Jennifer and Kyle did much of the work, but they turned to interior designers Leyla Jaworski and Ashlee Berry for advice on the finishes and furnishings.

Stealing a bit of square footage from the nearby playroom, the Finleys added much-needed closet space. Before the renovation, they shared a single rod behind sliding mirrored doors. Now a barn-style door does the sliding, giving the bedroom a stylish update and opening to helpful built-ins and more space for their clothes.

Working from the ground up, the designers started the shift to a brighter palette with a cheery rug that serves as a basis for the rest of the room's color scheme.

"The new light fixture we installed is made up of superdelicate shells," Jennifer says. "It lets light bounce around the room. There was a very big, very basic ceiling fan there before. Little elements like that helped us turn the space from cave-like to spa-like."

MASTER PLAN Ditching the wood four-poster in favor of smart gray upholstery, the Finleys relocated their bed to the adjacent wall and installed French doors to the backyard where there was once just a window, opposite. A sliding barn-style door to the walk-in closet saves floor space, above. The Finleys initially planned to add wainscoting to the wall behind the bed, but the designers convinced them to cover the entire wall in grid-style molding that incorporates a pair of horizontal windows into the design, left. "The wall behind the bed is like a giant headboard," Jennifer says. "Trimming out that window was kind of awkward for us, so this approach helped, and we were able to integrate it squarely into the pattern."

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




TOP SHELF Topping the purchased vanity with a modern vessel sink meant the Finleys could install a working drawer underneath it for additional storage.

A vanity without a sink was without a purpose.

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
STORAGE WAR With a 2-foot-deep
